# ONDIGITAL RAISES FOOTBALL TO A DIFFERENT LEAGUE

## COUNTDOWN STARTS TO NEW SPORT CHANNEL LAUNCH ON AUGUST 11

The way the Football League is covered on television is to change forever this summer.

A new sports channel to be launched in August by ONdigital will be about much more than the 80 live games it will show a season. A whole raft of programming concentrating on the Nationwide League, its clubs, players and fans is also planned.

So rather than being forced to survive on a diet of live matches and goal round-ups the new channel will bring the depth of sports programming to Football League fans that has so far only been available to supporters of Premiership clubs.

The Football League coverage will run alongside the Worthington Cup and the most prestigious club competition in world football the UEFA Champions League, which ONdigital have been showing for the past two seasons.

Among the comprehensive package of programming being lined up includes for the very first time a Saturday night Match-of-

the Day style show dedicated to the First Division which will enable fans to have the chance to see extended highlights and extensive analysis from that day's games.

There will also be tailored second and third division highlights shows that will not simply show the goals scored but also highlights, analysis and interviews with the people that matter.

A Saturday afternoon results service which will focus first-and-foremost on Football League scores from all divisions, updates, results and tables is also planned so fans can keep tabs on how their side and their rivals are doing without having to wait for results from elsewhere to be covered first.

A top quality team of presenters, reporters, technicians and production staff are also working on a wealth of other programmes aimed at giving the Football League fan the informative, intelligent and entertaining coverage that they have been denied - until now.

An ONdigital spokesman, said: "This channel will usher in a new era for Football League fans who

for too long have been given a bad deal where coverage of their clubs is concerned."

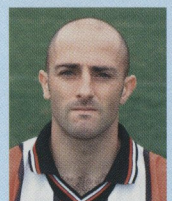


# BITS 'N PIECES

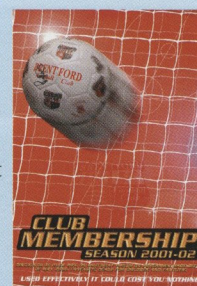

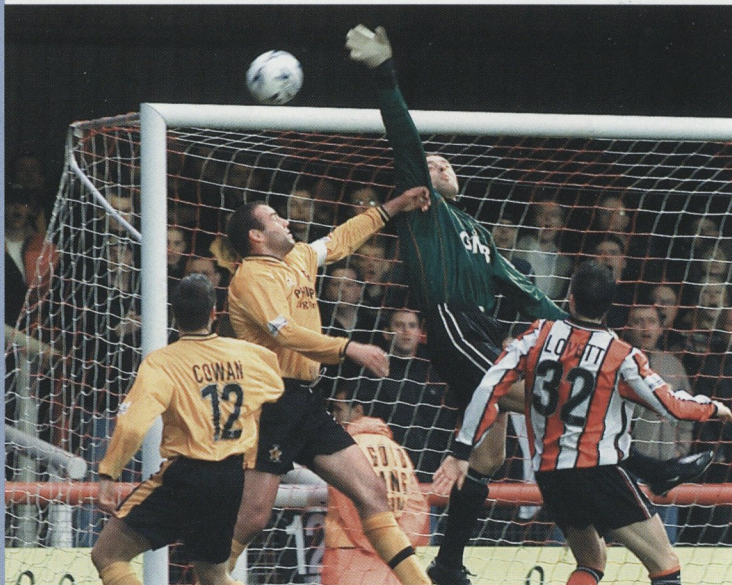

The Bees with three changes to the side who played in the Final three days earlier, all absent through injury, saw a two goal lead slip in the final 8 minutes of the match. A first half strike from Lloyd Owusu and a brilliant second half goal direct

and after three minutes Ashbee flashed a shot wide of the target. Seven minutes later with the Bees still edging their way slowly into the game, United forced the first of 13 corners and skipper Wanless headed wide.

