

Brock blunders, Hatters celebrate

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FIVE crazy minutes brought Kidderminster's winning streak to an end at Aggborough Stadium.

Harriers midfielder Danny Williams had the crowd rubbing their hands in anticipation of a sixth home win on the trot when he scored after 50 minutes.

In a thrilling match that was a credit to the third division, Williams drove in a 20-yard rebound in the 50th minute after his free-kick had been blocked.

But, three minutes later, Luton hit back with an equaliser that was an embarrassment for keeper Stuart Brock, who allowed a hard-driven effort from Matthew Taylor to go between his legs.

In the 55th minute, Brock was again left with egg on his face when he was caught out of position.

Matthew Spring broke free down the left flank and the keeper left his near post unguarded as he moved off his line. Spring then promptly drilled in a 20-yard angled effort with the keeper stranded.

The nightmare continued in the 58th minute when Brock failed to hold a shot from Kevin Nicholls and Steven Howard took advantage of the fumble to turn in the loose ball from close range.

Luton made certain of their ninth away League win of the campaign when Spring rifled in their fourth goal in the 70th minute, latching on to a poor clearance from substitute Ian Joy.

Kidderminster boss Jan Molby didn't mince his words, blaming Brock for the loss.

He said: "We presented them with three goals and they were all down to the goalkeeper, who now needs a kick up the backside."
