QPR missed the chance to put pressure on leaders Plymouth, as Enoch Showunmi's goal saw Luton come from behind to earn a draw at Loftus Road.

Rangers were the better side in a hard-fought first-half and both Martin Rowlands and Kevin Gallen forced good saves from Luton keeper Morten Hyldgaard.

At the other end, Ahmet Brkovic's deep cross was goalwards headed by Emmerson Boyce, only for Clarke Carlisle to hook the ball off the line.

Paul Furlong's 25-yard freekick forced another good save but he went one better in firsthalf injury time as QPR grabbed the lead.

Gallen got down the left again and crossed for Furlong to head in his 11th goal of the season.

Injury-hit Luton had been forced to make all three of their substitutions in the opening 26 minutes but the reshaped team gelled and they were in the ascendancy after the break.

The dangerous Showunmi got away from Richard Edghill and forced a good save from Lee Camp, while Tony Thorpe shot over for Rangers

and Adrian Forbes fired inches wide at the other end.

Steve Robinson put in Kevin Nicholls after 63 minutes, only for the skipper's shot to be well saved by Camp.

And Nicholls was denied again, with another shot from the edge of the penalty area.

Luton's persistence finally paid off in the 76th minute when they grabbed the equaliser.

QPR pressed forward looking for the winner and it should have come in the 82nd minute.

Rowland's cross picked out Furlong, but this time the striker put his shot inches wide with the goal gaping.
