


Welcome to Ninian Park for today's Coca Cola Championship match against the freshly promoted and high flying Luton Town. After a total of six goals between us midweek, we're set for a great game today with both looking to keep a good momentum running.

We're home again after consecutive trips to Millwall last Saturday and Stoke City on Tuesday that have brought four points with no goals conceded. We are now unbeaten in eight competitive games (six in the Coca-Cola Championship and two in the Carling Cup) and are tenth in the division. Can we keep it going against newly-promoted Luton Town, whom we last met in the 2002/03 season when we eventually went up through the play-offs? We hope so.

Our opponents have made a very good start to the current season and their 3-0 home win over Preston on Tuesday saw them in third place prior to last Wednesday's matches. It's a return to Ninian Park for ex-Bluebirds defender Russell Perrett full details on Russell, his manager Mike Newell and the Luton squad will be found on pages 34-38 of today's edition.

DAVE JONES

WE ARE STARTING TO HEAD IN THE RIGHT DIRECTION

NO ONE HERE IS GETTING CARRIED AWAY BY OUR CURRENT RUN OF RESULTS BECAUSE, IN TERMS OF WHAT WE ARE TRYING TO ACHIEVE, WE ARE ONLY ON THE FIRST RUNG OF THE LADDER – WE ARE TRYING TO BUILD A STRONG CLUB BRICK BY BRICK, AND LAY A FOUNDATION THAT WILL STAND THE CLUB IN GOOD STEAD FOR HOPEFULLY MANY YEARS RATHER THAN IN THE SHORT TERM, AND THAT DOES TAKE A BIT OF TIME. PEOPLE NEED TO GET TO KNOW HOW MY STAFF AND I WORK – THE CLUB IS GOING THROUGH A TRANSITIONAL PERIOD AT PRESENT, BUT THINGS ARE STARTING TO HEAD IN THE RIGHT DIRECTION.

With recent results, there are two ways of looking at things in football terms – you can be playing very poorly and still win, or you can be playing really well and lose. So what would everyone rather have? It's a question of finding a happy medium, and I think that we are slowly getting better as the season progresses. We are only ten Championship matches in, so at present it's important to get points on the board and have confidence flowing through the Club. The only way you get that is to obtain good results.

ALL ABOUT OPINIONS

The last two matches illustrate what I am trying to say – our 0-0 draw at Millwall last Saturday followed by Tuesday's 3-0 win at Stoke City. Regarding that match at Millwall, I find it amazing that because somebody writes that it's a boring game, the general opinion is that it's a boring game. Football is all about opinions – my opinion, if it counts, was that we weren't firing on all cylinders at the New Den going forward, so we had to put up a defensive show, and that is what we did. So for me as a manager, it's a good performance as a defending team, but not the best as an attacking team. But on Tuesday night at Stoke, everything fell into place in one game. When you get matches like that, you have to enjoy them because they don't often come along like that, being 3-0 up away from home at half-time.

KEPT IT GOING AT STOKE

So what do you say to your players at half-time when the game looks as if it's won, though you can never be certain. You tell them that they have to keep doing what's got them into a 3-0 lead because you try and put yourself in their situation and what I would be saying to my players if we were 3-0 down at the interval. It has happened to me in the past because I remember at Wolves being 3-0 down after forty-five minutes against Leicester City — we came back and won 4-3! So we knew at half-time on Tuesday that Stoke would be getting a right hammering off their manager, and that they would come out and try to get at us. We had to keep doing what we'd been doing in the first half, we did that, and the game was dead and buried as far the three points was concerned.

LUTON DESERVE THEIR POSITION

It should be a good contest this afternoon against Luton who have been doing really well after their promotion at the end of last season. Mike Newell has done a fantastic job there, and you normally find that when you are able to keep a group of players together over a period of time and they gain a couple of promotions, as Luton have now done twice in four seasons, the confidence and momentum increases. Then you build a foundation – and that's what Mike has done. Luton are where they are in this division because they deserve to be there.


