



HELLO and welcome to Kenilworth Road for today's game against Sheffield Wednesday. Welcome also to Paul Sturrock, his staff, players, directors and supporters from Hillsborough.

Paul's appointment has seen an upturn in their form and they arrive here on the back of some good results so we can expect a tough test.

The win at Chesterfield on Boxing Day was a big one. The players showed great character and the lads who came in for those suspended performed admirably. We were the first team to win at Saltergate this season and I don't believe there will be many others to follow.

I was therefore not too disappointed when we drew against Colchester on Tuesday. It is always a point gained in my eyes and the fact that they hadn't played on Boxing Day and were fresh for the game meant it was always going to be difficult.

MANAGER

PAUL STURROCK



FORMER Dundee United player Paul Sturrock - who made over 600 appearances for his one and only club - took over the hot seat at Hillsborough in September 2004 following his departure from P r e m i e r s h i p Southampton.

The 48-year-old joined the Saints at the tail end of last season, succeeding Gordon Strachan, after steering Plymouth Argyle towards their second promotion in three seasons. The Third Division title from 2001/02 was followed by a respectable season in Division Two that saw them narrowly miss out on a play-off berth. By Christmas of the following year, Sturrock had taken the Pilgrims to the top of the table, where they kept up with the pace for three months before he left to join the Saints.

Having began his managerial career north of the border he arrived in England, via a spell at St Johnstone where his success in his first job led to him taking over at Dundee United in 1998. Two seasons into his time at Tannadice he made his switch to the South Coast of England and instant success with the Home Park outfit.

GOALKEEPERS

DAVID LUCAS

David made a permanent switch to Hillsborough in May 2004 having impressed during two loan spells with Wednesday in 2003/04. The stopper was a consistent figure between the sticks while on loan to the Owls, prompting Chris Turner to move quickly to snap him up from Preston North End soon after the close of 2003/04. Lucas made exactly 150 appearances for the Lilywhites - his hometown club - and also had Ioan stints at Darlington and Scunthorpe United early in his career. A former England youth international, the 26-year-old is an accomplished shot-shopper who excels in one-on-one situations. He marshalls his area in confident fashion. handles cross expertly and his 6'2" frame makes him an imposing figure between the sticks.

OLA TIDMAN

Ola became an Owl in July 2003 after joining on a free transfer from Stockport County. His first season at Hillsborough was disrupted by injuries as the Swede firstly suffered a knee problem in September before fracturing a hand on his return to training, although he returned to first team duty later in the campaign. Tidman made an impact with his first English club Stockport after signing for the Hatters from Belgian outfit RAA La Louvière in January 2003 - despite making only 18 appearances for County. The 25-year-old has also played for Malmö FF and BK Kick in his homeland and KAA Gent of Belgium, in addition to representing his country at Under-21 level.

DEFENDERS

LEE BULLEN

Lee joined the Owls on a free transfer from Dunfermline Athletic in July 2004. A versatile performer capable of adapting comfortably to a number of positions, the Scot was recruited to fill the right back slot at Hillsborough. He is an athletic player who brings years of experience to the SWFC cause. Bullen started his professional career at Meadowbank Thistle before going on to ply his trade in the Australian, Hong Kong and Greek leagues. He was a popular figure in his time at Dunfermline, scoring 24 goals

in 151 Pars' games and also figuring in their 2003/04 Scottish Cup final meeting with Celtic.

PATRICK COLLINS



Patrick signed a twoyear deal at Hillsborough in July 2004 after impressing during a trial spell at S6 towards the end of the 2003-04 campaign. The towering defender was previously on the books at Sunderland before his move to SWFC. He represented England

15 times at youth level, scoring for the under-17 team on his first outing against Portugal – in which he was deployed to mark Manchester United star Cristiano Ronaldo. Collins is a solid centre back who takes a 'no risks' approach, concentrating on his defensive duties and organising the backline.

PAUL HECKINGBOTTOM

Paul was recruited on a free transfer from Bradford City in May 2004, soon after collecting the Bantams' Player of the Year award for 2003-04. He started out as a trainee at Manchester United before moving on to Sunderland, making his league bow during a loan spell with Scarborough in 1997. The Barnsley product also had temporary spells at Hartlepool and Darlington, joining the latter on a permanent basis in 1999. He moved on to Norwich in 2002, joining Bradford after a season at Carrow Road. Heckingbottom brings strong tackling ability to the left back spot, also contributing to the attack with forceful bursts into opposition territory. He is powerful in the air and brings great composure to the cause.