from a free kick by Paul Evans looked to have secured all three points for the Bees, and a mathematical assurance of Second Division football next season. But Cambridge United trailing the Bees by six points having played a game more, pulled back through Tom Youngs and a late late equaliser from Andy Duncan to share the spoils. Rowlands, Gibbs and Mahon all absent through injury, although Mahon was also sitting out a one match suspension, were replaced by Mark Williams, Jay Lovett and Tony Folan respectively with a slight reshuffle to accommodate. The game took a time to get going

The Bees first showed in the 14th minute when Evans header went to Scott Partridge who turned the ball on to Lloyd Owusu. But although Joseph impeded him on the edge of the area the challenge went undetected. Two minutes later Dobbo played through to Partridge who in turn picked out Tony Folan. His resultant chip was hoicked away for the Bees first corner. In the 20th minute good defensive play by Dobbo thwarted Riza as he looked to go clear in the area. But then within the minute the Bees had forced their second corner which was to spawn their goal. Folan

whipped the ball in and Owusu rose high to flick a header home inside the near post. Cambridge came back forcing two quick corners but to no avail. In the 27th minute Williams came within a whisker of extending the Bees lead when his long centre hit the crossbar.

With ten minutes of the half remaining a fine move involving Partridge, Williams and Ingimarsson ended with the keeper gathering. With five minutes of the half remaining a Folan corner was blocked out as far as Partridge who returned a

half volley, which flew just over the bar. The half ended with Cambridge going close and forcing a late corner. Youngs came on at the start of the second half for United replacing Richardson. Two minutes later Powelly cleared off the line following a parried shot stopper by Oli Gott.

In the 53rd minute Folan blasted over when well placed following an Owusu centre. Five minutes later a long throw from Fleming was blasted wide by United's Ashbee from the edge of the area. Ashbee received the games only booking on the hour mark. In the 67th minute a terrific run by Scottie Partridge deserved better than a misplaced pass having progressed to the edge of the area. Minutes later a quick throw from Owusu led to a long diagonal ball from Partridge to Folan who in turn jinked goalwards but lifted his shot wide. Then with eleven minutes of normal time remaining Partridge was pulled down thirty yards out. Up stepped Captain Fantastic Evo and he placed the perfect free kick high into the top left hand corner of the net leaving the keeper absolutely no chance. It looked like game over. But just five minutes later two defenders went for the same challenge in the area and allowed Youngs the comparatively simple task of stroking the ball home. With seconds remaining of normal time Julian Charles came on to replace Bees Man of the Match Scott Partridge. But United had a bite in their tail, and with seconds remaining of the additional three minutes Andy Duncan rose beyond the far post to direct his header home. The point seemed to be a life saver given the reaction of the travelling fans. Given that, the point gained by the Bees may well have assured us of Second Division football next season with four games still remaining.

**Bees v Luton Town**

Who can forget the 21st February 1999? What a great day that was - the day the Bees completed their 2nd double of last season. Owusu equalised on the stroke of half time after a terrible first half from Brentford. The introduction of Scott Partridge changed the game, and we started to look good! A long-range volley from Paul Evans capped a memorable afternoon. Only the injury to Danny Boxall ruined the afternoon. Earlier in the season the Bees had beaten Luton 2-0 at GP in early September. For all the rubbish we had to put up with last season, thank god we beat Luton!

One of my favourite Luton games was last season's game at Kenilworth Road. This resulted in a fine win for the Bees, Lloyd and the Captain scoring our two goals. But how many of us would envisage that the season would turn sour at that point and we would fail to win another game that campaign, as we slid down the table dramatically from 9th in February to 17th in May!

I suppose in the 1967/8 season, the nearest we got to having a local derby is the 4th Division was against Luton Town. The crowd, on 17th February 1968 was well above average at 7,710 and this was because Luton brought down a very large contingent of their supporters, as they were riding high in the League.

Griffin Park had no segregation in those days and all spectators were free to sit or stand anywhere. The crew from Bedfordshire certainly seemed to be everywhere as they were definitely the noisiest visitors for a long time. Lower Division supporters however were much better behaved in those days and there was no sign of any trouble even when the Bees were outclassed by the Hatters.

