

CHAIRMAN

WEWELCOME back to Luton, today's visitors AFC Bournemouth, their Directors, management, players and supporters for this Bank Holiday fixture. I would also like to welcome to today's game the Club's Life President, Mike Watson-Challis. We are delighted to have him closely associated with the club again.

As every one is aware, Mike retired in April last year; the events that followed are well documented and are now behind us. I have known Mike personally for many years going back when he was a director of the club in the Eighties. As a fan and past Chairman, I know he was very upset on the effect that period in the summer of 2003 had on the club.

He became one of several important investors after we took the club out of Administrative Receivership. His foresight in purchasing the 55 acres at Junction 10 to relocate the club to a new stadium enabled us, in conjunction with Stockwood Park Holdings - the land owner, and the appointment of a Developer, to turn that vision into a reality.

Over the last few months there has been a tremendous amount of work done towards creating the right development structure for the whole site that will enable the stadium to go ahead. There have been many meetings with the Council, its Leader, Planning Officers, Local Highways and the Highways Agency, with everyone's input and co-operation we are close to rationalising the planning require-


ments with the commercial layout and the stadium, that will enable a full detailed planning application to be submitted to the Council.

I write these notes following the postponement of our Carling Cup first round tie against Boston United, knowing that a home draw against Fulham goes to the eventual winners. Everyone was disappointed at the late decision to call off the game; no-one more so than the players and the manager. However, you had to be there to see the amount of rain that came down so quickly, yet just twenty miles away, clear blue sky.

Decisions to call off games are not taken lightly by referees and they do take account of the travelling supporters in their decision process. A delayed decision is often in the hope that conditions will change allowing the match to go ahead. When I met up with the referee he took the trouble to take me on the pitch, and that inspection certainly confirmed to me his decision was correct with several large areas completely covered in surface water, and even as we talked it started to rain again!



MANAGER - SEAN O'DRISCOLL

SEAN is now in his 21st year at AFC Bournemouth after initially joining on loan from Fulham in the 1983/84 season. He went on to become the Cherries record all time appearance maker, having his last outing in the 1994/95 season. Since then he has acted as physio, youth coach, first-team coach and then manager in 2000. It has certainly been an eventful time in management for Sean. In his first season, he led the side from the relegation zone to three minutes away from the play-offs. The disruptive 2001/02 season, where the side started using Dorchester Town as the home venue due to the new stadium being built ended in disappointment as the side were relegated. His managerial skills were used to the full though in the 2002/03 season as, despite losing many key players to injury and having a transfer embargo on him for much of the season, he led the team to promotion via the play-offs with a thrilling 5-2 win over Lincoln City at the Millennium Stadium and with little or no resources plus a long injury list again worked miracles last-term, just missing out on the play-offs

GOALKEEPERS

NEIL MOSS

Started his career at Bournemouth before moving to Southampton in 1996. He spent seven years with the Saints, also serving Gillingham on loan. His first-team chances were limited despite showing excellent form when used in the Premiership and he rejoined Bournemouth in September 2002 on loan. He then signed permanently for the club he supported as a boy and put in some excellent performances as the Cherries were successful in the play-offs. Ever present in the league last season Neil was named the Nationwide Division Two Player of the Month for February and was named the PFA Division Two Player of the Season as voted for by supporters.

GARETH STEWART

The former Blackburn trainee will be determined to put two years of injury anguish behind him this season. He signed for Bournemouth in 1999 and after Mark Ovendale left for Luton in 2000, he beat off competition to establish himself as the number one keeper. An injury before the 2002/03 season ruled him out and on his return, he broke his leg. Last season saw him regain his fitness to become a regular on the bench until he sustained a knee injury playing for the reserves, which put him out for the rest of the season. Gareth made a welcomed return to the side against Hamworthy in a friendly and has been on the bench for the opening games of the season.

DEFENDERS

WARREN CUMMINGS

Left-back Warren was first associated with Bournemouth in 2000 when he joined the club on loan from Chelsea. He has also been at West Bromwich Albion and Dundee United on loan before returning to Bournemouth in February 2003, again on loan. He made the move permanent and has become a vital part of the team. Warren has represented his native Scotland at Under-21 and full level.

