And further Hatters efforts from Peter Holmes and Bnoch Showumi who struck a brilliant free-kick from 20 yards - saw Luton lead 2-0 and then 3-1 after the break.

Blackpool boss Steve McMahon deemed the linesman "inept" while Town manager Mike Newell also admitted he saw little wrong with the goal. However, Luton could point to a harsh penalty decision for Blackpool's first goal and two home spot-kick appeals urned down by referee Steve Tomlin in the opening 45 minutes.

## Luton hang on to points

Now Town aim to stay shipshape and continue their impressive Division Two league form that has seen them lose just two of their last 19 league games.