No Jeff Whitley for us this afternoon as he's on a one match suspension, so a chance for somebody else to make the most of their opportunity. You are always going to be short somewhere, either through suspension or injury, so we need someone to come in and do a good job for us today.

INTERNATIONAL REPRESENTATION

With regard to our International representation for Wales at various levels at present and recently – Senior, Under-21 and Under-17 – I think it's important for the Club and the people of Wales that players from Welsh clubs get into the Welsh squad. The future of this Club will ultimately depend on the players that we get through the ranks, and that is something that we really have to look at. This is the second year of our Academy status, John Kerr is finding his feet as Academy Director, and in view of the financial problems that resulted in a number of players having to leave the Club, we have had to take stock, rebuild, and the Academy will be an important part of that.

CAMARADERIE

We are not in first team action for a fortnight because of the International break and it would be good to go into it with a good result this afternoon - at the moment here, everyone is enjoying coming into work, everybody enjoys working hard and when results are going well it means that everyone is looking forward to the next game. For the players it means that they can go out in a relaxed frame of mind, they can be freer in their performances, and that all comes down to a camaraderie built up over the last couple of months. No matter how strong your squad, you can feel drained if you are losing regularly and just gaining the odd good result, so the best injection that you can have is to keep winning. It's a massive confidence booster for everybody - not just for the players, but also for the staff who work in the Club and the supporters of course. But you have to maintain the work-rate, otherwise it can quickly go wrong, and hopefully we can continue along recent lines.

Another clean sheet from the excellent back line also added to the confidence and bond in the Bluebirds camp – the City squad rounding off an excellent September in style.


DAVE'S VERDICT



As a result of a freak knee injury against Brighton at Turf Moor last Saturday, Burnley and Wales goalkeeper Danny Coyne is out for the season. He was replaced during last Saturday's 1-1 draw by Brian Jensen who was in the side for last night's game against Wolves at Molineux.

BRIGHTON WAITING

The Labour Party Conference that has been taking place in Brighton this week has focussed the attention of fans of Brighton & Hove Albion on the Club's efforts to find a suitable site for a new stadium. Deputy Prime Minister John Prescott is due to announce shortly whether or not the proposed development at

the Falmer site can go ahead, and between seven and ten thousand fans converged on the Brighton Centre a few days ago to show their support for the Club's efforts. That figure is more than can currently be accommodated at the Withdean Stadium where there will be another full house this afternoon for the visit of Norwich City. The Canaries, who won 2-1 at home to Hull City last Tuesday, will be hoping to make it two consecutive wins for the first time this season.

POOR RUN FOR DERBY

It is currently seven matches without victory for Derby County who face East Midlands rivals Leicester City at Pride Park this afternoon. Derby currently have five players on loan — midfielder Khalilou Fadiga from Bolton, fullback Peter Whittingham from Aston Villa, forward Stern John from Coventry, midfielder Johnnie Jackson from Tottenham, and forward Mounir El Hamadoui also from Tottenham.

LEEDS' LOW TURN-OUT

Only 18,353 fans turned out at Elland Road last Wednesday for Leeds United's 3-1 home win over Derby - their lowest attendance so far this season. It followed last Saturday's 2-0 home defeat by Ipswich when 3,000 more were present. Today Leeds go to Watford who have now collected just one point from their last three games after a run of five wins and a draw from six matches. Watford have recently been including two loan-forwards - Trevor Benjamin from Peterborough United and Gabriel Agbonlohor from Aston Villa.

PULIS FACES FORMER CLUB

Plymouth Argyle will be hoping for their first win under recently appointed manager Tony Pulis this afternoon when they play Stoke City at Home Park. And no doubt Tony would be happy with three points against the club who sacked him in the summer because they felt that he hadn't made sufficient use of the European transfer market. Since his appointment on September 23rd, Argyle have drawn 0-0 at Southampton while last week they lost 2-0 at Sheffield United. As for Stoke, they have won their last two away matches - 1-0 at Hull and 1-0 at Preston - and are once again without their captain Dave Brammer in midfield. Although he was out through injury last Tuesday against us, he was in fact also suspended and is again absent through suspension this afternoon.



bring you behind the scenes when and where ever possible. Not just at Ninian Park either. There are many satellite organisations that work in conjunction with the club, bringing you products, services and the latest news at Cardiff City FC.

