NEWELL'S VERDICT

"I THOUGHT we had the game won. The players did everything we asked of them.

"There's not a lot I can say to them apart from they didn't keep it going for 90 minutes and that they could have defended a bit better from set-

pieces and crosses.

"I don't think Plymouth raised their game. I wasn't impressed with them at all.

"We might have sat back a bit, but that's what you do when you're

defending a lot.

"We could have passed the ball a bit better in the second-half. When the game opened up we didn't make as much of it as we should have done.

"But our players earned the right to get something out of the game by the way they played in the first-half and the start of the second."
