Hatters boss Joe Kinnear admitted it would not take a 'miracle' to catch QPR in the final play-off

A twisted ankle forced Thorpe off after just 14 minutes and to compound the problem substitute Forbes received a straight red for an unprovoked elbow in the face on Graham Allen.

With both teams desperate for the points, it was ten-man Luton that looked more likely to win, wasting two great chances late in the game.

Kinnear gave a debut to recent loan signing from Reading, Sammy Igoe, and surprisingly it was Forbes who had to make way for the newcomer.

Hatters' fans were also heartened to see the return of right back Emmerson Boyce with Chris Willmott, Ian Hillier, Paul Hughes and Mark Ovendale on the bench the strongest they have looked in that department all season.

It took Igoe just seven minutes to make his first favourable impression with the fans, leaving his marker for dead with a clever foot over the ball.