KARL BROADHURST

Left-back Warren was first associated with Bournemouth in 2000 when he joined the club on loan from Chelsea. He has also been at West Bromwich Albion and Dundee United on Ioan before returning to Bournemouth February 2003, again on loan. He made the move permanent and has become a vital part of the team. Warren has represented his native Scotland at Under-21 and full level.



EDDIE HOWE

Eddie rejoined Bournemouth on a month's loan from Portsmouth, linking up with the squad in time to travel to Hull where he came on as a substitute. The central defender came through the ranks at Bournemouth and flourished as a player, winning England caps at Under-21 level. He was captain of the Bournemouth team and very popular when Portsmouth came in for him in March 2002. He only made two appearances for Pompey due to injury, but now fit, played the full 90 minutes against Walsall and Bristol City.

NEIL YOUNG

Long serving right-back who joined Bournemouth in 1994 from Tottenham and made his debut against Brentford at Dean Court that year. Neil has had to overcome serious injury to reclaim his place in the side and enjoyed a fine 2002/03 campaign despite breaking his ankle against Crewe in the FA Cup. Last season Neil sustained an injury in September that ruled him out for most of the season but returned to make his 300th league appearance in the second from last away game at Peterborough.

MIDFIELDERS

MARCUS BROWNING

Commanding midfielder who was surprisingly released by Gillingham at the end of the 2001/02 season and quickly snapped up by Bournemouth. He started his career at Bristol Rovers before making a big money move to Huddersfield and then Gillingham and has won international honours for Wales. A highly versatile player, Marcus filled in as goalkeeper twice in the 2002/03 season and in an 80 minute appearance against Hull, kept a clean sheet. Marcus was an inspirational member of the side last season, missing just one short spell through injury and is set to be a major part of the coming campaign again

IAMES COUTTS

Young player who has a very busy time last season. As well as playing for the championship winning Under-17 side, he was also in the Under-19 side, the reserves and joined the first-team squad and was on the bench on two occasions. His excellent progression has seen him join up with the first-team this season. A midfielder, he can also play up front and is renowned for his terrific work rate.

GARRETH O'CONNOR

Dublin-born midfielder who signed from Bohemians in 2000 and although it took a while for him to establish himself as a first-team regular, is now one of the most influential players on the pitch. A very skilful midfielder capable of splitting defences with incisive passes. His finest moment for the club undoubtedly came at the Millennium Stadium when he scored for the side in the 5-2 win over Lincoln in the play-off final. Sustained a knee injury in the final friendly at Oxford and miss the opening few games of the season.

CARL FLETCHER


The former Cherries youth player is the team captain and each season he has progressed and blossomed into a true leader of the side. He came through the youth team as a midfielder, but injuries meant he had to fill a central defensive role in the 2002/03 season, capping a great year with a clean sweep of the club awards and two goals at the Millennium Stadium against Lincoln in the play-off final. Last season again saw him enjoy a tremendous season that saw him win three full caps for Wales and he has been picked again for the squad to face Latvia.

DANI RODRIGUES

Dani linked up with the Cherries at the start of pre-season, initially on trial, but has since signed a one-year contract. He first joined Bournemouth in 1998 from Portuguese side Farense, making seven substitute appearances before moving to Southampton. He was loaned to Bristol City where he suffered a terrible broken leg and on his return to fitness, suffered a similar injury. After a spell in Greece, he joined Yeovil on loan at the end of last season where he was a great success and Cherries supporters will be looking forward to seeing a player who made himself very popular in the short-time he was with the club six years ago.

BRIAN STOCK

Winchester-born midfielder who came through



making his firstteam whilst still a youth player. Brian has been capped by Wales at Under-21 level and holds the distinction player to score at the new Bournemouth stadium. Brian had a hernia operation in the summer and missed the opening friendlies at Weymouth and Hamworthy, but returned to fitness to cliam a first-team place at the start of the season.

STRIKERS

ALAN CONNELL

Young striker who was signed from Ipswich in the summer of 2002 and made a sensational start to his Bournemouth career with seven goals in 14

appearances before sustaining a serious knee injury in October 2002. That ruled him out for the rest of the season and last term, it was troublesome again, but he has returned to pre-season training fit and ready and looking to rediscover the form that at the time made him the country's leading teenage goalscorer.