RICHARD WOOD

Richard broke into the Wednesday first team towards the end of 2002/03 and marked his arrival with a bang, scoring on his full debut at Burnley. The youngster made such an impression on Chris Turner that the Owls boss handed him a two-year deal before he had completed the second year of his Academy scholarship.



SHEFFIELD WEDNESDAY

Wood's performances in the Reserves had marked him out as a prospect for the future. After breaking into the second string side in his first scholarship year, he became a solid presence with his steadying influence and polished man marking ability. The Ossett product is a tall, commanding figure whose height is an asset in both boxes. He has shown his versatility by switching from his natural position of centre half into the full back positions when required to do so, adding 17 more games to his tally during 2003/04.

MIDFIELDERS

CHRIS BRUNT

Chris got his Owls career off to a stunning start, netting with a superb 25-yard free-kick just seven minutes into his full debut against Brighton. The midfielder joined Wednesday from Middlesbrough in March 2004 and quickly earned himself a first team spot after settling into the side. The Ulsterman moved to Hillsborough after almost three years in Middlesbrough's academy, having also been on Glasgow Rangers' books as a schoolboy. Able to operate either in the centre of the park or as a wideman on the left flank, Brunt caught the eye with his lethal left foot. He forged himself a reputation as a major threat when taking aim from distance and also has a wide range of pinpoint passing in his armoury.

CHRIS MARSDEN

Chris became an Owl in June 2004 when he completed his switch from South Korean outfit Busan Icons. The midfielder brings 17 years' of experience in the professional game to the Wednesday cause, in which time he has amassed over 500 appearances.



The Sheffielder and lifelong Wednesdayite was swiftly installed as club captain on his arrival, with Chris Turner keen to make full use of his guile and motivating skills. His no-nonsense approach makes him a natural leader and he brings non-stop running and

pinpoint passing ability to the team. Marsden began his career across Sheffield at Bramall Lane before joining Huddersfield, where he clocked up 155 outings. He went on to represent Wolves, Notts County and Stockport before joining Birmingham in 1997. Southampton paid £800,000 for his services in 1999 and he racked up 152 appearances, captaining Saints in the 2003 F.A. Cup final, before joining Busan.

ION-PAUL McGOVERN

Wednesday recruited Jon-Paul in May 2004 on a free transfer from Scottish outfit Livingston. The wideman was signed up to bring his brand of creativity and craft to the right flank, where he operates as an old-style winger who likes to use his skill and trickery to deliver crosses into the danger zone. McGovern began his career with his hometown club Glasgow Celtic and was first introduced to the Steel City during a loan spell with SWFC's cross-city rivals United in 2002/03, before joining Livingston in the summer of 2003.

LEWIS McMAHON

Lewis' impressive form towards the end of the 2003/04 campaign secured the offer of a one-year contract from Chris Turner. The Doncaster



lad had progressed in the SWFC reserve and under-19 sides over the previous two and a half years since joining the Wednesday Academy as a scholar in the summer of 2001. A dangerous player in and around the box, McMahon has the abili-

ty both to create and convert chances. He possesses fine dribbling skills and good control, in addition to sharp finishing ability. First linked up with Wednesday as a 14-year-old before joining the Academy on a full-time basis.

GLENN WHELAN

Glenn crossed the Pennines to Hillsborough from Manchester City in July 2004, joining the Owls on a free transfer. A creative player, he operates in the centre of midfield where his pinpoint passing ability can be used to maximum effect. The Dubliner developed in the City youth ranks prior to turning professional with the Blues, making his senior debut in UEFA Cup action before a loan stint at Bury. Whelan has also represented the Republic of Ireland at under-21 level and arrived at Hillsborough looking to establish a regular place in Wednesday's starting eleven.

STRIKERS

STEVEN MacLEAN

Wednesday beat off competition from a number of clubs to secure Steven's services in July 2004. He moved south from Glasgow Rangers for an undisclosed fee after a highly successful loan spell with Scunthorpe United in 2003/04. The Scot fired 25 goals for the Iron to top the Division Three scoring charts during his year at Glanford Park. The Edinburgh product came through the ranks at Rangers before appearing in their first team and has represented Scotland at under-21 level. He is a frontman who is adept at getting on the end of chances in and around the penalty area and can also link up play between midfield and the forward line.