We lost 0-2 although it could have been a few more. Luton were worthy Champions that season and were presented with their trophy at the final game at Kenilworth Road on 11th May, after they did the double over us by winning 2-1 in front of a magnificent 14,643 crowd.

Can you imagine the sort of attendance in the basement league now? The notable thing on that day was the cost of the official programme at half a crown (12 pence) when all throughout the seasons I was used to paying a tanner (2 pence) for most away programmes. From that memorable 1967/8 season, Aldershot, Bradford PA, Doncaster, Newport and Workington are no longer in the League.

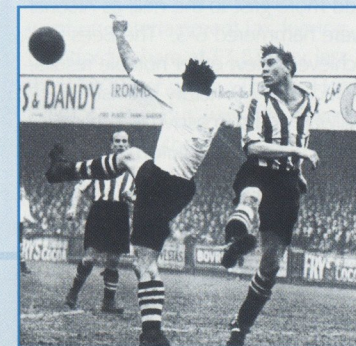

# 1945-46

## ARSENAL REVISITED

**BRENTFORD (1) 6 ARSENAL (1) 3 ATT: 22,250**

From Arsenal's point of view it was the best thing that could have happened when Brentford dropped out of the top flight in 1947.

As we have already seen, season after season went by with the mighty Gunners shot down in flames by the upstarts from Griffin Park.

Arsenal was the era's dominant force and the equivalent today would be for Southampton too regularly put Manchester United to the sword.

Arsenal did occasionally come up with the goods, about as often though as a total eclipse of the sun. The clash in February 1946 was to add more grist to the mill, as Arsenal were hammered 6-3. The Bees achieved a few other notable results, including a 7-0 victory against Millwall, and successive 6-1 and 5-1 home wins against Luton and

Nottingham Forest, but the Arsenal result holds pride of place.

As usual Arsenal were able to field a team which most managers would give their eye teeth for, players like England Internationals Laurie Scott, amateur Bernard Joy (a Brentford schoolmaster by the way), Cliff Bastin and Dennis Compton, whose wing play was matched by his ability with the bat for Middlesex and England, and Dr. Kevin O'Flanagan, the Irishman later to play for Brentford and also represent Ireland at football one week and Rugby Union the next.

The Bees lined up with Internationals Crozier (Scotland) Gorman (Ireland, both the Republic and Northern), Scott (England) and Hopkins (Wales), and on this occasion trumped the lot by the inclusion at outside left of Harry Bamford, an MBE, no less, whose war service in

the Middle East had seen him twice mentioned in despatches. It was his link up with Bob Thomas, which was to prove Arsenal's downfall as they ran rings round Laurie Scott.

Bamford, just

recently demobbed, came in for his debut after telling Harry Curtis "he fancied his chance" as the manager continued his search for Leslie Smith's replacement following the England winger's £6,500 move to Aston Villa the previous October.

Brentford set off at their usual rate of knots and should have taken an early lead.

Bamford fed Durrant with a peach of a ball but the centre forward made himself look a lemon by shooting over from a couple of feet out.

Straight from the goal kick Swindon found Bastin and his crossfield pass was lashed home by the unmarked Compton. Arsenal's lead was short lived as soon afterwards Thomas beat Joy in a race for the ball and lobbed Swindon. The score remained unchanged until after the break, although Thomas left an imprint on the Gunners crossbar

before Arsenal regained the lead through O'Flanagan.

They must have thought their luck had changed, but that situation didn't last long as The Bees took a stranglehold on the game and scored four in 25 minutes to streak clear. Bamford was again the instigator, his inch perfect pass being belted home by Thomas for the equaliser. Fred Durrant fumbled Bamford's shot-cum-centre and as he tried to recover, the young centre forward bundled both ball and keeper over the line. Arsenal's

defence was now all at sea and Gerry McAloon sunk The Bees' fourth with a well-directed header.

Bamford deservedly got his name on the scoresheet seconds later after Dai Hopkins centre was scrambled clear and he hit it back first time past Swindon.

Thomas completed his hat trick when McAloon was brought down in the box, and he gave Swindon not an earthly from the spot kick.

