He rose superbly to meet Roberts' fine cross, only for Emberson to tip the ball onto the crossbar.

Exeter surged forward deserved equalise in the 68th minute.

The Luton defenders panicked as Flack prepared to pounce inside the box, and as Emmerson Boyce attempted to clear the ball it struck Lee Mansell and richocheted into his own net.
