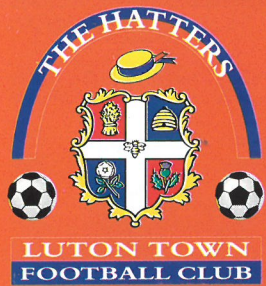

Winning warm-up for Thurrock

LIKE the Town, Thurrock come into tonight's game on the back of an excellent win on Saturday. Former Luton men Cliff Akurang and Tresor Kandol shared the goals as Thurrock won 4-2 at Aylesbury, with the midfielder collecting a hat-trick. He opened the scoring with a header before Kandol fired in the second. Aylesbury pulled one back before the interval, but Akurang netted twice more in the second half, one a header and the other a shot.

The victory kept Thurrock in sixth place, well on track for this season's target, to finish in the top 13 of the Ryman Premier League, and so qualify for the first season of the new Conference South.

Thurrock must make at least one team change from the side that met the Town, because on-loan midfielder Dave Lee is suspended. Paul Linger, who went on as a sub against the Town, is expected to replace him.

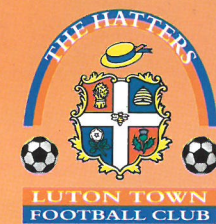

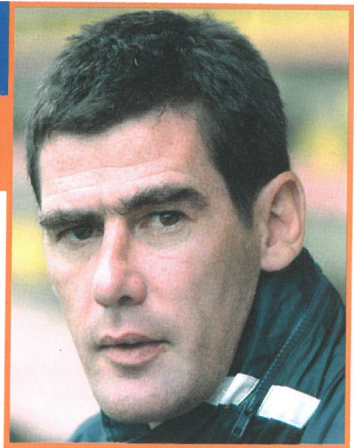

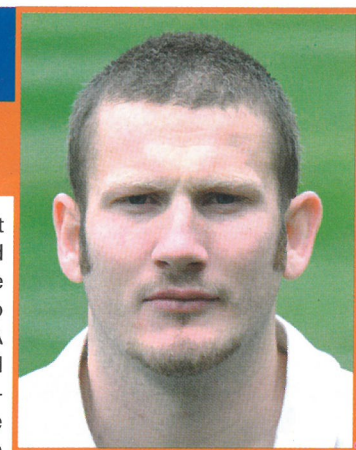

The Town Captain's View



I WILL be back in my seat in the stand tonight expecting to see another good win, but hopefully without anything like the early shocks we had on Saturday before overcoming Wrexham. I had no doubt that over the 90 minutes we deserved to win, but we caused problems for ourselves by our slow start.

You have to give credit to Wrexham, because they played some good stuff in the first half, and there were times when we hardly touched the ball. We showed great character to come back so strongly after going two down, but I admit I was feeling a bit worried when Wrexham got their second goal. If it had stayed 2-0 to them at half time we would have found it very difficult. For that reason, I think the quick reply to their second goal by Adrian Forbes was the day's most important score. It gave us the lift we needed, and must have been a real blow to Wrexham's confidence.

I thought our second half performance was excellent, and it's just a pity that we did not put on something similar in the first 45 minutes. It's good to know that we are capable of getting a result after going two down, but I don't enjoy seeing us giving any opposition a two-goal start.

If the goal by Forbsey was the most important one of the game, I thought the equaliser by Steve Robinson was a great strike, real class, and coming at a time just when it was needed. It's good to see him finding his form again. His back operation has meant he is no longer in pain and that must be a real boost for him.

Lee Mansell got a bit of stick from the lads after his goal. He claims he meant it, in which case it was a brilliant effort to deceive a good goalkeeper from such a sharp angle. But at the end of the day, a goal is a goal, and a winner, however it comes, is always very welcome, so well done Manse!

Tonight we are likely to be set different problems from those we encountered on Saturday. We had a real

fright at Thurrock, and we know we are fortunate still to be in the FA Cup. We could not have complained if we had fallen at the

first hurdle. Once more, Thurrock have nothing to lose and everything to gain. If we beat them handsomely, as we should if we are focused, people will say it is only to be expected. If we lose, we will be held up to ridicule. I have yet to be at any club beaten by a non-league side, and I can hardly imagine how embarrassing it would be if it were to happen.

One thing is for sure: we cannot afford to be slow starters again. We mustn't give them a sniff of a chance to draw blood.

Thurrock will be up for it, as they were at the first game. There is something special about the FA Cup and the atmosphere it creates. Tonight will be Thurrock's cup final, playing on a league ground in front of a crowd several times bigger than they are used to at home. That should inspire their lads, so we must make sure we too rise to the challenge, from first kick to last.