The Bees continued to steamroller the opposition and Thomas again rattled the crossbar, but the final goal fell to the visitors when O'Flanagan ran through for their third of the afternoon.

The final score, then, Brentford 6, Arsenal 3, and I could leave you on that happy note. But it is worth quoting a few sentences from 'Argus' of the Brentford & Chiswick Time in his match summary.

Remember Brentford won 6-3, but still this scribe was not satisfied.

On Bamford: "Opposed by Scott, England's right full back, he had a

would like to see "Billy" drop, and that is arguing with the referee. It often means an opponent being left unmarked".

Hat trick man, Thomas: "In the past few weeks he has created the impression that he is solely an individualist which to my way of thinking harms, more than it helps, at team".

And finally: "Yet convincing as this win was, the team was not above criticism. Although the majority of the goals came from the left wing, I do not consider that The Bees have solved that problem, although on this showing the Thomas-Bamford formation is the most forceful I have seen".

Rumours that the 'Argus' mentioned now works for the 'Middlesex Chronicle' have not been proven.

Although the war in Europe came to an end in May 1945, it was August before Japan surrendered so it was

ties were settled over two legs, Brentford progressing to the sixth round at the expense of Spurs 4-2 (2-2, 2-0), Bristol City 6-2 (1-2,5-0) and QPR 6-1 (3-1,3-0).

Charlton then took the wind out of Brentford's sails 9-4 - 6-3 at The Valley and 3-1 here.

The aggregate attendance was 231,754 (225,411), an average of 28,969 (28,176), the figures depending on the source, but most impressive, whichever.

The match at Griffin Park drew a full house of 36,000 - an estimated 2,000 were locked out - paying new record receipts of £3,065-11s-9d. Unfortunately there was no cash bonanza for the club, as this breakdown shows.

The eight games attracted a gross income of £18,939. Of that £7,685 went on entertainment tax, leaving Brentford's share at £3,538, or less than £500 per game. This, as Harry Curtis pointed out, was little more than a drop in the bucket.

He said, "the wage bill at Griffin Park is £300 and any profit on the season is taxed at a rate of, 10s (50p) in the £ pound, which begs the question, 'has the Government already Nationalised professional football?'"

