Steve's 21st goal of season boosts Hatters' chances

LUTON edged closer to the League One title with three valuable points against plucky Blackpool, although they were far from convincing in a nervy second half showing.

Steve Howard powered the table-toppers ahead in the 15th minute with his 21st goal for the season as Hatters looked set to wash The Seasiders aside.

But after a strong first half showing failed to yield further goals, Luton got the jitters after the break as Blackpool set about upsetting the home side's promotion plans.

In the end, wasteful finishing from the visitors allowed Hatters to collect a vital win with just five games remaining.

And boss Mike Newell admitted: "We weren't at out best at all, but the result was the important thing.

"You will get games like that over a season where you just have to grind out a result.

"It's not about impressing people now, it's about getting ourselves over the finishing

"If people want to be impressed by us they should look at what we have done already this season.

"We're getting close to promotion now and if Tranmere are going to catch us they are going to have to win all six of their remaining games which is a big ask, to be honest."


Bathed in Bedfordshire sunshine, Luton started the better with Peter Holmes and Howard going close with early headers before they made the breakthrough after a quarter of an hour.

From Holmes' corner on the left, Howard rose higher than everyone to send a trademark bullet header flying past the helpless Lee Jones.

Town looked to build on the early goal, but after Howard twice went close again, Blackpool forced their way back into the game and almost equalised when John Murphy headed Keigan Parker's corner
