Good afternoon and welcome to our very last home game for season 1999-2000. We extend a welcome to Lennie Lawrence and his Luton Town side who have enjoyed a good season. It was not so long ago that the threat of liquidation hung over Kenilworth Road which just goes to show what can be achieved through a determination to survive in this game. Our game against Notts County has increased our points tally and we have another opportunity to gain three more today. What better way to finish our home programme than by beating Luton, which I understand would be for the first time at Adams Park.

Having reached 58 points is a very comforting thought. The pressure began to ease after the Chesterfield game and has just got better as the games have moved on. To reach the target of 51 that I had set from the start of the season took a little longer than expected, however the Chairman was quick to tell me after the Chesterfield game that this was the safest we had been at this stage for four seasons. Overall it has been a very satisfying achievement, the sale of Matt Lawrence to Millwall has meant we have balanced the budget. Most pleasing of all is the R word has not been mentioned all season and what's more we have never looked like being involved in another fight for survival. We have just two games to go, including this afternoon against Luton, and we are on course for a top ten finish. This is particularly pleasing as I understand the best the club have finished since the Martin O'Neill era is

Injuries have been a very big problem this season, they are part and parcel of the game but it seemed so many of our key players were injured at the same time. It led to a very frustrating period where we struggled to put a run of results together because the side was being changed for every game. When you consider Paul McCarthy and Jamie Bates played eight games together between March and May last season, this season they have played a total of twelve together the entire season because of injuries. We have been without Paul Emblen since November, yet again another option in midfield or up front. Andy Baird has been in for one and out for



THE HATTERS



Supporters of Luton Town have every reason to enjoy their football this season, whatever the results. Until 15 hours before the season kicked off, there was a danger that the Hatters would be thrown out of the Football League

The summer had been traumatic at a club which came into this decade as one of the best in the country - they had ten glorious years in the old First Division, now the Premiership and won the Littlewoods Cup, now the Worthington Cup, by beating Arsenal in the 1988 final.

Alas, tradition and past alory counts for little in today's big money football world. Missing the first season of the Premiership was bad enough, through relegation a few months before it was set up. Further relegation, to Division Two, was another blow to the club and its fans.

But even those disappointments started to look insignificant towards the end of last

season, when boardroom politics became public knowledge. A dispute escalated until just before deadline day last March director and major creditor Cliff Bassett called in receivers, who were still running the club until the day before the league season kicked off. The club was put up for sale.

Manager, Lennie Lawrence, who had guided the Hatters to 12th place in the Second Division last season, was left hamstrung by the impasse. The receiver's job was to draw in money, not spend it, and although Lawrence was allowed to do some deals, the greater pressure was to raise each in the transfer market

One of the most experienced bosses in the business with a CV including running Charlton on a shoestring at the top level. Lawrence had raised £1.4million under receivership by the time goalkeeper Kelvin Davis went to Wimbledon for £600,000 down, with a further £200,000 to come on appearances and possibly more if David is sold on by the Dons. Remarkably having endured the toughest period of management in a career stretching back to decades, the

manager agreed to stay in the job, where the term hot seat really was relevant.

The club was formed in 1885 when Luton Wanderers and Luton Excelsion decided to merge at a time when Luton was on the threshold of a boom thanks to the growth of the hat making trade, which was to give the club its

As the town became bigger and more prosperous so did the football club, and it started paying its players in 1891. Three years later Luton was founder-members of the Southern League and in 1897 joined the Football League's Second Division

In 1974Luton made history again; they won promotion back to the First Division to become the first club ever to drop from top to bottom of the League and then complete the revival in the opposite direction. The joy ended with relegation after only one season, but in 1982, led by David Pleat, Luton were back among the big boys again, despite operating on a shoestring in an antiquated ground. Miraculously Luton survived for ten seasons, with the first

providing one of the game's classic showdowns. On the last day of the 1982/93 campaign Luton travelled to Maine Road needing a win to stay up and to condemn Manchester City to relegation. City had only to draw, and got to within four minutes of success. But then Baddy Antic a Serb who had gone as a substitute, struck the winner and David Pleat was forever famous after his televised jig of delight across the pitch.

