THE play-off hopes of Luton were put firmly back on course with a dramatic injury-time winner to finally see off promotion rivals Bristol City 3-2.

Rookie defender Keith Keane scored

his first senior goal to seal a dramatic victory after the Robins had seemingly grabbed a share of the spoils with a late equaliser.

Luton took the lead when Steve Howard headed home his 12th goal of the season and Emmerson Boyce doubled their advantage with another header in

the 56th minute.
