LUTON TOWN 3 LEYTON ORIENT 0 DAVE FLETT reports from Kenilworth Road

LUTON Town have won five successive league games for the first time in more than 20 years following last night's impressive victory over Levton Orient.

The Hatters last enjoyed such a run in November, 1981 and Joe Kinnear's men are now close to becoming cast-iron certainties for promotion from Division Three this season.

Goals by Chris Coyne, Dean Crowe and Adrian Forbes also saw the Hatters keep the pressure on Plymouth Argyle at the top of the table.

Forbes returned to the Hatters strike force after missing Saturday's 1-0 victory at Torquay because of suspension.

He replaced on-loan Gary McSwegan, who dropped to the substitutes' bench alongside

Marvin Johnson.

Jean-Louis Valois was preferred to Johnson, with Croatian midfielder Ahmet Brkovic missing out on an opportunity to face his former club because of an ankle injury.

His absence gave Paul Hughes a place in the starting line-up, while Orient included former Hatters trialist Matthew Brazier

on the left-wing.

Christie's bouncing shot was easily saved by Emberson early in the second-half and the Hatters doubled the lead on 49 minutes when a relieved Crowe ended his 10-game goal drought.

Crowe shot low between Barrett and an upright from six yards after Nicholls and Forbes had combined to release him in the penalty box.

Midfield inspiration Nicholls limped out of the action on 61 minutes after struggling valiantly to shrug off an earlier knock picked up in a clash that earned Orient striker Kevin Nugent a vellow card.

David Bayliss replaced Nicholls as boss Kinnear briefly switched to a three centre-back formation.

The Hatters made the points safe on 66 minutes when Valois' corner was half-cleared and Coyne's controlled hook back into the box found Forbes, who gathered the ball before driving low past Barrett.

Matthew Spring then had an excellent effort ruled out by an offside flag and David McGhee should have grabbed a consolation goal for the visitors but headed wide of a gaping goal as Emberson failed to punch clear.
