Youngsters help Luton r alo

SURELY it is a strange inversion of football's natural order when Leeds manager Kevin Blackwell admits that his team are on "Luton's hit list".

But it reflects how, even after just three games, Luton have not surged to first place in the Championship by

accident.

This was an effective, not always pretty, containment of more exalted opposition, lacking only the flour-ishes that humbled Crystal Palace and Southampton. All at Kenilworth Road are starting to exude optimism it could well become a fortress this season.

"We were more comfortable, even though we didn't play so well," said midfielder Ahmet Brkovic. "With the youngsters developing here, there's a real sense that we are capable of reaching the Premiership.'

Manager Mike Newell has so far been cautious to discuss Premier-ship potential, but did reveal the quiet confidence spreading through the club. "We are seeking to sur-

prise," he said.

The team's positive approach owes much to the blossoming of their younger members, such as Curtis

Davies and Kevin Foley.

Davies, a centre-back with ambitions of joining England's Under-21 side, said he was not surprised by their recent rise to prominence.

The dilemma for Luton is that, ultimately, they may not be quite prominent enough to keep him. Asked about his long-term future, he said: "I'm obviously attracting more attention, and I'd be happy to use my experience here as a career stepping-stone."
