He repeated that mantra

victory in 12 matches. "Other

Privately he must be ecstatic. Luton played some exceptional football, despite conceding after nine minutes when Michael Ricketts Cardiff 1 Luton 2

controlled a weak clearance from Chris Coyne and fired

low beyond Marlon Beresford.

Luton soon equalised, profiting from a defensive mix-up. When Ahmet Brkovic whipped the ball forwards, the defence pushed up but Dean Morgan timed his run well to record the first goal against City in more than six hours.

Čardiff should have also dealt with the winning goal

but they failed to clear a powerful header across the penalty area, which Peter Holmes bundled into the net.

That, there were no more goals in this entertaining match, was remarkable.

Darren Purse hit the crossbar, Steve Howard struck a post and then Ricketts should have equalised but his header bounced off the woodwork.
