We are very fortunate to have senior and youth team squads that have the enthusiasm and the potential to make the team capable of improving the Club's position from last



We are of course hoping for the same result but it won't be easy as Oldham took four points off us last term.

We go into the campaign full of hope and optimism and with a much-strengthened squad. We have over twenty players who we feel are all capable of playing first-team football and in certain departments, particularly up front and in goal we have a real strength in depth compared to this time last year when we were really stretched. 
The Football League is developing a sense of renewed confidence and an enhanced appreciation of its values, and its value for money. Our competition is about 'real football for real fans'.


AUGUST

BRIAN TALBOT

Brian Talbot's career as a player began as a youngster with Ipswich Town where he made 227 appearances before signing for Arsenal for a fee of £450,000 where he went on to play 326 games for the Gunners.

The rugged midfield player appeared six times for England and is one of only two players to have appeared in consecutive FA Cup finals for different clubs - Ipswich and Arsenal.

As a manager Brian started at West Bromwich Albion before taking charge at Hibernians of Malta. After returning to England, Brian enjoyed huge success at Rushden and Diamonds winning successive promotions from the Conference into the Football League and then from the Third Division to the Second Division.

Brian joined Oldham Athletic in March 2004 when he took over from the departed lain Dowie. In the final twelve matches of last season the Latics lost only once and they will be hoping to carry on from where they left off, once the new season gets underway.

GOALKEEPERS

LES POGLIACOMI

Giant 6' 4" goalkeeper who joined Latics' during the summer of 2002 from Australian side Parramatta Power. After a nervous start Les made a dramatic impact at Boundary Park keeping 19 clean sheets in 37 appearances. Great shot stopper and a commander of his area, Les turned down a move to Premiership side Crystal Palace in favour of staying with Athletic who offered him a new two-year contract.

DEFENDERS

MARK ARBER



Mark joined Athletic in the summer of 2004 after turning down an improved offer from his former club Peterborough United. Learned his trade at premiership club Tottenham Hotspur before moving on to join Barnet for a £75,000 fee in 1998. A number of clubs chased marks signature but Latics manager Brian Talbot closed the deal on this promising player. A powerful figure in the air, commanding at the centre of the defence, defiantly a good capture.

DAVE BEHARALL

Joined Latics' for a £150,000 fee from Newcastle United, this classy defender has the style of play reminiscent of Alan Hanson. Had a spell on loan with Grimsby Town in their first division days

before deciding to join the Latics, sidelined with injury for long spells last term, looking for a better run this time round.

MICHAEL CLEGG

Michael's career began at Old Trafford under the guidance of Sir Alex Ferguson but after spending five years as a pro at United he had only made 14 first team appearances and was loaned out to both Ipswich Town and Wigan Athletic in the same season. Obviously he realised that his future was away from United and Athletic stepped in to offer him a three year deal. In and out of the side last season Michael will be looking for a better season this time round, when on form there is no better defender in the division.

ADAM GRIFFIN

Impressive young defender who has come through the junior ranks at Boundary Park. Adam became first choice at full-back until injury interrupted his season last term, winner of the Latics' goal of the season award for his spectacular effort in the 6-0 mauling of Grimsby Town last season. He is one to watch for the future.

WILL HAINING

Young Scottish International defender who has progressed through the junior ranks at Boundary Park. Will joined Latics from Glasgow Rangers (with whom he won a world youth championship medal) when he was a junior and went on to sign professional forms with Athletic in 2001. Strong tackling defender who has represented his country at junior level, now one of the first names on the Latics team sheet. Not frightened of a tackle and has the scars to prove it.

DANNY HALL

Another product of the Boundary Park youth system, Danny burst on to the scene in the 2002/2003 season after being loaned out to Conference side Scarborough, on his return he was immediately placed in the first team, good at either full-back or in the centre of defence and an excellent passer of the ball.

DEAN HOLDEN

6'1" defender signed from Bolton Wanderers in 2001. Versatile defender who can play equally as well at either full-back or at the centre of defence. Excellent the air, strong in the tackle, Dean has been made club captain for the 2004/2005 season in recognition of his stirling all round performances.

