"We didn't start well, but still found ourselves 2-0 up, and that tells you a lot about our team.

The game also signalled a return to Bedfordshire for Robins assistant boss Mick Harford, who left the Hatters for Nottingham Forest in November last year, before joining up with Andy King at Swindon three weeks ago.

Swindon started much the better, but fell behind after 13 minutes when the otherwise impressive Matthew Heywood went in late on Brkovic in an aerial challenge inside the box, and Nicholls slotted home his 11th of the season from the spot.

Luton grabbed the second after 26 minutes when Paul Underwood teed up Sol Davis for a 20-yard drive that deflected into the path of Brkovic, who slipped home past Rhys Evans from close in.

The Robins got the goal their possession deserved after 34 minutes when Grant Smith's dangerous inswinging corner was touched home by Proctor at the near post.

The second period saw Nicholls fire a free kick just wide and Underwood hit the bar, but it was Swindon who dominated without creating clear chances.

The result was put beyond doubt six minutes from time when Evans fumbled Nicholls's deep cross and Holmes walked the ball into the empty net.