Our first look at those associated with the club comes in the form of a visit to the Wales branch of Real Radio in Morganstown, Cardiff. As you no doubt know, along with their daily sports bulletins, Real Radio brings you the Real Sports Phone In show, weeknights between six and seven during the season. The show is hosted by Alex Feeney and Sam Fleet, who collect the nation's views on Welsh sport with the help of guests and pundits from the sporting world.

Naturally with the Bluebirds being the highest placed league and profile football club in the country, our name comes up quite frequently from the football fraternity eager to share their ideas. The show is a great way to present your thoughts on City's progress, or even let off a little steam from time to time.

Alex and Sam, with the assistance of their panel or Cardiff City guest interact with the callers on what they see to be the hot topic of the day. There's always a lot to cram in during the hour, with a busy schedule filled with talk of Championship Cardiff, League One Swansea and other things from the Welsh rugby, ice hockey and sporting scene in general.

Real Radio also covers the Bluebirds for our press conferences and broadcast goal flashes and incident updates from our live matches.

This week we were fortunate to be invited to one of the Real Sports Phone In shows, hosted by Sam Fleet in the hot seat. The guests answering your calls were none other than ex Cardiff City star (and all-round South Wales media darling) David Giles with former Wales, Pontypool and Rugby League star David Bishop – 'Gilo' talking things in the realm of the round ball, with 'Bish' covering matters egg-shaped.

Sam told us of his involvement and of how the show, like the radio station has blossomed over the last five years. "The phone in has now been running for as long as Real Radio has been on air, which will be our fifth year next week," he told us.

"I joined in the following June, so I've been there four and half years or so. I spent a couple of years on the news team. Alex then joined around three and a half years ago. Most of our callers are from South Wales, but we do get people listening on digital TV channel 896, phoning from England, so that's always quite interesting. Mainly though the calls are from listeners on FM. We cover-right from Chepstow across to Fishguard. It's quite a big patch really.

"The show is great. It's such a great platform for people to air their sporting views across South Wales. It's mainly football and rugby based but we do encourage people to call in about all other sports."

With the majority of us closet football managers who think we could do the best job ever, you can be assured that there are some interesting views shared also. The debate and differences of opinion, we suppose, are two things that make following football so interesting.

Sam agreed, saying, "We try to make it like a chat down the pub and cover the types of topics you would talk about with your mates and in quite a relaxed format. We do have a bit of a laugh and a joke. What's the saying? 'Half of Wales think they can do a better job than Toshack, and the other half know they can.' We've all got our views, and everyone thinks that they can pick the right team - we like to hear about what people have to

"We do get people phoning in saying good things about various teams and things, but mainly people like to phone in and have a good moan about things and get things off their chests. We have quite a few regular Cardiff fans phone in — Tony Jefferies phones in quite often to name one. Sometimes they phone in to put the world to rights but they also phone in with comments about things.

"We've also had some mad moments. The most famous one was with David Giles. We were in Russia covering the Wales

Gilo in Moscow. Gilo spent the afternoon drinking Russian vodka and having several pints bought for him. So by the time we got to go on air he was slightly merry should I say. I wouldn't say he kept breaking into song but he was full of the joys of spring. He had a bit of a reception back home because basically he was slightly under the affluence of incohol."

And what did Sam assess the mood over the last few months, with the installation of the new City boss and his band of players at Ninian Park? "I think people are really willing to give Dave Jones a good chance," he said. "He's had a good response on the phone-in. Dave Jones was actually a guest on the show before the season started and came across well with the Cardiff fans. There's been very few negative calls about him. Judging by our calls he's pretty popular."

Finally for Sam was the chance to lay down a challenge to the Bluebirds fans present here today. He wants to get you lot more involved in matters, where the agenda is based purely on those who call, text or email in to set it. Like with most matters, there's no real point complaining about a lack of coverage if you're not willing to do something about it. So get calling!!!