MARC TIERNEY

Young defender of some promise, brother of Manchester United's Paul, Marc came through the youth system at Boundary Park and is now knocking on the door of the first eleven. After two substitutes appearance's last season, more appearances could follow quickly this term. Strong, determined defender, good at either full-back or in the centre of defence.

MIDFIELDERS

MATTY APPLEBY

Experienced campaigner having made over 250 apps for Newcastle United, Darlington , Barnsley and Oldham Athletic. Suffered with injury problems last season but hopefully now back to full fitness. Matty's reputation has been built on his gritty determination style of play, always in the thick of things whether it be tackling or his creative playmaking.

MARK BONNER

Close season signing from Coca-Cola Championship side Cardiff City, Mark's career began with Blackpool before moving on to Cardiff in 1998. Stylish midfield general who has made more than 260 league appearances including two promotion winning seasons.

DANNY BOSHELL

Latics' longest serving player having joined the club as a trainee in 1995, Danny suffered some what with injuries during last season but is now fully fit and raring to go. Centre midfield is Danny's favoured position but is equally at home as a stand-in defender.

ERNIE COOKSIE

Ernie signed from Southern League side Crawley Town and after just four reserve team outings found himself drafted in to the first team squad. Ernie has terrific ariel agility which is a result of his days as a gymnast, now a regular in the Latics team, his busy bustling approach is a joy to watch.

DAVID EYRES

Winner of the 2004 Radio Five Live veteran footballer of the year award massing an astonishing 200,000 votes. Still playing at the top of his game the ex-Blackpool, Burnley and Preston player joined Athletic in October 2000 and has gone on to become one of Boundary Park's all time favourites. Scorer of 149 career goals in all competitions up to the commencement of this season, David is 'Mr. Consistency' himself and a credit to his profession.

STRIKERS

RODNEY JACK

Experienced striker who prefers to play out wide so as to utilise his great pace, the ex-Torquay and Crewe striker spent last season with Rushden and Diamonds. Now chasing the 100 goal target having already bagged 86 in all competitions for his previous clubs.

JOHN EYRE

John is now in is third season back at Boundary Park were his career began back in 1991. Since leaving Boundary Park John made a mini-tour of the east coast stopping off at Scunthorpe United for four seasons and Hull City for two years before returning to the north-west. Versatile forward/midfield player, who always gives his best, made over 250 Football League appearances.

JERMAINE JOHNSON



Bolton Wanderers paid £750,000 for Jermaine's signature when he moved from Tivoli Gardens to the Reebok; the electric quick winger was a consistent goal scorer for the Jamaican national team and Wanderers reserves but could not break in to the Bolton first eleven. Brian Talbot moved in for the youngster in the close season after Jermaine had spent a successful spell with Latics' on loan last term. Without doubt one of the quickest players in Coca-Cola League One.

CHRIS KILLEN

Kiwi striker with a prolific goal scoring record for the New Zealand national side with 14 strikes in 20 games. Joined Latics from Manchester City for a £250,000 fee in 2002. Struggled of late with a number of niggling injuries, now looking to impose himself on the team with his goal scoring abilities.

SCOTT VERNON





WES WILKINSON

Wes has signed a short term contract with the club after impressing in a couple of run outs at the back end of last season. Nippy forward with an eye for goal having registered a hatful of goals for Nantwich Town in the Unibond League. Wes' main asset his pace and tricky feet.

> We realise that there will be injuries, suspensions and players suffering from a loss of form so we know that there is going to be changes. For certain matches there will be times when players are


asked to do a particular job but we're all heading in the

HATTERS

THIS will be the fourth time that we have met Oldham at Kenilworth Road on the opening day of the season and if the previous clashes are anything to go by, with 19 goals scored, we are in for a treat this afternoon.

Oldham's first ever visit to Kenilworth Road came on the opening day of the 1953/54 season following their promotion from Division Three (North). A crowd of 22,822 turned up to see Jim Adam, John Downie and George Cummins make their debuts for the Town and it was Downie who became an instant hero with a hat-trick in a 4-4 draw.

The next opening day meeting came in 1968 with a rejuvenated Town back in the old Division Three after three years in the football basement. We had spent a huge amount of money, by 1968 standards, on players and ground improvements ready for the new season and an enthusiastic crowd of 14,747, including new supporter Eric Morecambe, turned up to see the expensive new signings Brian Lewis, Mike Harrison and Laurie Sheffield.

