Luton, already beset by injuries, had to reorganise as first midfielder Paul Hughes and then defender Alan Neilson limped off the pitch to join a lengthy injury list.

Manager Joe Kinnear was forced to change tactics and for the second half, he switched to a 4-4-3 with Dean Crowe sent on as the third striker.

It worked although it needed defender Chris Coyne to move up field to fire a 54th-minute equaliser, aided by a couple of slight deflections in a crowded penalty area.

Andrew Fotiadis, one of the culprits in Luton's earlier failure to convert their chances, made amends by snatching the winner after 69 minutes.

His manager said: "I heard the crowd shouting for him to be taken off when he missed a chance just before he scored. They need to have patience and they seemed to forget that he scored last week."

Kinnear added: "Four wins on the trot is very satisfying and I am pleased with this win considering the side I had to put out. I barely had 11 fit players so there was always going to be hiccups in the team performance."