Pleat resigned for a second time in 1995, to go to Sheffield Wednesday and youth coach Terry Westley was given his job at Kenilworth Road. By mid-season Luton were in desperate trouble and although new boss Lennie Lawrence produced a mini-revival, the Hatters when down again. They almost bounced straight back, but lost in the 1997 play-offs. They were hoping to go one better this time, that will have to be put on hold until next season.



THE MANAGER LENNIE LAWRENCE

With former youth coach Terry Westley struggling in his first experience as a manager he and Luton town reluctantly decided to part company as the Hatters slid to the bottom of Division One

Four months in the autumn of 1995 had seen £2 million spent, but only four matches won out of 22. Luton decided they needed an experienced hand on the tiller and Lawrence fitted the bill perfectly. Perhaps more importantly, he knew about running clubs on shoestring budgets, having made his name by taking impoverished Charlton into what is now the Premiership, and keeping them there for four years, when they did not even have a home of their own. Lawrence was a non-league player with Croydon, Carshalton and Sutton United. His managerial career started as assistant at Plymouth and then Lincoln. He went to Charlton as reserve team coach before landing the hot seat. He had been boss for nine years when he left Charlton in 1991 and took over at Middlesbrough. He led them to promotion to the Premiership a year later, but they were relegated after only one season and was replaced by Bryan Robson. Bradford City offered the next opportunity but he left after 18 months to return south. A few weeks later he became Luton's 21st manager. A season of struggle followed, but Luton were 12th last season, despite their traditional chronic shortage of money and it has been a difficult summer for the boss - the club went into receivership in the closing weeks of last season and that left him helpless when he wanted to trade in the early summer transfer

The Players





NATHAN ABBEY (21) a young keeper who joined Luton as a YT and left because regular Kelvin Davis meant he had few opportunities to play. The club then sold Davis to Wimbledon and so Nathan returned to Kenilworth Road in hope of becoming No. 1. So far he has made just 8 appearances this season, BEN ROBERTS (24) will be a familiar face to Wanderers fans as he was here on loan during the reign of Alan Smith. As the third choice keeper at Middlesbrough Ben jumped at the chance of joining Luton on loan when Lennie Lawrence approached his former club in the North East. He has had some Premiership experience and has played in two Wembley cup finals, against Chelsea in the F.A. Cup final for Middlesbrough and for Millwall in the AutoWindscreens Shield final while on loan.


DEFENDERS

EMMERSON BOYCE (20) was born in Avlesbury and joined Luton via schools development programme. A defender who broke into the team after making his debut in the Auto Windscreens Shield competition last season. Has made three appearances for the side so far this season. STUART FRASER (20) is the former skipper of Luton youth team, a bid and stylish defender who was given his League debut at Carlisle on the final day of 1997-98 season. MARVIN JOHNSON (31) the longest serving player at Kenilworth Road who can play anywhere in the back four. Can also play midfield, he is staring his twelfth season as a first team regular with Luton, his only club. The current

skipper of the side and very much a solid fixture. GAVIN McGOWAN (24) was a right back fighting for a regular place against very stiff opposition at Arsenal. After two loan deals at Luton he finally made it a permanent move in June 1998 joining on a free from Highbury. JULIAN WATTS (29) signed on a months loan from Bristol City when keen to get his career moving once more. The move from Ashton Gate was finalised when he fell out of favour with the management. Former Sheffield Wednesday and Leicester City player who left Filbert Street for Bristol City when John Ward snapped him up on a Bosman transfer. ALAN WHITE (24) came to Luton after Lennie Lawrence had taken him from his former club Middlesbrough when an injury crisis robbed him of three of his back four. It was Lennie who had signed him as a 17 year old at Avresome Park, but found it difficult to break into the Premiership side of Bryan Robson when the big money signings arrived.

MIDFIELDERS

ADAM LOCKE (29) is well travelled in football terms who brought good experience into a young squad. He joined Luton on a free transfer from Bristol City last summer and walked into the receivership problems at Kenilworth Road. Although offered a month to start with by the time the administrators moved out Adam had done enough to earn a deal to the end of the season. PAUL McLAREN (23) a local lad who slipped through the net, born in High Wycombe he was offered terms by Luton when still at school. He made his first team debut in 1994 and has been a regular ever since. ANDRE SCARLETT (20) became a Roy of the Rovers story when he made his first team debut for Luton at 18 last October. The winger created the opportunity for a



penalty and scored the second in a 2-0 win over Oldham, MATT SPRING (20) is a competitive midfielder, very much the driving force in the winning Luton youth side that reached the F.A.Youth Cup semi-finals of 1997. Last season he topped the Hatters appearance list with 54 outings, scouts have been following his progress continuously.