The incentive is clear enough: a visit to Rochdale in the second round would be tricky, but we have to believe that we are good enough to win tonight, and then do it again at Spotland, and then we are in with the big boys for round three. Saturday's excellent second-half performance, and the three points to keep us in touch with the play-off places, should give us confidence. All I ask of the lads is that they carry on tonight were they left off on Saturday.

The Thurrock Football Club was founded as recently as April 1985 but until the start of this season had played under the name of Purfleet Football Club.

The first competitive game played by the Club was on 24 August 1985 against Canvey Island Reserves in Division One of the Essex Senior League and resulted in a 3-0 win.

The Club's ground forms part of the Thurrock Hotel and at first consisted of two pitches and dressing rooms in the main building. Under this set-up the Club could only compete at Junior level and mid-way through the season the playing area was turned round to give one pitch and the building of dressing rooms started in order for the club to become a self-contained unit away from the main Hotel Complex.

At the end of it's first season the Club finished third in the League and was granted Senior Status by the Essex County FA. The next season Purfleet were able to compete in the Senior Section of the Essex Senior League. Planning permission was obtained from the local council for the erection of floodlights and the building of a grandstand. The floodlights went up in January 1988 and the first game under them was an Essex Thames-side Trophy

match against Pennant, which the visitors won by 2-1.

An application was made to join the Isthmian League (now the Ryman League) and by the rules of the 'Pyramid' would be conditional on the Club finishing in the top three. Purfleet not only won the League but also achieved the double retaining the League Cup by defeating Canvey Island 2-1. In their two seasons playing in the Essex Senior League Cup, Purfleet had the distinction of never having lost a game.

Election into the Isthmian League (then called the Vauxhall Opel League) was obtained at the League's AGM in June 1988 and the Club's new 300-seater stand was made ready for the start of the season. The first ever-Isthmian League game was in Division Two North on 20th August 1988 at Hornchurch and resulted in a 1-0 win.

While the Club, since it's formation has been happy to be located within The Hotel, it's aim has always been to have a club house of it's own. At the conclusion of season 1998-99 work began on the building of the 'Purfleet Club House', which finally opened for the home game against Canvey Island on 3rd March 2001.

Full terracing was installed at the Ship Lane

end of the ground, which gave covered accommodation for 800 spectators. This has enabled the Club to obtain an "A" Grade Ground Grading. Since then further covered accommodation has been added at the M25 end of the ground. Season 1992-93 saw the Club finish 4th in Division One thereby just missing out on promotion. However it made up for it the following season by finishing as runners-up to Bishop's Stortford and thus gain promotion to the Premier Division. In just nine seasons the Club had gone from junior level playing on a roped off pitch to the Premier Division of one of the country's leading Non-league Competitions. What the Club had achieved in such a short time both on and off the pitch was surely a unique achievement.

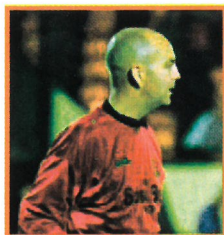
Over the close season the decision was made to change the name of the Club from Purfleet to Thurrock. The Club want to attract a wider audience and extra sponsorship and believe that by having a name that represents the whole borough will be of help. The Club has been very proud of what it has achieved under the name of Purfleet and looks forward to further achievements under its new name.

4. David COLLIS (Defender/Midfield) aged 21.

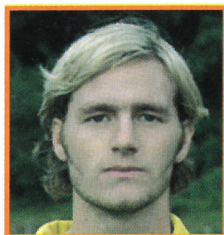
Close season recruit from Ford United. Began his career with Charlton Athletic before moving on to Grays Athletic. A very good striker of a dead ball.

Likes to join the attack for set pieces, which has led to him scor-

8. Steve HEFFER (Midfield) Aged 30

Another one of manager Colin McBride's summer signings from Dagenham & Redbridge. Began his career at West Ham United before moving on to, Southend United, Swindon Town, Grays Athletic, Hendon and Boreham Wood.

16. Gary HOWARD (Midfield) Aged 32

Signed from Boreham Wood during November 2002 for his second spell with the Club. Began his career with Great Wakering before moving on to Brighton, Billericay and Dagenham & Redbridge.

17. Lee ALLEN (Midfield) Aged 23

Signed from Enfield at the start of last season.. Has also seen service with, Kingstonian, Wycombe Wanderers, Leicester City, Chesham United and Walton & Hersham.

