The inference from Luton's second win of the season is that it did although Hill, a long-time friend of Ramsey, who appointed him to the job when he became manager in the summer, thought differently.

"I dedicate this victory to the Luton Town fans and to Chris Ramsey," he said at the beginning of his after-match Press Conference.
