HATTERS goalkeeper Morten Hyldgaard made it 270 minutes without conceding a goal as Luton struggled against Division Two's basement club Wycombe.

The 26-year-old giant Dane has still to pick the ball out of the net for the Hatters since signing on a free transfer from Scottish Premier League side

And his record continued with a strong Town rearguard showing against Wycombe Wanderers.

Hyldgaard put in a confident display, producing his best save in a one-on-one

producing his best save in a one-on-one against Chairboys forward Nathan Tyson in the 34th minute.

The 6ft 6fins tall stopper was helped by the customary solid partnership from Emmerson Boyce and skipper Chris Coyne at the heart of the Luton defence and by a debut full of promise from teenager Keith Keane at full-back.

But Hatters will be disappointed with an attacking performance that produced only one effort on goal in the entire 90 minutes.