STEVE FLETCHER

Big Fletch joined Bournemouth back in 1992 from Hartlepool. He was rewarded for his loyalty to the club with a testimonial against Portsmouth in 2003. The very popular striker is also club captain with over 400 appearances to his name and is renowned for being one of the best target men in the lower divisions. He would have made a lot more appearances but for a series of injuries, the last one keeping him out for 17 months, but he capped his comeback with the superb opening at Dean Court, goal in the play-off final. He enjoyed a great 2003/04 season until a knee injury ruled him out debut of the end of the season, the injury is still causing concern and he recently had a minor operation to try and sort out the problem.

JAMES HAYTER

Long serving player who made his debut for the club in 1996 whilst still a YTS. A regular on the scoresheet, James has proved to be a very imporbeing the first tant member of the squad and never one to do anything by halves. In 2001, he netted four goals in one game away at Bury and then last season, he claimed the British record for the fastest hattrick. James opened the Cherries goalscoring account this season with a strike against Walsall and continued his good form with a goal against

Tall striker who signed from Ross County in 2001. Formerly with Hearts, Derek shows great ability in front of goal and has a good strike ratio. 


We are expecting a similar match this afternoon and we go into the game full of confidence.

HATTERS

AFTER relegation from Division One in 1996, the close season was expected to feature a major clear-out of playing staff which never materialised. Scott Oakes was transferred to Sheffield Wednesday and the unlucky Vidar Riseth moved to Linz but after a lot of false starts on the incoming side, only one player, Paul Showler, actually signed on the dotted line.

After a mixed bag of pre-season results, which included a 4-2 win over a full-strength West Ham in Julian James' testimonial and a 4-1 defeat at Stirling it was back to third grade football for the first time since 1970.

If Luton supporters thought that a quick promotion was their right then they were soon rudely awakened with the first three games all ending in defeat. The first visitors to Kenilworth Road, Burnley, not only won but had the cheek to allow ex-Hatters Steve Thompson and Kurt Nogan to score the goals.

Worse was to follow as, with ten minutes left at Brentford in the next game and the Town 2-1 up, the match was turned on its head with the Bees finishing 3-2 victors. After an awful 5-0 defeat at Bristol City manager Lennie Lawrence issued a

public apology and from then on matters slowly improved, starting with a narrow I-0 win over eventual strugglers Rotherham.

Next up was a first ever visit to Wycombe and another I-0 victory followed by a home win over a tough Gillingham side. Fans could now see a light at the end of the tunnel, as the players finally came to terms with their new level of football, and although the next match was lost the team went on a run of six games without defeat leading up to the first league visit of Bournemouth to these parts since the days of Malcolm Macdonald.

For the first time in the campaign there was the chance to push up into the top six and an expectant crowd of 6,086 turned up to see the Cherries line-up with a defensive formation and try as they might the Hatters were thwarted at every turn and could not force the breakthrough.

Bournemouth though, had a gilt-edged chance just before the interval when a quick break out of defence caught the Town napping and a flick-on from Steve Fletcher presented Matt Holland with a scoring opportunity which was somehow blocked by lan Feuer. The rebound found a certain Steve Robinson who chipped goalwards but the big Luton goalkeeper uncoiled and launched himself skywards and managed to tip the ball over the bar.

The threat of a scoreless draw was growing when Tony Thorpe, picking up a throw-in, advanced along the by-line where he was tripped by Owen Coll. 





Prior to the game Andy Rennie in 1928/29, Jack Ball (1934/35), Joe Payne (1936/37) and Jessie Pye (1952/53) all scored in seven consecutive Luton games and are joint owners of the club record however Howard's rich vein of form has seen him hit the target in his last eight appearances.

If I get a goal then it's a bonus but really you just want to play well, that is all you think about.

"At the start of the season I only set myself one target – it's been the same every year I've been a professional - and that is to score as many goals as I can.





LUTON TOWN BELLES

AFTER a hectic close season which saw the Belles sign a number of new players to create a second senior squad the pre-season football finally got under way when Town visited Hitchin Town.

Both teams had virtually their strongest line-ups available but Luton were out of the blocks quickly and scored after just three minutes when Rhiannon Morgan volleyed in Kaylee Owen's cross to make it 1-0. Minutes later Michelle Byrne left her marker trailing before finishing with a neat chip over the diving keeper. Town were really flying and playing some superb flowing football and it was not long before Michelle Byrne lifted her shot over the Hitchin 'keeper from 20-yards for the third. Luton kept the pressure up and Rhiannon Morgan finished with a low placed shot to make it 4-0 after just 25 minutes from debutant Aimee Barrable's cross. Hitchin pulled a goal back just before the interval with an excellent free-kick from wide on the left and both sides made changes for the second half.

