Mick's note sparks win

A FINAL message from former Hatters Director of Football Mick Harford sparked Luton's biggest win of the season against struggling Wrexham.

Harford, 45, joined up with ex-Town boss Joe Kinnear as assistant manager of Nottingham Forest after leaving

Kenilworth Road on Friday. But he had one last note to act as inspiration to Hatters' shocked squad of play-

ers before Saturday's home game. Written on a flip chart in the home dressing room were the words: "I believe this dressing room is full of champions go and do it. All the best, Mick Harford."

And the gesture clearly had some effect as Luton followed the previous week's super 4-0 win over Bradford by netting through Steve Robinson, Stephen O'Leary, Steve Howard, Ahmet Brkovic and a first ever goal in professional football for full-back Sol Davis.

Harford, who began work at Forest on Monday, yesterday delivered a bunch of flowers to the staff at Luton as a show of appreciation for his time at the club.

But Town boss Mike Newell is concentrating on the future rather than the past.

He said: "We will miss Mick and miss having him around the place, but there's no point in dwelling on it.

"He's made a decision and we wish him all the luck in the world - we just have to get on with it now. He made a massive contribution to what we've done, but it's about the players and I believe we've got a good side here."

On a replacement, Newell added: "I haven't even given it a thought to be honest. We will take our time, but at this

moment I haven't even looked at that." While Luton's players were left surprised by the speed of Harford's departure last week, they didn't let it affect their form on the field as the Town took apart a shambolic Wrexham side.

The Dragons face a winding up order on November 17 due to a £900,000 unpaid Inland Revenue bill. But they have problems on the field as well as off the pitch.

Hatters kept faith with the same team that beat the Bantams, but Slovenian goalkeeper Dino Seremet replaced Rob Beckwith on the bench after injury.

After former Spurs striker Chris Arm- & strong had somehow contrived to miss an open goal in the eighth minute, Town took the lead five minutes later when Howard nodded back Kevin Foley's cross and Robinson headed in from 10 yards.

Davis' memorable moment came when he latched on to Brkovic's cheeky 17th minute chip and fired past Matt Baker, in for injured ex-Luton Andy Dibble in goal.

Stephen O'Leary hit his first of the season in the 22nd minute firing home Rowan Vine's centre and Howard got his eighth of the campaign by heading in another Foley centre before the break.

Dennis Lawrence hit the post for Wrexham after the interval before Brkovic nodded his eighth of the season after Paul Underwood's header was parried.

Substitute Hector Sam hit the Dragons' consolation with 17 minutes to go.