GUYLAIN NDUMBU-NSUNGU

Guylain was a virtual unknown when he joined the Owls in September 2003 on a year-long loan deal from French outfit Amiens. However he walked away with the Player of the Year award in his first season after making a huge impact in the second half of the term, in which he topped the Wednesday scoring charts. The skilful forward, christened 'Sungu' by his teammates, hails from Kinshasa in the Democratic Republic of Congo but moved to France at the age of seven. Ndumbu's form for the Owls led him to be linked with other clubs and Chris Turner moved quickly to avoid losing his services by signing him up on a permanent deal. That ensured Wednesdayites would see much more of the trickery which makes him a headache for opposing defenders.

LEE PEACOCK



Lee put pen to paper on a two-year contract at Hillsborough in July 2004, joining on a free transfer from Bristol City. He contributed between 15 and 17 goals for the Robins in each of the last four seasons, also helping create goals for his fellow strikers.

The Scot's 6'2" frame makes him a major aerial threat whilst his strength allows him to hold the ball up in attack. Peacock started his career with Carlisle United, moving on to Mansfield in 1997 before joining Manchester City two years later.

ADAM PROUDLOCK

Adam joined Wednesday from Wolverhampton Wanderers for an undisclosed fee in September 2003. Owls fans were already well aware of his abilities after he spent a month on loan at Hillsborough during the 2002/03 campaign, before helping Wolves reach the Premiership. The striker is a powerful performer whose strength causes problems for defenders, along with his quicksilver pace. Capable of clever link play around the box and razor sharp finishing, he turned professional with Wolves after developing under Chris Turner's guidance in the Molineux youth system.

HATTERS

THE HATTERS opened the 1980/81 season in style when winning 2-1 at the home of the F.A.Cup holders, and eventual champions, West Ham. They followed this up with a rather fortunate win over local rivals Watford before going into freefall

Only one win was recorded over the next eleven games as the Town plummeted down the table with manager David Pleat tearing his hair out trying to fathom out why his previous season's promotion chasers could put in such limp displays.

As so often happens, a season can turn on a single game and the Town's 3-I win at Cambridge at the end of October was a case in point. With the substitute already used, goalkeeper Jake Findlay was carried off with broken ribs leaving defender Mal Donaghy to take over. Donaghy managed to keep his goal intact and the icing on the cake came with Brian Stein's last minute clincher.

Next up were high flying Sheffield Wednesday in a game to be televised by 'Match of the Day'. Wednesday, who had won promotion at the end of the previous campaign, had not lost for five games and were on the crest of a wave, came to Kenilworth Road with 4,000 supporters but disappointingly set out their stall from the opening

whistle by pulling everyone back behind the ball apart from Ione striker Andy McCulloch.

The system seemed to be working and Wednesday were in no mood to change the formula especially when the referee refused to award the Hatters a cast iron penalty after Mike Pickering brought down Stein in the area.

The deserved breakthrough eventually came shortly after the interval. Pickering, mindful of the words of manager Jack Charlton that the Owls were picking up too many bookings, stopped to apologise to Steve White after fouling him and found himself out of position for the quick free-kick.


Ricky Hill was set free by the quick thinking Mark Aizlewood and was then hacked down in the area by Malcolm Smith leaving David Moss to stroke home the resulting spot-kick.


Wednesday were now forced to come out of their shell which left space for the Town to exploit with their new found confidence. In the 68th minute Tony Grealish and Hill worked the ball through midfield, Stein sold the defence a dummy by letting the ball run and Moss neatly chipped the goalkeeper.

If that was a contender for the BBC's 'Goal of the Month' prize then the Town's third goal was even better. In an end-to-end move started by full-back Kirk Stephens the ball was switched to Hill who made ground before passing to Stein and his early cross over the top of the Wednesday defence put in White whose finish was exquisite.

Goalkeeper Alan Judge, making only his second league appearance, made a superb reflex save to a late Mel Sterland header preserving the Town's first clean sheet in six matches and capping off a memorable afternoon.

CAPTAIN

JUST as we did earlier in the season we have responded to a defeat - against Brentford at the start of December - with a good run of results.

We followed the victories over Bristol City and Port Vale up with a great win at Chesterfield on Boxing Day. We left our families on Christmas Day, which is something we are used to as footballers and we travelled to the hotel. 

On leaving the stadium, you will find some roads closed to pedestrians, to enable swift and unobstructed access for the emergency services. Please leave the area of the ground as quickly as possible, by the route directed. Your co-operation will be most appreciated.