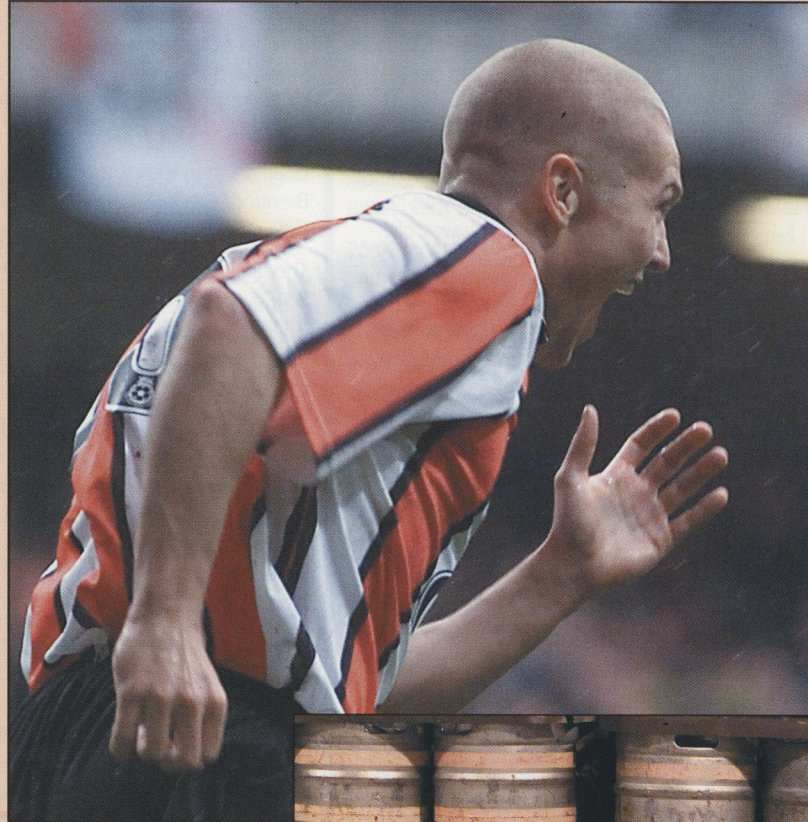

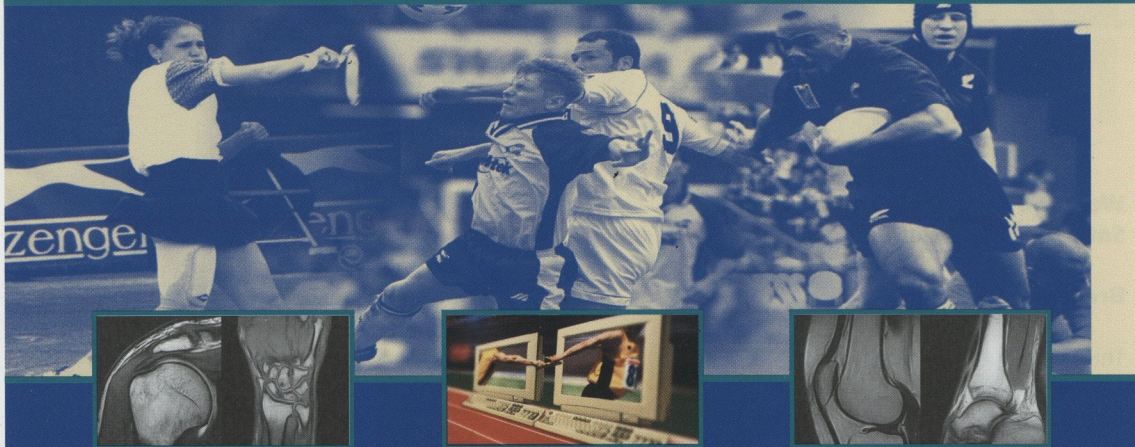

### It's grim up north!

Then came the visit of world champions St. Helens and the Saints had a shock: London came out with all guns blazing and Saints scraped home by just two points 18-20. 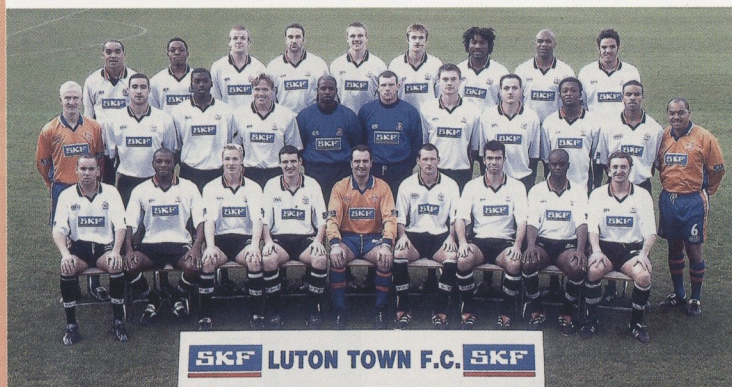

# LUTON TOWN

Luton are planning for next season after losing their fight against relegation nine days ago in a 1-0 home defeat by Rotherham. It will be their first season in the League basement since 1968 and four days before The Millers' visit, manager Joe Kinnear started to look ahead by releasing five players and transfer-listing four more.

These could not be the only departures judging by Kinnear's quotes after last Saturday's 3-1 defeat at Bristol City. He told The Hatters' official website he wants to bring in six outfield players and a goalkeeper and added: "I've cleared the decks already. I've got rid of 10 already and there's probably another four or five I want to get rid of. "We've got enough footballers but we need some leaders. The Third Division will be more direct but if we've got enough ability in the side that should see you through. Four teams go up so I will resign if I don't come back up providing I get support."