Hitchin came out fighting early on but they were held at bay until midway through the half when Michelle Byrne sent in a cross for Kaylee Owen to crash home from six yards. The final goal was scored by another debutant as Shelley Miller headed home a corner at the near post to round off an excellent 6-1 win.

Both squads then visited West London based Viking and Town were again in unstoppable form early on, going 3-0 up in just 10 minutes with goals from Sam Mather, Rhiannon Morgan and Rebecca Kane. Kaylee Owen added the fourth with an individual effort but Luton again conceded just before half-time after some sloppy defending. Sam Mather added her second with a thumping 20-yard free kick which flew into the top corner after 55 minutes and Michelle Byrne topped off another 6-1 win with a break from the half-way line finishing cooly past the keeper. The Reserves then took on their counterparts and goals from Shelley Miller, Micky Taylor and a brace from Janine Daly gave them an excellent 4-0 win.

The toughest match to date was the visit to London Premier side, a young Belles side were quickly into their stride with some superb passing football and it was no surprise as they took the lead hen Fay Howell cut inside past three defenders and shot low past the keeper to make it 1-0. Two minutes later another quick passing move gave Kim Hide the opportunity to fire a shot in from 25 yards which the home keeper found too hot to hold and Michelle Byrne reacted quickest to the rebound to score from close in. After an hour Rebecca Kane added the third and the Town were comfortable until the match went into the final 15 minutes when Hendon managed their first two serious efforts on goal, the first of which was a dubious penalty and the match finished as a 3-2 win to Luton.



Please leave the area of the ground as quickly as possible, by the route directed. Your co-operation will be most appreciated.

TRAVEL

HOW TO GET TO SHEFFIELD WEDNESDAY



Hillsborough is situated three miles north of the city centre, but visitors are advised to avoid this route and approach the ground from the north instead. Parking is possible in the area just north of Hillsborough.

By Car: From The North/South/East: Exit the M1 at junction 36 and follow the A61 towards Sheffield. Continue along the road for approximately 4 miles until the 2nd roundabout. Take the 3rd exit (Leppings Lane) - the ground is situated on the left-hand side.

From the West: Take the A57 for Sheffield. As you approach the city the road splits in two - take the left fork onto the Rivelin Valley Road (A6101). Continue for approximately 3.75 miles, turn left (onto one way system) and follow the road round to the right onto Holme Lane. This road then becomes Bradfield Road. At the junction with the A61 Penistone Road, turn left towards Barnsley. Hillsborough Stadium is on the left-hand side after Hillsborough Park.

By Train: Sheffield Railway Station (Contact Midland Mainline on 0845 712 5678) is situated in the town centre, 3 miles from the ground.

By Supertram: Take the South Yorkshire Supertram (signpost-

ed from the Railway Station) towards Middlewood Road (yellow route). Exit at the Leppings Lane stop, which is a short walk from the ground.

By Bus: From the Railway Station, Flat Street Bus Terminus is a one-minute walk - cross over at the pedestrian crossing, and follow the signs. Bus numbers 53, 77 and 80 all run from Flat Street to Hillsborough. On matchdays bus run roughly every 15 minutes.

From Angel Street, buses 74 and 74a run to Hillsborough.

From Snig Hill, buses 85 and 86 run to Leppings Lane.

From the Sheffield Transport Interchange, bus 57 runs past the ground towards Stocksbridge.

By Coach with Town on Tour: Leaving Maple Road at 10:30am (the coach will make a stop at Milton Keynes Coachway about 30 minutes later). The fare for LTSC members is £15, £13 for junior and senior members and £17 for non-members. To book seats visit the supporters kiosk at the top of Kenilworth Road or phone the Town on Tour mobile 07960 567465. You can also book online by visiting the Fans section of www.lutontown.co.uk

By Coach with Bobbers Travel: Departs from Cranfield at 9.30am and Luton at 10.30am. Costs are £13.50 for Adults and £11 for Under-16's and OAP's. Please ring 01234 750996 for further information and to book your place.
