


Boaz Myhill: His outstanding performance was his best in a City shirt. He produced several outstanding saves and did not deserve to lose.


REFEREE WATCH

DAMIEN Delaney has won countless battles as a Hull City player.

Now, he's preparing to go to war again, to prove the Tigers can survive in the Championship.

Confidence built around an encouraging start to the season is in grave danger of draining away.

This defeat against Luton – City's third in a row – sent Peter Taylor's side sliding into 17th place in the table.

In his three years as a City player,

Delaney has heard talk of a crisis before, but he's convinced the

Tigers can turn things around.

He said: "It was a disappointing result but we've just got to keep our heads up and keep battling on.

"We seem to keep saying we're playing well, we're creating chances and we're dominating games at times but it just doesn't seem to be happening for us.

"But the boys are good players and we've got a good manager. There is more pressure this season but we can handle that. We'll all be smiling when we come in for training, ready and raring to go again."

City and Luton were locked in a battle for the League One title last season.

verdict

A superb performance from keeper Boaz Myhill failed to save Hull City from a third successive defeat against Luton at the KC.

Steve Howard struck the match winning goal five minutes from time but Damien Delaney remains confident City can turn a worrying situation around.

Steve Howard's late goal on Saturday sealed a deserved win for Luton. They are now 13 places – and eight points – ahead of City. The reasons for that gap were there for all to see.

City had chances early on but the side lacks conviction, as well as a cutting edge. Only a superb performance from keeper Boaz Myhill prevented Luton from romping to a much bigger win.

City need to improve and quickly. Unfortunately, the addition of Danny Coles to a worrying casualty list is another setback.

The Tigers have always responded positively to disappointing results but Delaney – although upbeat – knows the Championship is a different proposition.

He added: "We've been in awkward positions before. The difference now is that every week, you've got a tough game. You look at the fixture list and there's Coventry, Norwich and Millwall coming up.

"They are tough, tough games. Two of those clubs were in the Premiership – they have big stadiums and big players.

"It's not going to get any easier whereas in the last couple of seasons, you could look at teams and