MATTHEW TAYLOR (18) is one of the crop of young players Luton had to look to when receivership threatened to close the club down. Has made good progress so far and staff at the club have great hopes of him. LANDRY ZAHANA-ONI (23) was signed by Lennie Lawrence in January 1999 from Bromley of the Rymans League. He is an old fashioned left winger who had six years with Le Hayre before crossing the Channel to try and make the grade in English football. Luton have paid Bromlev an initial payment of £25,000 with

more to follow based on performance.

STRIKERS

STUART DOUGLAS (22) a real hot shot in youth and reserve team football, he was 17 when he made his first team debut for Luton against Oldham in 1995. He had to overcome a series of injuries before winning a regular place in the side, he made 50 appearances for the side last season. ANDREW FOTIADIS (22) is another local discovery. He won caps for England schools at 15 and 18 and has developed an exciting style of play the Luton fans have taken to. He has made over 70 appearances for Luton to date. LIAM GEORGE (22) is the clubs leading scorer with 14 goals this season so far. Full of pace and nimble footwork who has constantly impressed

since coming into the side. Liam made his League debut against Bristol City in 1997, he was also a member of the Republic of Ireland squad that progressed to the European youth championships. PHIL GRAY (31) was signed by Luton for the second time in September 1997, the Northern Ireland striker hopes to get a full season of football after being hit by a series of injuries. He was in Spurs reserves when David Pleat splashed out £275,000 for him in August 1991. Two years later he moved to the Premiership with Sunderland paving £800,000 and after three years at Roker moved to France and Holland for a spell on the Continent. He needed little encouragement to return to Kenilworth Road in exchange for £400,000 and managed to get back into the Northern Ireland squad in November.

bench in the 3-1 win. He has been a regular in the Avon Insurance Combination but got injured at Bognor when playing against Brighton & Hove Albion on Thursday 13th April, and it is hoping to play again this season.



MARK WESTHEAD vouna goalkeeper who was born Blackpool and signed Bolton Wanderers at 17. Went on to a clubs before

being given a free transfer a the end of season 1997-98. Former manager Neil Smillie spotted him while attending a goalkeeping course at Bisham Abbey and signed him for Wycombe. He made his first team debut at Burnley in September 1998 and has appeared when Martin Taylor has not been available. Unfortunately he has suffered from a series of injuries during the season, mainly collected while playing in the Avon Insurance Combination.

Euro 2000 - Are You Going

A personal message from Lord Bassam of Brighton, Home Office Minister with special responsibility for combating football hooliganism.

Euro 2000 is now just a few weeks away, so I'm grateful for being allowed to take up valuable space in your programme. Like you I'm a football fan looking forward to a festival of football. There's no clear favourite and it should be a great tournament. We'll all be cheering on England and hoping that Kevin Keegan and his team will create a bit of excitement and national pride — and hopefully lift the trophy and make the whole event safe, fun and enjoyable for all involved.

Euro 2000 involves a lot of planning — not just for Kevin and his players. A whole range of Government Departments, policing agencies, the Football Association and supporters groups have all been working hard for many months to make sure we all enjoy the tournament. Co-operation between the various police and intelligence agencies here and throughout Europe has never been better. We have all been working hard to make it so.

Some of the media will no doubt focus on the fans' behaviour — particularly English ones. This is not surprising given the terrible scenes we've seen over the years, most recently the tragic deaths and injuries in Turkey. The irony is that football hooliganism is no longer a major factor in our domestic game. It still exists, of course, but it's not the menace it once was. The time has come to demonstrate that excellent improvement in behaviour on the international stage.

Holland and Belgium are great places to visit. Both countries want the tournament to be a wonderful sporting occasion for all supporters. But they will not tolerate any disorderly, drunken, violent or threatening behaviour. I've personally visited both countries and spoken with leading politicians and police commanders. I was delighted to be assured that police throughout the tournament will have a LOW TOLERANCE policy of being fair but tough at the slightest sign of trouble. This has the full support of the UK Government.