"I'd tell every single Cardiff City fan that they are always welcome to come on to the show," he proclaimed. "If the topic isn't necessarily about Cardiff at that particular point, then don't think that they can't phone to talk about what they want to talk about. It's an open forum and we are always very happy to hear from Cardiff City fans. We realise the importance of the Bluebirds and we like to hear from as many Cardiff City fans as possible; new and regular callers are always welcome."

IN PROFILE GLENING LOOVENS

The first-ever Dutch player to appear for Cardiff City, 21 year-old defender GLENN LOOVENS is gradually settling down at Ninian Park as his recent performances in our current unbeaten run have shown. But Glenn is not the first player to have joined us from a Dutch club – older City fans may recall Steve "Kalamazoo" Mokone, a South African who came to us from Heracles of Holland way back in the summer of 1959.

It was in mid-July 2005 that the Club confirmed that Glenn had joined us, and his first appearance was in our opening pre-season 3-1 win at Accrington Stanley on July 16th. He played in all of our preseason matches except the late July game against West Bromwich Albion when he was non-playing substitute. After being on the bench in our opening four Championship matches and coming on in the 3-1 home defeat by Watford on August 12th, Glenn has since been ever-present in our starting line-up apart from the Carling Cup Second Round 2-1 home win over Macclesfield Town.

EFFECTIVE BARRIER

It was on September 10th that we conceded our last goals in the Championship — a 3-3 draw at Burnley, and with no goals conceded in our last four League matches, Glenn has proved an effective barrier at the back _alongside skipper Darren Purse. And Glenn has shown that he can be effective in the opposition penalty-area, as that powerful header at Burnley showed when he scored a late-first-half equaliser to make it 2-2 from a Jason Koumas corner.

Glenn developed through the junior ranks of the Rotterdam club Feyenoord with whom he became a Dutch Under-21 International, but did not get many chances at first-team level last season when Feyenoord finished fourth in the Dutch Championship. He played in eight Championship matches for them last season during the first half of 2004/05, and went out on loan after Christmas to Graassthad for whom he played just over twenty matches. But there did not seem a first team opening for him on his return to Feyenoord, so he felt that it was time to move on, even if it was another loan "I like to play football and I wasn't getting the opportunity, so I told my agent to look round and that's how I signed for Cardiff City. Dave Jones invited my agent and I to come and see him, and we had a good conversation. The manager hadn't seen me play, but he signed me, put his faith in me, and now I'm in the first-team. I want to do my best for Cardiff City and myself - I'm here on a one-season loan so I have to do well in the time that I'm here. I want to see the Club well up the table. I've enjoyed playing at Ninian Park so far, the fans are good and



very vocal."

Born in Doeeinhem while his father was playing for Dutch side Graassthad, Glenn grew up in Rotterdam where he has lived for all his life. After playing in schools football, he joined Feyenoord's junior sides at the age of 12 and came up through their various junior and reserve sides.

TECHNICAL DIFFERENCES

How does Glenn see the differences between Dutch and British football? "In Holland, the training is more about tactics and techniques. We do that of course here, but in Championship football there are more games than in the Dutch League where we play just thirty-four games in a season. It's physically much stronger in the League Championship here and I feel that I am adjusting to it well. But in Holland I think that the game is technically better and there is a big difference. In this division, everyone can beat anyone and you have to be one hundred per cent focussed or you can lose a number of games. There are ex-Premiership teams in this division, and we have shown so far that we can compete with them."

Glenn came into our starting lineup in late-August, taking over from summer signing Neil Cox who has since been on the bench. So how does he get on with the player whose place he has taken? "I get on well with Neil and Darren Purse, they both help me. They are each more experienced than me, and Neil in particular has been very helpful which gives me confidence. They are both really good players, and Darren has a lot to offer me, having played in the Premiership. Neil is a really funny guy — he has a great sense of humour and is very dry."