12. Martyn LAWRENCE (Midfield). Aged 32.

Followed manager Colin McBride from Concord Rangers during the summer of 1997. Began his football at Southend United before moving on to Southend Manor, Barking and then Billericay Town. Has now made over 260 appearances for the Club. A tireless worker. Last season's "Clubman of the Year"

7. Paul LINGER (Midfield) Aged 28.

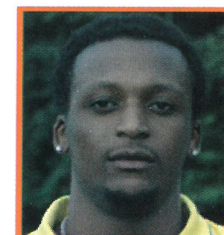
Now in his third season with the club, having joined from Billericay Town. Has also seen service with Welling United, Charlton Athletic and Brighton & Hove Albion.

A Taste Of Their Own Medicine!

Luton Town 3 Wrexham 2

THE LAST time Wrexham came to Kenilworth Road, three years ago, the Town were three up in 55 minutes, only to lose 4-3. So Saturday's winning revival by the Town, after being two down, was all the sweeter for those who suffered on that occasion.

After looking second best for much of the first half, the Town got their act together in the second, and left Wrexham manager Denis Smith furious at the way his side had been turned over. "I suppose we would have taken a draw if it had been offered before the game, but when you go 2-0 up I expect to win, so I am far from happy," he said. "One moment we were cruising, but then we gave away a silly goal, conceded another from a set piece which we had talked about, and the winner was a fluke."

That does scant justice to the Town's impressive display after the break, so much better than what had gone before. Wrexham played neat passing football to keep possession for concerted spells before they got the opening goal they had threatened, Hector Sam bursting through to shoot home in the 19th minute. Luckless Emmerson Boyce got the final touch from a corner as Wrexham scored again after 42 minutes, but then came the most important goal of the game, as the Town stormed forward straight from the restart, with Adrian Forbes using strength and pace to fire in his eighth goal of the season.

That gave the Town a lift for the second half, and put the first seeds of doubt into the Wrexham psyche, and with Matt Spring imposing himself in midfield the visitors were second best from then on. Boyce and Chris Coyne, who was unlucky with a first-half header which hit the bar, were outstanding at the back, but every Town man played his part.

Coyne's header back from a corner by Spring set up Steve Robinson for a classy equaliser, hammered in from the edge of the box, and with Wrexham reeling Gary McSheffrey opened them up on the left, transferred the ball to Spring in the middle, and he moved it further to the right. Lee Mansell belted in the winner from an unlikely angle, and later grinned as he said it was meant to be a shot, not a centre. Either way, the flight deceived Andy Dibble to make it a miserable return to a club which will forever be grateful to him for his Wembley heroics in 1988.

Wrexham skipper Darren Ferguson was sent off with 12 minutes to go for punching Forbes in the mouth. It looked like retaliation for perceived injustice, because a second or two earlier Sir Alex's son had claimed in vain that Forbes had fouled him.

The ten men still offered some threat, and Marlon Beresford had to make a very good save to deny Sam a late equaliser, but for Town fans it was good to see the team taking the game to the opposition right to the final whistle, rather than falling back on nervy defence.

Mike Newell said: "It was a little bit dead in the first 25 minutes or so, and Wrexham played well, as I knew they would after seeing them win at Blackpool in midweek. We got back into it with the goal by Forbes just before the interval, and at half time I said to the players that we could go on and win. We came out for the second half showing a great attitude, passing the ball about well and at speed, and got our rewards."

"You could see from Wrexham's first-half showing how they had won five away games, but the goal by Forbes was very important - if it had stayed 2-0 to them at half time the game could have been dead."