If you're lucky enough to have a ticket for

any of the matches you'll be sure of a warm welcome from the host nations. Enjoy the local culture, but respect local customs. Don't be encouraged by anyone who tries to stir up trouble, which brings disgrace on our national team. Don't be provoked by local youths or rival supporters. Be aware there's nothing brave or patriotic about frightening local people, be they Dutch or Belgians. Tough controls will be in place. You'll not get into the grounds unless you have a ticket. Even a legitimate ticket, if obtained on the black market, could be of no use. I strongly urge those without a ticket to stay at home. Every England supporter will be an

ambassador for our football and our country. The Dutch and Belgian police know that we may be loud and proud. Let's show the whole of Europe that we are not a threat. But let's convince people all over Europe that they should be glad whenever England qualifies for the finals of any major tournament. And remember the important prizes — winning Euro 2000 and perhaps hosting the World Cup 2006.

DO YOU KNOW?

Police in Holland and Belgium have extensive Public Order powers at their disposal — and will not be slow to use them.

- Riots. You do not have to be actually involved in a riot to warrant arrest. If local police, or other civic authority, think you are posing a threat then you can be arrested and help for up to 12 hours. Deportation is then almost certain.
- Drinking. In some towns drinking on the streets is not allowed only in bars etc. Police will arrest offenders who may face swift deportation.
- Identification. You can be arrested and probably be deported if you do not have a passport with you at all times.
- Checks. There will be many checks on the routes to the match. If you don't have a ticket which corresponds to your identity (FA endorsed, or individually named) you will be turned back and may be arrested.

UK Police Officers will be in Belgium and

Holland working closely with local police. They will have and share the latest intelligence on the movement of ordinary fans and of known trouble makers.

- Punishment. If you get into trouble during the tournament you could be officially banned from attending football matches for 10 years.
- Banished. If you are already the subject of a Banning Order and try to travel to a match, you could be arrested and sent to prison or face a heavy fine.
- Arrival. If the Belgium or Dutch police or immigration authorities think you are drunk, aggressive, have an offensive weapon or are in any way posing a threat, they will arrest and deport you.
- Trains. British Transport Police will be accompanying all Eurostar trains in and out of Brussels.
- Ports. UK Police will be monitoring supporters at all ports and airports, working in close co-operation with their Dutch and Belgium counterparts.
- Ferries. The captain of any ship or aircraft can and will detain you if you cause trouble.
- Extradition. The UK Government will look favourably on any application from the Dutch or Belgium authorities for the later extradition of any UK national wanted in connection with alleged football related offences.
- Support. The UK Government wholeheartedly supports the tough "Low Tolerance" policing policies of the Host Nations.





Tales of a Traveller

Saturday, April 8th Chesterfield

Journey

A straightforward journey up the M1. For an away trip, Chesterfield is a good place to go; it's not too far away so you get home in reasonable time, there is plenty of car parking near the ground, and the town centre is nearby. Our official photographer was delighted to find that the bar staff in the "Barley Mow" PH had not changed since our last visit - if Chesterfield get relegated (as seems 99% sure at the time of writing) he hopes we get drawn there in a cup fixture!

The Ground

Like Bournemouth, Chesterfield is another ground where nothing seems to have changed for years. Saltergate has seen football for over 125 years and remains a very traditional ground. The Main Stand has wooden seats, and on the Crompton Street terrace home fans move from one end to the other at half time (memories of Loakes Park!). With changes going on behind the scenes at Saltergate, it will be interesting to see if the club does go for a new site.

Facilities for Wycombe fans

As I stood behind the goal at the crumbling Cross Street End, venues like Wigan, Stoke and Preston seemed a million miles away. Admission to the terrace was £11 (concessions £6). The terrace was open so we were fortunate that the weather was good. The view was average and most of the action (in both halves) was at our end. The small refreshments hut had the usual selection – the Pies were just about worth the £1.60. Interestingly it only cost £1 more to sit in the Main Stand.

Home crowd / stewards

There was no entertainment before or at half time - apart from home mascot "Chester" prancing up and down the touch line. The crowd was sparse at 2,081 - their previous home match against Bury had attracted only 1,903. Most of the chants were directed against home manager John Duncan - there were

several "Duncan Out" banners around the ground. Three days later of course Mr Duncan and his assistant Kevin Randall received their P45s'. Was it really just 3 years ago that Duncan led the side to two FA Cup semi-final appearances? The stewards allowed Joe's drum in, but took no action against those home fans who used insulting language at some of our female fans first half.