HIS ARSENAL FRIEND

With a number of Dutch players in the Premiership and Coca-Cola League, Glenn takes a big interest in the game throughout the country, and he is hoping that we can get to play Arsenal in a cup competition this season - "It would be great to face them because my good friend Robin Van Persie is at Highbury. I know him well from Feyenoord where we played together in the youth team and first team. I keep in contact with him and talk about once a week. He's doing alright there though he has only scored once this season. He will have been disappointed not to have played last Tuesday in the Champions' League against

Ajax who are Feyenoord's rivals from Amsterdam rivals, but he was suspended for the game as he was sent off in Arsenal's previous Champions League match against FC Thun."



ACADEMY NEWS UPDATE

CHARTING OUR PROGRESS

UNDER-18s JOHN KERR REPORTS

This morning's match at Coventry City will indicate whether or not we can maintain our progress from last Saturday when we beat Tottenham Hotspur 3-1 at home. It was important that we gained a good result against Spurs seven days ago, because on the previous Saturday - September 17th - we lost 2-0 at home to West Ham United.

We did not perform to the best of our ability against a good West Ham side a fortnight ago. Everyone did their best, but although we had a couple of chances to get back into the game. we had to accept being beaten by the better side. Scott's goal came from a through ball after he'd pressured a defender, and he chipped the 'keeper from outside their area for our second.

They made it 2-1 midway through the second half and put us under some pressure, but we held out. Tottenham are a well-established Academy outfit with a wealth of experience behind them, but we settled the game in the last minute with another goal from Scott McCoubrey who latched on to a

through ball from Joe Jacobson. He still has some work to do on his allround game, which he knows, but we are pleased with his current contribution.

We have had four players away with the Wales Under-17 squad recently for the latest round in their UEFA Under-17 Qualifying Tournament. Mika Chunuonsee, Chris Gunter, Carl Jones and Mark Jones have all been involved. Mika and Carl played in the final match at Wrexham last Monday when Wales lost 3-0 to Switzerland while Mark was on the bench. Wales have qualified for the next stage, so the boys will no doubt be with them again in March. So while they have been away on International duty, looking to progress through the various Wales age-groups, as several of our other players have done, it gave us the opportunity last week of including in our starting line-up a few of the younger players including lan Robinson and Shane Dawe.

UNDER-16s

TERRY MOORE REPORTS

We were off early this morning for the game at Coventry City that kicked off at 11.00am and no doubt it will have been another difficult match for us. as was last Saturday's 4-0 home defeat by Tottenham who fielded a strong Under-16 line-up, including four England Internationals, whereas most of our side are Under-15s.

The score-line against Tottenham was not, I felt, a fair reflection of our efforts - Tottenham deserved to win, but we did make a fair amount of chances and it could have been a lot closer. Their first goal came just before half-time after they counterattacked following our corner, so we went at half-time 1-0 down.

So perhaps that's the naiviety of youth sometimes - you go looking for a goal and leave yourselves open at the back. They have to learn from that, and we had a talk at half-time.

telling them that they had been playing well, let's keep it going, let's be disciplined. We told them to use the ball well, and not give it away cheaply.

But soon after the start of the second half, we gave away a penalty - it was then 2-0 against us and we had a mountain to climb! As can happen with young lads, a couple of heads went down, and though we tried hard, the game became a little too much for them. I still feel that we are giving sides too much respect, but it's how they learn from it all with the aim of becoming stronger mentally.

I brought a new name into the squad in Elliott Thomas, one of our Under-15s who has been out for a year following a knee-operation, and he came on as substitute. He is a central midfield player from the Carmarthen area who has been with us for several years progressing through the various age-groups. So this level was new to him, but it was good for Elliott to experience it for twenty minutes. I'm sure that he found it quite demanding, which it can be when you first come into Academy football.

A week prior to that Tottenham defeat, we had lost 2-1 at home to West Ham United, and we have to accept that, with a squad as young as ours at this level, we are going to lose games. Of course we want to win matches, but it is all about development at this level, and if we produce several scholarship-trainees for John Kerr's squad by the end of the season, it won't matter how many games we have won or lost. So the message going out to our Under-16 squad is - don't be worried about being over-awed or making mistakes, because that is what you have to learn from, and the less mistakes we make will be reflected in our scorelines and results.

