HATTERS midfielder Steve Robinson made his home league debut for Luton on Saturday in place of whiz-

kid Kevin Foley.

Foley was called up to the
Republic of Ireland's under 21 side for the UEFA under 21 Championship qualifier against Switerland on Friday. However, the 18year-old was forced to pull out of the squad due to an ankle injury. Robinson, himself recov

ering from a back operation undertaken in the summer, made only his second first-team start on Saturday.

THE MASTER-SHEFF show continued at Kenilworth Road at the weekend as Luton's on-loan star Gary McSheffrey bagged his first brace for the Hatters.

McSheffrey has been cooking up a storm during his two months in Bedfordshire from Coventry City and has shown fans that he has all the ingredients to become a top-class striker.

And McSheffrey put the icing on the cake of a late Luton fightback against Wycombe on Saturday by smashing home an unstoppable left-footed effort

from 25-yards in the final minute.

His memorable strike followed a slightly scrappier, but more important equaliser, in the 75th minute to cancel out Wycombe's opener, a penalty from Steve Brown in the 49th minute.

Defender Russ Perrett grabbed his second goal in six days to put the Town ahead in the 85th minute before McSheffrey brought the house down with his
