ROWAN Vine's 13th goal of the season was enough to earn Brentford their first league win of the year with a 1-0 win at Luton.

"All our players work hard for one another," he said.

"We got to half time with the score still level and that gave us a reasonable platform to push on.

"I asked them to try and get a goal and the one we got was tremendous."

For Luton boss Joe Kinnear there was nothing to give pleasure from a performance which was well below those he had seen from his side in recent weeks.

"It's so very disappointing," he said.

"We had enough clearcut chances to win the game but even so the performance was flat. Too many players had an off day and I have spelt it out to them in no uncertain terms.

"I give credit to Brentford because it was a tremendous goal. They hassled us, worked hard, and they closed us down. We needed a goal to give us a lift but the spark was missing."

Kinnear's men were called into Kenilworth Road on Sunday and were forced to watch the video of their lacklustre display.

He said: "The message to some of them is that they must get their act together. Too many went missing and that's not good enough."