We do get good possession of the ball in our matches, but what we need to do is to score in those spells - if we can do that, then our results will improve.



If we upped the tempo, and if our forwards had got their shooting boots on, we might have come away with maximum points. We could have got at Millwall more — but this was a game in which both defences were on top.





WE WELCOME LUTON TOWN TO NINIAN PARK



We today welcome Championship high flying Luton Town to Ninian Park, in what follows a goal packed midweek for both sides, and it should prove to be an exciting encounter.

Luton like the Bluebirds bagged a total of three goals on Tuesday, demolishing last year's playoff finalists Preston North End. The result lifted the Hatters to third in the table that night, and have managed to stay there going into the game today due to Watford being unable to take advantage over Coventry, losing 3-1 on Wednesday.

In a league that has thrown out more than it's fair share of early surprises - Luton fans will no doubt be satisfied with the League One Champions of last season. It's a fair assessment to say that the Hatters have continued where they left off as if no one had told them that they now reside in a tougher division.

The fans may be on cloud nine at the moment, but it's a case of feet firmly on the ground for Luton boss Mike Newell. After their first win in three games on Tuesday night he said, "People might get excited, but they need to take stock of what we've done for the first ten or eleven games here. There might have been a bit of a surprise factor at first, but now teams will work out how to stop us. Every successful team has to deal with that problem and we're no different." Luton's promotion to Championship level gave an immediate test when the fixtures were released. First on their schedule were two games against Premiership relegated Crystal Palace and Southampton. Despite the media concentrating on what was set to be a formality. The Hatters dug deep to notch both scalps to make the rest of the division stand up and take note. From that point on, their league form has been regularly consistent, notching a total of six wins. three drawn and only two losses - their defeats coming under QPR and our victims of last night. Stoke City.

Whatever happens today, the Bluebirds and Hatters connection in initially defying their underdog status has done enough to make the Championship a more interesting league. Let's hope the six goals between both don't equate to a nil-nil draw (though points are great to collect for both teams whenever possible).

A well known striker for a host of clubs including Leicester, Luton, Everton, West Ham and Premiership winning Blackburn, Mike Newell was appointed as the Hatters boss in the summer of 2003. In November 2002 he was given his first job as a manager at Hartlepool, guiding them to promotion a few months later.

Surprisingly though his contract was not renewed, paving a return to Luton and a heroes welcome from the fans. After guiding the in administration Hatters to a top ten finish in the 2003/04 season, Mike went one better the following year. He secured Luton's place in the Championship as League One Champions, twelve points above closest rivals Hull. The Hatters fans will also be more than happy with their start this year, where they continue to flourish.

In total Newell played over five-hundred league games for fourteen clubs in a nineteen-year professional career that saw him compete at every level. He also gained international recognition at England's Under-21 and 'B' team level.

Steve has been one of Luton's biggest bargains, being signed for a £50,000 fee from Northampton Town on transfer-deadline day in March 2001. He has been the Club's top scorer for the past four seasons and is again leading the way so far this season – he scored against Preston on Tuesday night to make it five goals to date, with four in his last four games. Steve began his career with Tow Law in the North East before joining Hartlepool United in August 1995. He went to Northampton for a £120,000 fee in February 1999 and they had to accept much less than that for Steve from Luton, or see him go for nothing soon afterwards under the Bosman Ruling. In last season's League One Championship success, he scored 22 goals (18 League, 4 Cup), and his only absences this season have been in late August when he had a three-match suspension following his dismissal at Stoke on August 20th.



LUTON KNOCK US OUT OF THE CUP

STANT GOAL - BUT LUTON SCORE A CONTROVERSIAL F.A. CUP FIFTH ROUND WINNER!

IT was the last occasion on which we reached the Fifth Round of the F.A. Cup, and we were knocked out by today's visitors Luton Town with a controversial goal that is still the subject of debate amongst our fans who were here that day.

The season was 1993/94 - we had won promotion from the former Division Three as Champions in '92/93, but in mid-February 1994 we were just two points off the Second Division relegation zone, though with several games in hand on the sides around us. Our Team Manager was Eddie May who had been upgraded from Youth Team Coach in July 1991 when he succeeded Len Ashurst, while Luton, then seventeenth in Division One (now the Coca-Cola Championship) were managed by David Pleat who was in his second spell in charge.

