## Enoch shows 10-man Luton the way ahead

LUTON survived a first-half red card for central defender Russell Perrett to take a giant stride towards automatic promotion to the Championship.

Substitute Enoch Showunmi's late closerange winner spared Perrett's blushes, kept the League One leaders clear of the pack and if Tranmere fail to win at Brentford on Tuesday, they can start their celebrations.

'I'm not bothered how we go up,' said Luton boss Mike Newell, whose side can still book promotion by beating neighbours MK Dons on Saturday should Tranmere triumph at Griffin Park.

'I'll be at Brentford anyway because we've got them coming up in the next few weeks, but I'll take a helping hand.'

This upbeat scenario seemed rather unlikely when Luton were reduced to 10 men

after 23 minutes.

In-form Bournemouth, themselves right in the thick of the play-off chase, began more brightly and Luton keeper Marlon Beresford kept his side in the game with excellent saves from John Spicer and the dangerous Wade Elliott.

And Bournemouth were then given a huge boost when referee Trevor Parkes sent off Perrett.


The Luton centre-back — who was born near Bournemouth and almost joined the club as a youngster — brought down the sprinting James Hayter just outside the area and referee Parkes correctly brandished a straight red card for the professional foul.

Just 60 seconds before his dismissal, Perrett had cleared Elliott's goal-bound shot off the line.

Bournemouth immediately tried to capitalise on their numerical advantage, but Beresford continued to be in inspired form and blocked a 10-yard shot from Garreth O'Connor before tipping wide a 35-yard strike from wingback Stephen Purches.

At the other end, Steve Howard nearly gave the visitors a lead against the run of play just before half-time but his clever volley was well saved by Bournemouth keeper

Neil Moss. Luton were much more competitive in the second half despite play-

Bournemouth poured forward. Spicer shot wide and O'Connor saw a long-range drive saved at the second attempt by Beresford.

Despite the defeat Bournemouth remain in the top six, although Brentford could have a bearing on their destiny too.

The west London club only trail Bournemouth on goal difference yet have two matches in hand.

Bournemouth boss Sean O'Driscoll said: 'I'm very disappointed. We were a better side in the first half but needed to score. But it was difficult with that wind.'
