LUTON put their shaky promotion push back on track with victory over M1 rivals Northampton thanks to a late strike from former Chelsea midfielder Paul Hughes, but manager Joe Kinnear admitted that his side had nearly thrown it all

Luton, who had enough chances to win twice over, almost gifted relegationthreatened Northampton a share of the spoils after conceding from their only