The fans were soon rewarded when Lewis was upended in the area with the resultant spot kick expertly tucked away by Harrison. Latics goalkeeper David Best was forced to

make half a dozen excellent saves before a Sheffield shot beat him and cannoned off the bar for Keith Allen to drill in the rebound.

After the interval the Town attacked, seemingly at will, and it came as no surprise when full-back Fred Jardine cracked in a 25 yard shot that beat Best all ends up. Harrison and Bruce Rioch then each hit the woodwork before Lewis notched up the goal his clever play deserved in the closing seconds.

The final opening day meeting took place in 1978/79 at the start of David Pleat's first full campaign in the Luton hot seat. By selling Paul Futcher to Manchester City, Pleat had raised the money to wheel and deal in the transfer market in an effort to ring the changes at Kenilworth Road.

After a mad summer of frantic transfer negotiations the upshot was that a puzzled Kenilworth Road crowd of 8,043 gathered to see the Town line up with no fewer than seven new faces against the Latics.

Bob Hatton, David Moss, Chris Turner, Kirk Stephens, Mal Donaghy, Mark Aizlewood and Steve Sherlock all made their debuts that afternoon but by half-time the supporters were questioning Pleat's judgement as Oldham had cruised into a comfortable 1-0 lead.

What was said during the interval team talk has never been revealed but the Hatters steamrollered the Latics in the second period, running in six goals without reply.

The floodgates opened just 15 seconds after the restart when Hatton latched on to a long ball from Turner and scored after Oldham goalkeeper Peter McDonnell had parried his first shot. Seconds later Moss hit number two and from then on the supporters were embarrassed to have even doubted Pleat.

Three goals then followed in a purple five-minute spell. It started when Brian Stein netted after a shot from Moss came back off a post after 71 minutes. Then Lil Fuccillo added a 73rd minute penalty and three minutes later Moss made it 5-1 when he hammered home a long cross from Donaghy. Almost on time Hatton headed the sixth to send the supporters home happy.

HATTER

WE began our pre-season with a match against Rushden, which was on the same day that most of the senior scholars were involved with the two first-team matches at Dunstable and Rugby.

The players who weren't involved in either of those matches got their first run out but it was a very young side. Even though it was an Under-18 match and Rushden had a strong side out we only lost by the odd goal and for me, the result didn't matter that much. Mark Ridgway spoke to me about it and obviously with it being up the road and because it offered us the chance to get to a few matches in over three days we thought it would be good to play in that sort of a tournament.

Our first match was against an Icelandic side and looking at the game after fifteen minutes I thought to myself that I would be disappointed if we didn't win the game. We ran out 4-0 winners and looking at how well they did against the other sides in our

group it made the win even more satisfying. Next up was Coventry who are a strong side and an Academy team so for us to beat them 3-0 was another pleasing result. We then had a game against a Columbian side which was another trip into the unknown. The players worked hard for each other and we put in a strong display to win 4-0 so I was delighted to top the group on the first day, having had three wins without conceding a goal.

We knew on the second day that if we got a win against Brentwood Blast, an American team, we would win the tournament. The lads looked tired because it had been a hot day on the Wednesday, it had taken a lot out of them and this was a tough game for us. We just edged the game I-0 and we followed it up with a scoreless draw with MK Dons so I was really pleased with the way the players per-

We have two matches left, one against Tottenham Hotspur which we were due to play this morning and then on Wednesday we play Reading and we are at the stage that I wanted to be at by this time so I am happy with the progress we are making.

The Youth Alliance season starts on Saturday 14th August with a game at the Rugby Club against Cambridge United. The match starts at 11.00am and we would be pleased to see you there.

SEREMET

A FORTNIGHT AGO Slovenian stopper Dino Seremet completed his move to Luton Town on a Bosman transfer from Maribor Pivovarna Laako and became the first new arrival of the Hatters pre-season.

The 6' 4" goalkeeper made the decision in the summer to try and make a go of it in this country, and after a successful trial spell with the Hatters he signed a two-year contract.

"If you come from Slovenia, or another smaller country like Austria or Croatia, every player wants to come to England to try and make it," commented Seremet. "There are better conditions for work - better pitches, better games and better players.