LONG HAUL

It had been a long haul for us to reach Round Five — our run started at non-league Enfield in the First Round when a 0-0 draw had been followed by a 1-0 replay win at Ninian Park with a

Nathan Blake goal. Then came a Second Round victory at Brentford (own goal, Phil Stant and Tony Bird) before we played First Division Middlesbrough at home in Round Three. They were managed by Lennie Lawrence, later to join us, and we drew 2-2 in front of 13,750. The replay took place at their former Ayresome Park ground with Graham Kavanagh coming into their line-up for the first time in several weeks. Phil Stant gave us the lead, but Graham equalised to take the match into extra time when Nathan Blake scored to give us a 2-1 victory.

Round Four saw Premiership Manchester City at Ninian Park. Their manager was Brian Horton, recently here with Macclesfield Town, and a nearcapacity 20,486 saw Blake score a superb second-half winner. We survived a late penalty when 'keeper Mark Grew saved Keith Curle's spot-kick to give us a 1-0 win. So it was now Luton Town here in Round Five.

NATHAN HAD GONE

We had not reached the Sixth round since our F.A. Cup-winning year of 1927, but our fans were confident that we could at last

make it to the quarter-finals after a gap of sixty-seven years!. It was a Sunday afternoon game shown 'live' on BBC Wales TV, and we made one enforced change from the side that had played in the 2-0 League defeat at Burnley eight days earlier. Nathan Blake had been transferred to Premiership Sheffield United for £300,000 just three days before the Luton tie with the proviso that, if the Yorkshire side stayed up, then they would pay another

£200,000. At the time, The Blades looked to have no chance, but a gallant recovery left them needing just one point for safety when they went to Chelsea in their final game. A last-minute goal saw them lose 3-2 and go down – had they held on, they would have stayed up on goal difference. It was a Chelsea goal that cost Bluebirds. Owner/Chairman Rick Wright £200,000!

So Carl Dale, well on the way to full fitness after being hampered by his knee-injury of mid-December 1992, came in for his first start of the season after three substitute appearances in the previous three matches. In the Luton line-up was 18 year-old John Hartson who had originally joined them as an apprentice. Already a Wales Under-21 International and in the Wales B squad, he was at the start of a goalscoring career which still continues with Celtic and Wales.

We were 1-0 down to a Scott Oakes goal after thirty-nine minutes, and in first-half injury-time our 'keeper Mark Grew was hurt in a collision with John Hartson. Phil Kite took over for the second half — his first appearance since late-October — and we equalised twenty minutes after the re-start when Phil Stant, who had come on for Carl Dale, scored with a fierce shot after Garry Thompson had headed down a Derek Brazil cross into his path.

OFFSIDE, OR NOT?

Five minutes later came the incident that Bluebirds fans still remember – a back-pass to Kite at the Grange End was cleared to the half-way line by Kite who was being closed down by a Luton opponent. As the Luton player jogged back, one of his team-mates hit a long ball to Dave Preece on their right. He wasn't offside, but the other Luton player jogging back was in an offside position in the middle of our half. Our defenders

stopped, expecting a linesman's flag that never came, Referee Roger Dilkes waved play on reckoning that the Luton player was not interfering with play. So Dave Preece went on unchallenged to score what proved the winner in their 2-1 victory.

So we were out of the F.A. Cup and eventually finished the season in nineteenth place, avoiding relegation by just two points! Luton went on to defeat West Ham United after a Sixth Round replay before losing 2-0 against Chelsea in the semi-final. But for us there was still the target of retaining the Welsh Senior Cup. We lost, however, to Barry Town 2-1 in the Final at the old National Stadium. The following season (1994/95) it was back to Round One of the F.A. Cup, and a return to Enfield where we had started out in the '93/94 competition. This time, though, there was no F.A. Cup run for us - Enfield were 1-0 winners!

BIG SQUAD AT WYCOMBE