Programme produced

36 pages for £1.80. It was nice to get some change from £2 but that was really the only good thing about this programme. Nearly 14 of the pages were taken up by adverts, and I could find little of real interest on the editorial pages. There was a feature on past encounters between the clubs and this referred to our nickname as "The Chairmen". Rating - 5 (out of 10)

The opponents

Player to catch the eye was midfielder Ryan Williams - he gave 100% in effort and could easily have got on the score sheet. No surprise then that he had won their "Player of the Month" trophy for the last three months! Leading scorer Reeves, well known to us from his Carlisle days, caused our defence problems with his physical presence first half. Blatherwick, who appeared at loan at Wycombe in 93/94, played in their defence.

Match summary

Our first half performance was similar to that at Bournemouth - we looked shaky in defence and failed to create anything of substance at the other end. Before the first penalty, Taylor had saved from Reeves, then efforts from Reeves and Carss had flashed wide. Taylor produced brilliant saves from Reeves' penalty then from Williams as he tried to convert the rebound. Reeves however made no mistake when he was given a second penalty chance just seven minutes later. It could have got worse as Taylor saved well from Reeves and Williams before the interval.

At the interval Mr Sanchez introduced Bates and McSporran for Cousins and Simpson. Rogers moved to right back, and McSporran played wide on the right. Bates' contribution was felt at both ends of the park as both our goals came from his powerful headers that

Gayle in the home goal could only parry. Bulman also went close when he rounded Gayle but chipped shortly over the bar. Defensively we now looked much tighter and apart from a Blatherwick header that went narrowly over, we rarely looked like conceding again. This continued even after we were reduced to 10 men. McSporran almost increased our lead when he shot wide after a long run. With the home team now dispirited and the home fans venting more wrath towards Duncan, we held out comfortably for the three points.

Referee:

Mr Alan Kaye (Wakefield)

A lot was written in our programme against Col U about Dave Carroll's dismissal and I agree that such heavy handed officialdom seemed completely needless. Mr Kaye didn't do us any favours with the two penalty decisions. The second in particular, for handball against Bulman, seemed particularly harsh. Simpson was booked for disputing the decision and was joined later in Mr Kaye's book by McCarthy (dissent) and Bulman (foul). Chesterfield's Breckin was also cautioned. Rating (4 out of

Unfortunately the usually reliable Leeyon Phelan only found the side netting with the goal at his mercy. Paul Johnson then had a shot blocked following a 1-2 with Phelan. The breakthrough came just before the hour mark, Paul Johnson's throw down the line was helped on by Phelan, Townsend crossed into the area and Eddie Gray, with an overhead kick, kept the ball in the danger area. Dixon controlled, weaved past two defenders and coolly drew the keeper before planting the ball in the net for his 5th goal in as many games. From here on in, with vocal support from our large group of supporters, our game was far more relaxed and we controlled the match. Both Roger Johnson and Dixon had good chances to add to the score, but were unable to convert to put the icing on the cake. This morning the boys completed their fixtures with a home game against Wolves. Hopefully we will have the trophy presented here this afternoon. There is no doubt that since our FA Youth Cup run, the squad has blossomed and tremendous team spirit has built up. The early experience our younger players have had, especially the schoolboys who have come into the side and done so well, has proved invaluable. I am sure the quality of our incoming first year scholars is as good as any club at our level. If we can continue to build on what we have achieved this season, then who knows what we can do next season. Have a good summer,

Wycombe are still looking for their first win over today's visitors, who are making their fourth trip to Adams Park. The first time was on Saturday, 7th September, 1996 when neither team had made much of a start to the season. The Hatters went away happy though after securing a 1-0 win in front of a crowd of 6,471. Wycombe's side included Ray Wilkins, in what was to be his only appearance for the club, while loanee Michael Mahoney-Johnson was on the bench. Most of the action was in an even first half with both sides going close on several occasions and both having efforts cleared off the line. In comparison the second half was very low-key. The allimportant goal came eight minutes after the interval. Mitchell Thomas sent a cross over to the far post, where Andrew Fotiadis headed down for David Oldfield to tap over the line. The visitors had all the possession after this without really threatening to add to their score. In fact, the Blues came nearest when Paul McCarthy hit the post with a shot five minutes from the end.