Kinnear is Luton's third manager this campaign following former players Ricky Hill and Lil Fuccillo. His reign started well with three wins in his opening three games and two more in the next four matches but it was not enough to save them. They had some diversion in the Cups this term, reaching the third round in the FA Cup with a 1-0 win over Conference high-flyers Rushden & Diamonds and a 2-0 replay triumph over Darlington following a goalless draw before losing 2-1 after extra-time at QPR after a 3-3 draw. They made the second round of the Worthington after beating Peterborough on away goals but found Premiership Sunderland too much to handle, losing 5-1 overall. Peterborough got revenge for that defeat with a 1-0 win in round one of the LDV Vans Trophy.



## DID YOU KNOW

- Luton wing-half Joe Payne, in his first game as a striker, set a League record which still stands to this day after scoring an incredible 10 times in a Division Three (South) clash with Bristol Rovers in April 1936. His personal efforts contributed to a 12-0 hammering which is a record for both clubs but it was not enough to earn his side promotion as they finished one point behind Coventry in second place at the end of the season.
- The Hatters are one of the few teams in the country to have played in all four tiers of the League – Brentford are another. Their League career started in Division Two in 1897 but three seasons later they lost their League place and returned in Division Three in 1920. They had the first of their three spells in the old Division One in 1955 but sunk to Division Four for the only time 10 years later.
- Arguably the biggest day in the club's history came in April 1988 when they beat Arsenal 3-2 in a thrilling Littlewoods Cup final. Brian Stein put them ahead in the first half but Gunners substitute Martin Hayes equalised in the 71st minute. Alan Smith quickly gave Arsenal the lead but Hatters keeper Andy Dibble then saved a penalty from Nigel Winterburn to inspire a frantic finale which saw Danny Wilson and Stein

both score late on to snatch a dramatic victory.

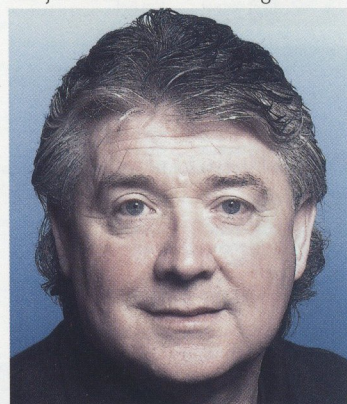
● That was Luton's second Wembley appearance in two months as at the end of March they went down 4-1 to Reading in the Simod Cup final. They also missed out 29 years earlier when they lost 2-1 to Nottingham Forest in the FA Cup final.

Luton's last visit was early on last season in mid-September and second half goals from Darren Powell and Scott Partridge gave us the points. The win moved us up to eighth in the table and dropped them down to fifth

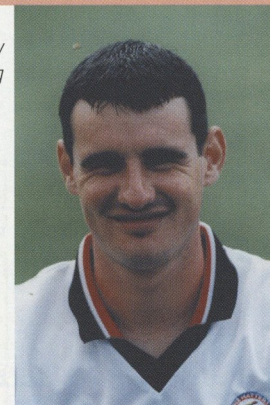
## THE MANAGER

As mentioned earlier, **Joe Kinnear** has just taken over as manager at

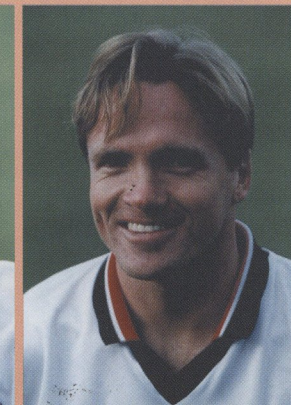

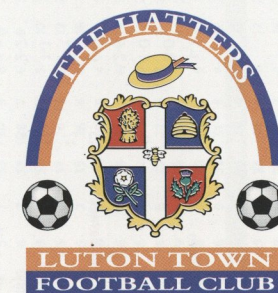
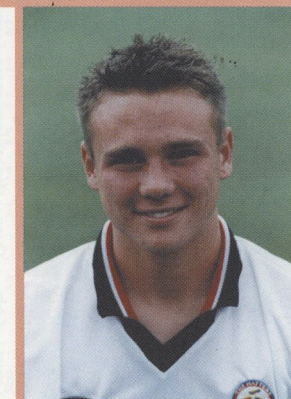