"I came over for a trial match, we had some training sessions and then a game against Luton. There were players from France, Africa, Australia, Amercia and also a few English players who were without contracts.

"In the game against Luton everything went okay and they invited me to train with them on the following Monday.

"I also went to Oldham for three days that week and they should have had a game but it was cancelled. Luton had a match on the Saturday instead so I came back and played in that. I thought that I did okay and after that I was involved in some more games and trained with them and they offered me a deal.

"I was really happy to sign the contract."

The return of Marlon Beresford at the start of the July was a big boost after he agreed to a switch from Barnsley and Seremet is looking forward to learning from the former Middlesbrough man and hopefully enjoying a competitive tussle for the goalkeeper's jersey with him.

"It is nice to have somebody to push me," Seremet confirmed. "It is nice for me and it is nice for him. It means that you have to work harder and we are both professional. He has played for four years in the Premiership so there is a lot for me to learn from him.

"I want to be the first-choice goalkeeper but I know Marlon wants to be first as well. Every player in the squad has competition for their place and we all want to be in the starting eleven.

"I have played international football from under-15 level to under-21 level in Slovenia and of course, my goal is to get into the international team but first things first I want to have some good games for Luton."

The attitude and determination of the 23-year-old has impressed the coaching staff as Manager Mike Newell explains: "He did well in training and in the games at Hitchin and Rugby. He wants to make a career out of it in England. "He is very strong minded, he's a big lad with a big frame and he is quite confident. We want competition for places and we wouldn't bring people in, especially in that position, who we don't think will be able to compete."



MATHEM BLINKHORN

MATTHEW BLINKHORN became the second new face to arrive at Kenilworth Road during the summer when he agreed to a loan deal on the eve of the pre-season friendly with Charlton Athletic.

The young striker has joined from League One rivals Blackpool and he came on as a second-half substitute against the Addicks to make his first appearance for the Hatters, just 24 hours after signing.

"I had a phonecall on Thursday afternoon from Colin Hendry to say that Luton were interested in taking me on loan for three months," explained the nineteen-year-old. "I phoned Mike Newell and had a chat with him and within 24 hours it was all sorted.

"I was told that I wasn't going to get as many first-team opportunities as I wanted at Blackpool so when Luton came in I wanted to come straight away.

"It was a massive surprise for me and I was delighted to get that phone call.

"I've come here to score goals and do well for Luton. When I spoke to the gaffer he said that I would get a chance and that is all I want; to get a chance and to prove myself and score a few goals."

Having progressed through the youth ranks of his home-town team, moving clubs is a new experience for the six-foot forward but his new team-mates have helped him to settle in.

He added: "It was a bit daunting at first because I didn't know anyone at the club but the lads have

been great. I met them about an hour before kickoff and was introduced to everyone.

The arrival of the young striker would have seen a few Luton fans asking themselves, 'why do I know that name?' and casting their mind back to March would have provided them with the answer. Blinkhorn came off the bench to net twice for the Seasiders, the second, which would have been an 80th minute leveller, was controversially ruled out for offside and Luton held on for a 3-2 win.

As well as the impact he made on Luton fans that day he left an impression with Hatters boss Mike Newell during his time on the books at Bloomfield Road. Blinkhorn, a raw fifteen-year-old, was just breaking into the reserve side at the time that Newell was with the Seasiders.

"He was there as a kid and I liked the look of him," admitted Newell. "He came on and did well against us last season when he scored a couple of goals. One of which was knocked off but it looked a decent goal.

"We were just a bit surprised to find out he was available so we thought we would have a look at him.

"He's got something. He's got a footballing brain and he's an athlete."

JON BOWDEN

JON BOWDEN began work at Kenilworth Road this week as the club's senior physiotherapist. Having spent the majority of his career working in football he is no stranger to the sport.

Bowden served four clubs during his playing career before he swapped his boots for the magic sponge and he now finds himself back in the old routine after a couple of seasons out of the game.

He explained: "I've been working in a hospital for the last two years but before that I was at Doncaster Rovers for four years which was where I met Mike Newell, he came in while Ian Snodin was the manager there.

"Before that I was assistant physio at Oldham Athletic and prior to that I had played professional football for fourteen years.