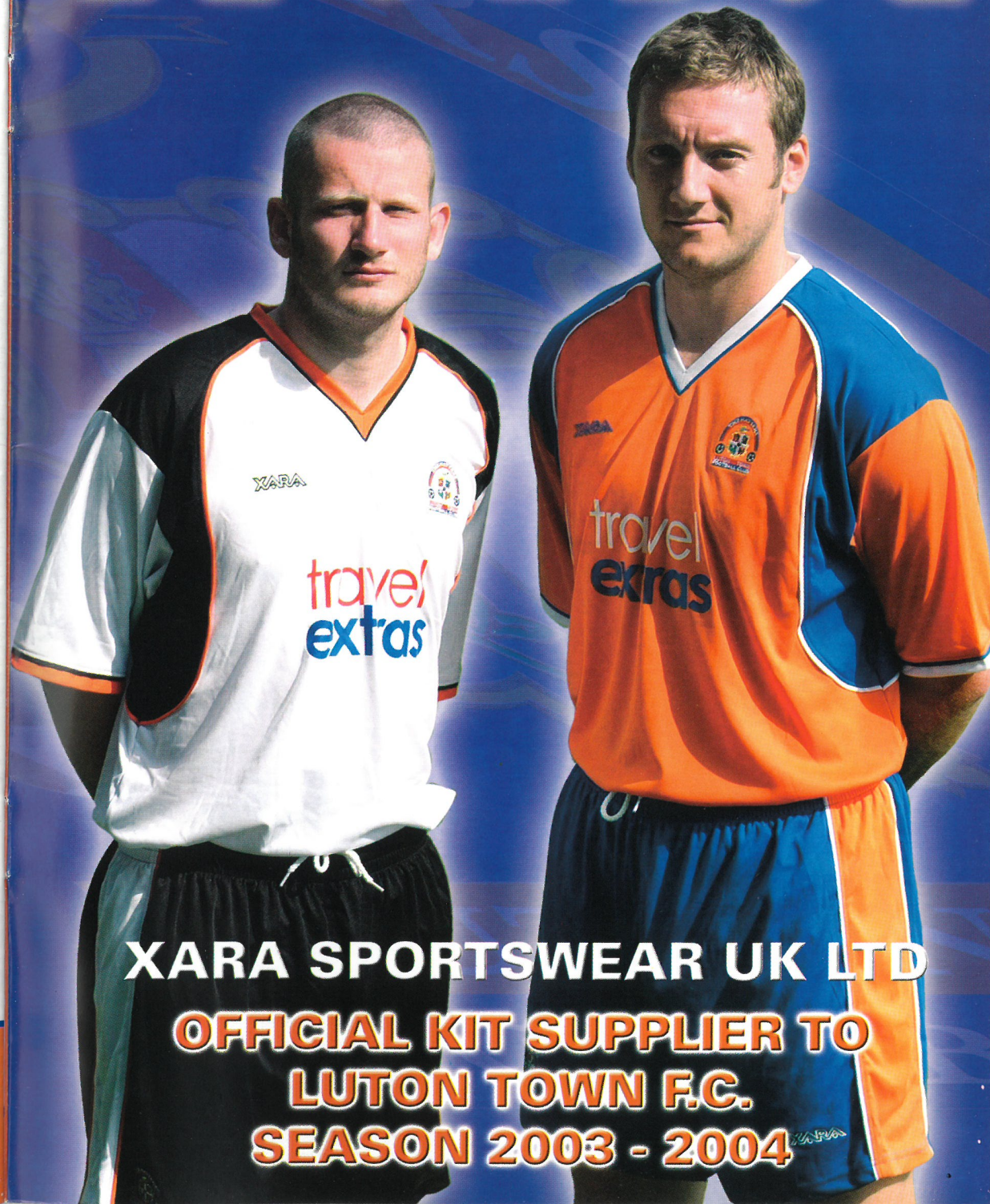

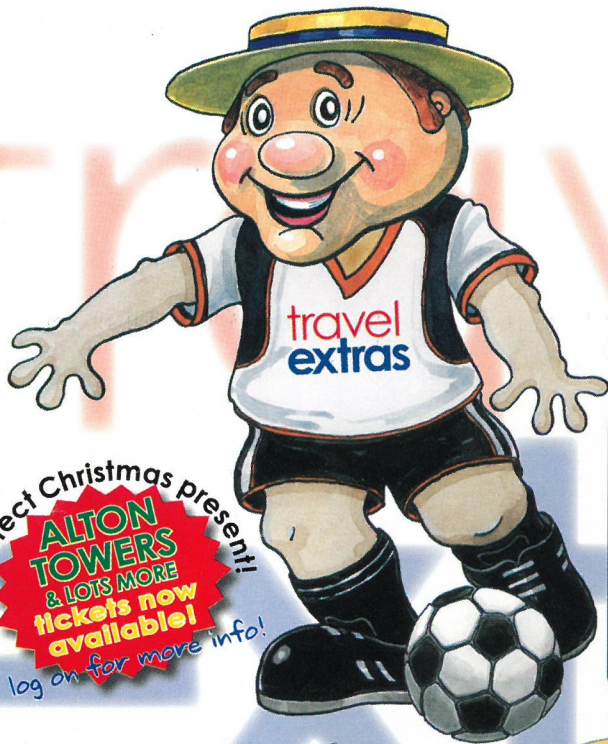