HOW TO GET TO PETERBOROUGH



By Road: Peterborough is one of the easiest grounds to reach by car, and there is ample parking alongside the London Road stadium. The best route is up the AI, reached by leaving Luton on the A505 east, through Hitchin and then to Baldock to take the AI north. A couple of miles beyond Norman Cross junction turn off right on the A1139, which is signposted to Peterborough. This road becomes the Fletton Parkway, which you leave at junction 3 to follow signs towards the city centre. Follow those signs until you run onto the Nene Parkway, and then follow the signs towards Woodston Industry until you find yourself in Shrewsbury Avenue. At the next T-junction turn right onto Oundle Road, and at the next roundabout turn right into London Road and the ground is on your left.

From Railway Station: It is about a three-quarters of a mile walk on foot. Turn right out of station and into the long-stay car park. Go under the Railway Bridge and walk up the path or steps to main road. Turn right, passing the Evening Telegraph on the left-hand side and then Asda to the right. Turn right into pedestrian shopping area (Bridge Street) and straight on over River Bridge and mini roundabout. The ground is on left hand side.

Parking: There is parking at the ground but it does get full quite quickly. The price is £4 for cars and £10 for coaches. The police advise that visiting fans park in the Fair Meadow car park on Oundle Road. The entrance is easy to spot, right next to the Cherry Tree pub. It's run by the council and costs £1.50. Street parking is also available.

Around The Ground: The mobile burger stall on the corner of the ground's car park is still popular before and after a game. Outside the ground on London Road, is a row of fast food favourites with Papa Luigi Dial a Pizza popular with supporters. Established in Peterborough in 1983, be sure to pop in on matchdays and take advantage of a pizza slice and fries. Otherwise, these succulent freshly baked pizza's are available on takeaway at half price. Also on London Road is KFC and Turkish Delight which both offer good food and reasonable prices.

By Coach with Town on Tour: Leaving Maple Road at 12pm (the coach will make a stop at Milton Keynes Coachway about 30 minutes later). The fare for LTSC members is £11, £9 for junior and senior members and £13 for non-members. To book seats visit the supporters kiosk at the top of Kenilworth Road or phone the Town on Tour mobile 07960 567465. You can also book online by visiting the Fans section of www.lutontown.co.uk.

By Coach with Bobbers Travel: Departs from Cranfield at 11am and Luton at 12pm. Costs are £10 for Adults and £8.50 for Under-16's and OAP's. Please ring 01234 750996 for further information and to book your place or visit the supporters kiosk between 1.30pm and 2.45pm on a home matchday.

CUP football makes a long awaited return to Kenilworth Road as Brentford provide our next opponents in the third round of the F.A. Cup.

This fixture represents only Luton's fourth cup match at Kenilworth Road out of their previous fourteen and gives Mike Newell's men an early opportunity to avenge their 2-0 defeat to the Londoners at the start of December.

Brentford have already played four matches to make it to this stage of the competition following replays in rounds one and two. The Bees scrapped through in a penalty shoot-out in the first round after back-to-back I-I draws with fellow League One side Bristol City.

Having drawn a seemingly more comfortable tie away against non-leaguers Hinckley United in the round two, Brentford still needed a second crack of the whip and ran out 3-1 winners in the replay at Griffin Park.

The Bees, who made an impressive start tó their league campaign this season, have suffered on their travels this year and it wasn't until late September, with a victory over Walsall, that Martin Allen's side claimed their first win away from Griffin Park.

A recent victory over Sheffield Wednesday is their only other success away from home this season and in League One action, Brentford have managed only eight goals on their travels all season. Deon Burton leads the way for Brentford as the leading scorer with six goals this season including the opener in that victory over the Hatters.

The strength in depth of Brentford's squad has given many Bees fans hope that this season a serious challenge for promotion might be achievable

and the arrival of former Crystal Palace winger John Salako and midfielder Jamie Lawrance has added experience to the side.


One player who will be making a return to Kenilworth Road is striker Steve Claridge. At the age of 38, the former Luton striker moved to Brighton earlier in the season after playing part-time for non-leaguers Weymouth. Allen moved in mid-December to add further experience to his squad and brought Claridge to Griffin Park - making the Bees the 14th different club of his professional career.

In recent years, Brentford have the edge in meetings between the two sides. Last season's 4-I home victory, in which Enoch Showunmi bagged a hat-trick, was only our second win over our London counterparts from the previous eight encounters. This will be the fourth time the two sides have met in the F.A. Cup with Luton taking the honours in 1952 during a fourth round match after the two previous clashes had ended all-square.