The following season, on Saturday, 1st November, the two teams fought out a pulsating 2-2 draw in front of 6,219 spectators. Luton had made a poor start to their season, mainly due to a long injury list, but were almost back to full strength at the time of their visit. Wycombe started well though and took the lead in the 13th minute when Mark Stallard met Steve McGavin's cross and fired home on the volley. Seven minutes later it should have been two but Dave Carroll blazed over. Encouraged by this let-off Luton began to get hold of the game and they equalised four minutes before half-time. A fine run by Steve Davis set up that man Oldfield again and he fired in a low shot which cannoned off of Martin Taylor's legs onto the bar and over the line before hitting a post and bouncing out. Fortunately for the Hatters referee John Brandwood was well up with play and awarded the goal. Luton then started the

second half as they finished the first, well on top, and it was against the run of play that the Blues regained the lead in the 63rd minute, courtesy of a superb finish from Steve McGavin after a fine run down the wing by Keith Scott. Luton equalised for the second time twelve minutes later when Tony Thorpe's looping header caught Taylor off his line.

Last season's game took place on the opening Saturday (8th August) and, on a sweltering afternoon, the Hatters won more comfortably than the 1-0 scoreline suggests against a strangely lacklustre Wycombe side. A performance which didn't augur well for the season and so it was to prove. A disappointing crowd of 5,252 included the usual large and vociferous following from Luton, Chris Vinnicombe, Herve Bacque and Ray McKinnon, who had a fine game, made their debuts for their respective teams. The Hatters started strongly and forced two corners almost immediately, although it was Wycombe who should have taken the lead. Somehow though Keith Scott managed to hit the post from six yards after being set up by Dave Carroll. The only goal came in the 35th minute from a thunderous free kick by Steve Davis, who almost repeated the feat dead on half-time. Bacque then wasted a great chance three minutes after the interval when he blasted over. After this the visitors were content to sit back and their excellent defence was hardly troubled by the Blues' poor attempts to equalise, even after manager Neil Smillie dispensed with the dreadfully ponderous wing-back system of his predecessor and switched to 4-3-3.

Answers to Referee questions

- (1) Per FIFA: "The referee shall caution or send-off the defender, depending upon the seriousness of the offence. He shall restart the game by dropping the ball at the place where it was when the infringement occurred. If the ball was within the goal area at that time, it shall be dropped on that part of the 6 yard line at the point nearest to where the ball was when play was stopped." Although this offence would normally be considered a penal offence (punishable by a direct free kick), because it occurred off the Field of Play, dropping the ball to restart is appropriate.
- The offence is striking as per Law 12 "striking or attempts to strike an opponent" and is punished by the award of a direct free kick. The object does not even have to hit its intended target to be valid within the "attempts" part of the law. Also, the action could be construed as "Serious Foul Play" or "Violent Conduct" for which the miscreant is sent-off. With regard to the positioning of the ball for the restart, the offence is deemed to be committed at the place where the guilty player started the action.

On the Road

Nationwide

Our final away trip, and indeed our last Nationwide League Division 2 fixture of the season, is next Saturday, May 6th, when we make the journey to the Abbey Stadium to take on Cambridge United kick-off 3.00pm. It's been a difficult season for The U's under the management of former Derby and England centre half Roy McFarland they won promotion from Division 3 last May, but have spent most of the current campaign either in, or perilously close to, the relegation zone. Two weeks ago however they enjoyed an impressive 4-0 success at Cardiff and went into the Easter programme 6 points clear of the danger zone with just four games left to play. To a large extent, Cambridge's problems have stemmed from an indifferent home record: of their first 21 home league games, only 7 have been won, with a further 6 drawn. Teams that have left the Abbey Stadium with all three points have been -Blackpool, Bournemouth, Burnley, Millwall,

Oldham, Scunthorpe, Stoke and Wrexham. Our previous visit to the Abbey Stadium was in December 1994 for an Endsleigh League Division 2 meeting. It was a Friday night just before Christmas and some of our fans missed the kick-off having had a nightmare trip around the M25. Steve Butler put the U's in the lead early on, only for Gary Patterson to equalise before the interval. Terry Evans then put us ahead only for Carlo Corazzin to level things up at 2-2. This point moved us temporarily into 2nd place in the Division. We will be looking to record a league double over Cambridge, a Sean Devine goal having won the points at Adams Park last October.

