TEENAGE striker Lewis Guy spoiled uton's title celebrations with a fine brace to earn Doncaster a deserved point in a 3-3 draw. Luton were hoping to finish with a

seventh successive victory to post a club record 100 points for the season. But last season's Division Three champions refused to play second fiddle

in a cracking six goal thriller.

Doncaster caught the visitors napping when Guy fired home via the post at the second attempt to open the scoring.

Russ Perrett equalised with a header and the champions edged ahead when top-scorer Steve Howard cashed in on a goalkeeping blunder.

Rovers hit back to level in the 51st minute when a cross from Leo Fortune-West was knocked into his own net by defender Steve Robinson. Town skipper Kevin Nicholls made it

3-2 with a brilliant 25-yard strike in the 63rd minute but Guy earned Doncaster a deserved point when he struck again two minutes later. Luton manager Mike Newell was not

overly disappointed with his side missing out on a club record season haul of 100 points. He said: "The main aim was to get

promotion but we've topped that by winning the championship. 'Sometimes teams go off the boil

when they achieve something like that but I think we've surprised a few people the way we've kept performing. "I have to give the lads credit for the

way they have kept going in the last few weeks.

Doncaster were out to turn us over and we didn't want that to happen.

Doncaster boss Dave Penney said: "Apparently we finished in our highest position in this division since 1958 so we haven't had a bad season and next year we hope to finish higher.

Penney introduced a couple of youth team players from the substitutes bench and Adam Brown and Craig Nelthorpe both performed with credit.
