# Foti finishes off hapless Robins

ANOTHER impressive second half display gave injury-plagued Hatters all three points against bottom-placed Cheltenham Town.

Trailing at the break with two men off injured, Luton deservedly won with goals from Chris Coyne and in-form Andrew Fotiadis.

Both teams were promoted from Division Three last season but on this display the struggling Robins look like heading back there as Luton won their fourth straight league game.

Injured Ian Hillier was replaced by Alan Neilson in defence and Aaron Skelton was handed his first start of the season. Boss Joe Kinnear continued with the 'diamond' that put Skelton playing just in front of the defence and midfielder Matthew Spring given more of a licence to go forward.

Luton took the game to Cheltenham from the outset. After the run of good form, the Kenilworth Road faithful roared the team on for more of the same. But Cheltenham had not read

the script. In their first attack they opened the scoring on 11

Strikers Tony Naylor and Julian Allsop were allowed room inside the box and their interplay left winger Russell Milton free on the edge of the box. He neatly tucked the ball into the corner of the net.

It was like a red rag to a bull as Luton applied relentless pressure for an equaliser.

On 16 minutes a long range drive from Skelton worried Robins' 'keeper Steve Book, who parried over the bar.

Two minutes later came the chance of the half when Paul Hughes played a delicate chip to Fotiadis. One-on-one with Book, Fotiadis' attempted lob sailed wide.

With 20 minutes gone top goalscorer Steve Howard hit the crossbar with a trademark header from five yards out.

Emmerson Boyce's overlapping runs on the right hand side had been causing Cheltenham grief all half and it was his teasing cross that so nearly brought Howard the equaliser.

On 34 minutes Kinnear was forced to replace Hughes due to injury with Peter Holmes and the beginning of the second half saw the introduction of striker Dean Crowe in place of the crocked Neilson.

Luton switched to a 4-3-3 formation in search of a goal with Skelton reverting to centre back in a makeshift defence.

Luton resumed brightly much to the delight of the crowd. With

so much possession it was not long before Luton gave the crowd what they wanted.

On 54 minutes substitute Holmes teed up a shot from outside the box but overhit the ball. The ball fell to Coyne who finished the job, driving in a sweet volley from 25 yards.

After scoring in his previous two games, Fotiadis' confidence was high but on 57 minutes he missed an absolute sitter. Played through by Holmes, Fotiadis was again one-on-one with Brook.

He seemed to take an age where to place the ball and finally opted to shoot straight into Book's

Fotiadis had the last laugh, scoring the winner on 69 minutes. A rare Cheltenham attack was broken down and Steve Robinson burst through the midfield before releasing Crowe who, despite being forced wide, managed a shot.

The powerful drive was blocked by Book and the ball fell kindly to Fotiadis, who made up for his previous misses. It was no more than Luton deserved and as the Hatters pushed for three Cheltenham must have prayed for the final whistle. Fortunately for them, the only assault on their goal came with the last kick of the match.

Dynamic Crowe laid a pass on for Howard to chase. His return ball found Crowe at the near post and his diving header was just wide.

Kinnear was pleased the result. "We got what we deserved. We could have been two or three up at half time with better finishing.

"Lesser sides would not have coped with our long-ball game today."

But the Hatters boss has a mounting injury crisis. "We only have 11 fit players left and we fielded nowhere near our strongest side."