The Abbey Stadium

The away facilities are fairly basic; visiting fans are allocated the uncovered South Terrace (Allotment End) behind one goal (the far side of the ground from Newmarket Road), and usually have just over 300 seats in the covered Habbin Stand just around the corner. Access to the visitors turnstiles is via a narrow path across a field so if it's been



raining your shoes are going to get muddy! Ground capacity is 9,247 and the visitors end holds 1,950. The best PH close to the ground is apparently "The Wrestlers" on the other side of Newmarket Rd and about half a mile towards the city centre. The match day programme (normally 56 pages) costs £2.

Recommended Road Directions

M40 east, M25 northbound (clockwise). Continue to junction 27 and take the M11 signposted Cambridge. Exit at junction 11 and take the A1309 (signposted Cambridge South). At the roundabout turn right (A1309). After 1.5 miles turn right (signposted Ring Road) into Long Road. Continue for about four miles over various roundabouts following "Ring Road" signs until you pass Cambridge Airport on the right. At the next roundabout (by the Racehorse PH), turn left (signposted Ring Road) into Newmarket Rd. The ground is on the left after 0.25 miles.

Mileage from High Wycombe = 94.

Car Parking

There is a car park at the club (£2.50). Most home fans tend to park in the side streets off Barnwell Road which is the road leading to Newmarket Rd when you approach from the M11

Travelling by train?

Cambridge Station is 2 miles away and without any direct bus connections to the ground. To walk will take you about 45 mins: recommended route -Station Rd, right into Tenison Rd and right again into Devonshire Rd. Turn right at the crossroads into Mill Rd. Over bridge and take the 3rd left into Sedgewick Street. Bear left into Cromwell Rd and at the T-junction with Coldhams Lane, go straight over and walk across the fields to the ground.

The very last game for the season will be at Cambridge United on Saturday 6th May, kick off 3pm. Ticket prices are as follows. Seats £10 adults and £6 concessions, terracing £9 adults and £6 concessions. Entry is via Coldhams Common. Wanderers will be wearing the new Avec RED & WHITE kit for this match, the kit will be available at Wanderers in Town from June 1st.

I'd like to begin this final column of the season by thanking our true supporters for their unswerving loyalty to Wycombe Wanderers. Come rain or shine, good results or bad, we know that we can count on some 4,000 or so fans to turn up and support the team.

Your enthusiasm has encouraged everyone to keep going during difficult times when we've battled against the threat of relegation and grappled with financial problems. And I really believe that your loyalty is about to be rewarded.

On the field we've found the kind of form that suggests there are exciting times ahead and off the field we're close to finding a solution to our immediate cash crisis.

I hope you'll understand why I can't go into too much detail about what's happening behind the scenes. For obvious reasons, financial negotiations have to be conducted discreetly and our plans could be jeopardised if too much information became

public knowledge at this stage.

Suffice to say that the board is in the process of forming a business plan that should bring about an improvement in our financial position. We'll be announcing further details when the time is right.

Hopefully, things could be in place in time for Lawrie Sanchez to move into the transfer market this summer. There'll be literally hundreds of players looking for new clubs during the close season and I'm sure that we'll be seeing some new faces at Adams Park next season.

What happened this season proved that we need more players. We lost too many points because the squad was decimated by injuries and that stopped us making progress.

Our present group of players have proved themselves good enough to reach a very respectable position in the league table. We could aim even higher with new additions to provide competition for places and cover for injury and loss of form.

Lawrie and his assistant Terry Gibson have been a great success in their short time at the club. When they came here just over a year ago we were candidates for relegation. In 12 months or so they have turned us into a top ten outfit.

This season has provided so many positives:

The team's overall improvement – at the time of writing we were set to achieve our highest league position since the days of Martin O'Neill.

The emergence of the best goalscorer we've ever had in our days as a Football League club – Sean Devine has every chance of being the leading marksman in Division Two.

The breakthrough to first team level of excellent young players like Mark Rogers, Dannie Bulman, Danny Senda, Richard Thompson, Lee Holsgrove and Matt Brady.

I hope you'll agree that we have more reasons to be optimistic than we've had for many years. So, during the

summer months, why don't we all set ourselves a simple target?

If each one of us could persuade just one extra friend or acquaintance to come along to Adams Park next season our gates would improve dramatically. This season we've averaged just over 5,000 – and that's disappointing.