"I started at Oldham as seventeen-year-old and I was there for about five years before I moved on to Port Vale. I had two years at Port Vale and then I moved to Wrexham where I was stayed for four seasons and in 1991 I went to Rochdale where I had another four years but then I had an Achilles problem.

"I had a couple of operations and I could have carried on but I had completed a physiotherapy diploma at Lilleshall while I was

playing and I got the chance to do a degree at Salford University through the PFA.

"I went back to Oldham in 1995 as an assistant physio when I finished my career, working under another lad there. I spent two years with them while Graeme Sharp was in charge and then when Ian Snodin left Oldham and got the job at Doncaster I went with him. I got on very well with Ian and he asked me if I would like to be physio there and that's where it went from.

"I did four years at Doncaster but then I got to the point where I had enough of football after twenty-one years, traveling the length and breath of the country and so I thought I would have a bit of time out and I got a job at the local hospital up in Stockport."

Jon though is pleased to be back in football and he is looking forward to life at Luton Town.



In recent weeks we have been involved in activities that have seen two local schools raise in excess of £1500.



THE summer is never a quiet time in football as the rebuilding for the new campaign starts immediately after the final ball is kicked from the previous season.

All 24 teams in this year's Coca-Cola League One division have been busy in the transfer market as we get set for another exciting ten months of football.

Not many clubs have splashed out the cash this season to bring in the names although Hull did pay Stockport £100,000 to acquire the services of talented striker Aaron Wilbraham.

The League One division will be graced with more ex-Premiership players this season after Brentford captured the signature of former Crystal Palace legend John Salako. The 35-year-old winger signed from Reading after making over 100 appearances in three years at the Madjeski Stadium.

Jason McAteer is another ex-Premiership star who will be gracing the scene at this level after Brian Little swooped to take him to Tranmere and bolster their bid for promotion.

Newly named and now near-neighbours Milton Keynes Dons will be hoping for a more successful season following their dismal time on and off their field last season but will have to do without the services of Jermaine Darlington who moved Watford.

Bradford have been hitting the national tabloids this season – for all the wrong reasons as their continuing financial problems looks as though it will be a long hard season for everyone at Valley Parade.

However the Yorkshire club have managed to strengthen their outfit to some degree by signing Everton duo Steven Schumacher and Michael Symes although Alan Combe has departed along with many others.

Sheffield Wednesday's rebuilding programme saw seven players released from the club during the summer including former Hatters favourite Paul McLaren who signed for Rotherham and veteran Kevin Pressman, the goalkeeper who made over 400 appearances at Hillsborough.

Another former Luton player who will not be returning to Kenilworth Road this season is Andrew Fotiadis after being released by Peterborough whilst today's opponents Oldham will have a few new faces on show including Rodney Jack after boss Brian Talbot raided his former club Rushden & Diamonds to bring the talented striker to Boundary Park.





EVACUATION PROCEDURE

IN THE event of any emergency in the stadium, Luton Town FC and the emergency services have agreed on an evacuation procedure which is designed to ensure the safe and controlled evacuation of the crowd, and to ensure their safe dispersal from the area, to allow the emergency services to carry out their tasks.

In the event of evacuation from all or part of the stadium, you will receive instructions over the public address system on how you should leave. In an evacuation of the main stand you will be instructed to use the pitch. Stewards will direct you to the nearest exit. It may be that your normal exit route will not be available. On leaving the stadium, you will find some roads closed to pedestrians, to enable swift and unobstructed access for the emergency services. Please leave the area of the ground as quickly as possible, by the route directed. Your co-operation will be most appreciated.

HOW TO GET TO SWINDON TOWN



By Road from London, South East and West: Exit M4 at junction 15. A419 to Commonhead Roundabout. Turn left to A4259 Marlborough Road. Take 2nd exit at roundabout into Queen's Drive. At Magic Roundabout take 3rd exit and stadium is on right.

By Road from the Midlands: M40 to junction 9. The A43,A34 & A420 and follow A420 into Swindon. At Drake's Roundabout turn right. 3rd exit at Magic Roundabout and stadium is on right.

By Rail: From the front of the station turn left onto Station Road. Facing the White House pub, head right onto Corporation Street. At the traffic lights turn left onto Manchester Road.
