Injury time stunner from teenage ace

**Luton Town 3
Bristol City 2**

TEENAGER Keith Keane resurrected Luton's promotion dream with a sensational injury-time winner – just when it seemed another late goal had cost them victory.

Having led 2-0 with goals through Steve Howard and Emmerson Boyce, City showed their class by levelling in the last minute of normal time.

But then Steve Robinson's third perfectly placed free kick led to Keane's magical moment for Luton's first win in seven games.

The Hatters fully deserved all three points, which could prove vital in clinching a play-off spot.

Three defeats in seven days had seen the Hatters drop to the fringes of the play-offs and manager Mike Newell described the run as 'the worst week of our season' in his programme notes.

The successive defeats by Hartlepool, Tranmere and Swindon had not left Hatters in too bad a shape.

Before kick-off Luton were still seven points adrift of the top six, but others in the play-off race had also faltered, leaving Town with a sporting chance of a date in Cardiff's Millennium Stadium.

One side who would not relish the short trip to Wales were today's opponents Bristol City. The Robins are currently chasing QPR for the second automatic promotion place with Plymouth all but crowned champions.

Ex-Hatter Danny Wilson's men slipped up late on in last season's campaign and surrendered second place to Crewe before losing in the play-offs to eventual winners Cardiff.

For yet another 'must-win' game, Newell made three changes. In came Keith Keane and Ahmet Brkovic, and relegated to the bench were Michael Leary and Lee Mansell.

Enoch Showunmi surprisingly joined them, losing out to fit-again Adrian Forbes.

As good as it was to see Luton's top scorer back in the starting XI, it was still a shock that Newell could not fit in Showunmi,

whose emergence this season has been a real plus point, into his team somewhere.

Wilson's men have been in the top echelons all season and from the kick-off they looked a quality side.

But it was Luton who had the first real attempt on goal after four minutes when Steve Robinson tested Steve Phillips with a well-hit 30-yard shot that was equally well saved.

City's right winger Tony Rougier, who tormented Luton's backline throughout the first half, responded with a powerful run through the middle before laying off the ball off to Mickey Fell, whose cross-shot was competently dealt with by Morten Hyldegaard.

Luton took the lead following a free kick won by Howard on 26 minutes when Tony Butler hitched a ride on the big striker's

back. Robinson flighted an inch-perfect cross to Howard at the back post to power in a trademark header – his first home goal since January 17 against Stockport County.

Just after the half-hour mark, they had another chance when recalled Forbes put a ball through for Brkovic, who beat the offside trap but his tame chip over the onrushing 'keeper fell short of the six-yard box.

Luton increased their lead on 56 minutes with a goal from Boyce. Another great delivery from a Robinson free kick found Chris Coyne, whose strong header back across the six yard box came to Boyce and the defender's header went in off the post.

Hatters' joy lasted only three minutes as Christian Roberts pulled a goal back. Put through by captain Tommy Docherty, Roberts allowed the ball to drop before volleying past a stranded Hyldegaard.

City pressed for an equaliser and although their quality was obvious they did not threaten a goal until the very last minute.

From a corner, defender Danny Coles was unmarked to head home, sending the 1500-strong Robins' support into raptures.

They were still celebrating when they were stunned by a Hatters winner from yet another free kick put away by young full back Keane, who chose the perfect moment to score his first league goal.

Robinson stepped up to play another dangerous ball into the box, where a rejuvenated Howard headed for goal. Phillips could only parry the ball to Keane just inside the area, whose volley looped over everyone in the six-yard box and fell into the net with defenders desperately trying to get it clear.

A euphoric Newell said: "I had a feeling we were due one of those. The players have taken so many knocks in the dying minutes of games. We were owed some luck."

"With four games left to go we are still very much in the play-off picture."
