HATTERS 1 BLACKPOOL 0

IT MAY not have been pretty, but Town fans will settle for five more displays like this if they bring five more Luton wins between now and the end of the season.

Steve Howard's 21st goal of the season – a thumping 15 minute header from Peter Holmes' corner - looked to have given Hatters the platform to wash the Seasiders aside at Kenilworth Road.

But despite a bright opening half-anhour, Luton ultimately failed to make Blackpool rock and in the end it was the visitors who mounted their own waves of attack after the break as Town hung on.

Supporters were left biting their nails as Luton struggled to find their usual fluency in the second period and boss Mike Newell admitted: "There was nervousness in the crowd and I think that spread to the players. I sensed it at Torquay when we went a goal down there, but I think it's only to be expected at this stage.

"I don't mind a bit of nervousness as it can get players going, but at the end of the day it's all about getting over the finishing line, not trying to impress people.

"If people want to be impressed they should just look at what we've done here all season already."

Hatters fielded the same starting 11 that beat the Gulls 4-1 on Easter Monday while Chris Coyne returned to the bench after serving his one match suspension for his red card against Barnsley and new signing Warren Feeney also took his place among the substitutes.

Luton had put in a dynamic attacking display against Torquay just five days before the visit of Blackpool and it looked like they were set to continue in the same vein against the Seasiders.

Howard and Holmes both twice went close before Holmes' corner saw Howard

send a bullet header flying past visiting keeper Lee Jones from six yards.

Kevin Foley had a cross-shot saved and Howard then headed over and had an effort blocked as Luton continued to press. But Blackpool finally settled and threatened when John Murphy was put off by a flick from teammate Rob Edwards when presented with a clear header in front of goal in the 35th minute.

That set up the visitors for a much improved second-half show and things could have been very different for Luton if Sol Davis had seen red for hauling back Keigan Parker after half-time, when all 4 he received was a yellow card.

Instead Luton hung on thanks to some wayward shooting from Blackpool - the closest they came was a Parker shot that flashed wide in the 63rd minute after a neat pass from Martin Bullock.

The sluggish show from Luton prompted Newell to bring on Feeney for Rowan Vine and Enoch Showunmi for Paul Underwood and the two substitutes combined in the 83rd minute when Showunmi hit a 40-yard pass into the path of Feeney who shot past the post.


