a header over QPR keeper Lee Camp, only for Clark Carlisle to clear acrobatically off the line.

QPR took the lead when Showunm broke to Gallen who had time to pick out Furlong to nod home at the far post

But backed by a vociferous 3,000 strong travelling support Hatters hit back. Showunmi's shot was pushed away by Camp in the 50th minute and two Nicholls efforts were well blocked by Camp in the 63rd and 65th minutes.
