

JOE ROYLE hailed the character of his Ipswich Town side as they halted their slide down the table.

One win from nine had left the Blues in the bottom eight but substitute Ian Westlake grabbed the only goal to defeat a dogged Luton Town outfit.

"It was a fantastic win, great spirit," said Ipswich manager Royle. "I thought we deserved it and we defended well.

"People can question our team, myself, chairman or board, but do not question our spirit."

Westlake scored his second of the season in the 68th minute when he collected a long pass from Darren Currie, held off a chal-

lenge from Luton's Kevin Foley and calmly finished past Marlon Beresford.

However, the Blues were indebted to teenage goalkeeper Shane Supple, who made a number of fine saves as the Suffolk side kept their fifth clean sheet of the season.

Supple, 18, who helped Ipswich win the FA Youth Cup in May, had been playing as regular first-team goalkeeper Lewis Price was struggling with a groin injury that saw him only named as a substi-

But Supple produced a fine save to deny Steve Robinson's close-range diving header and then made a superb one-handed stop to push Kevin Nicholls' effort on to a post.

Royle was delighted with Supple's performance and believes he has a bright future in the game.

"I have been saying that we have got the best two young goalkeepers in the country and we have seen that," he said.

An injury crisis saw Royle start the match with 17-yearold forward Danny Haynes, who was making his full home

His strike partner Dean Bowditch, who last scored for Ipswich in October 2004, had a glorious chance to get his first goal of the season in the 37th minute.

He broke clear of the defence and chased on to a hopeful ball from Fabian Wilnis that left him with only Beresford to beat.

But the Luton goalkeeper did well to deny the striker and Markus Heikkinen blocked a follow-up attempt from Haynes before Bowditch fired

the loose ball over from six yards.

Mike Newell's side ended the first half strongly, but failed to make a breakthrough as Paul Underwood and Ahmet Brkovic both failed to test

Supple when well-placed.
The Hatters continued to create opportunities after the restart, but Westlake grabbed the decisive goal midway through the second-half.

However, the hosts had a

fortunate escape in the 76th minute when substitute Steve Howard thought he had equalised.

He headed home a Nicholls corner, but referee Andy D'Urso disallowed the goal as he adjudged that Steve Robinson had fouled Supple.

Howard again had an opportunity to salvage a point but he headed Robinson's cross over the bar in the dying minutes.

Luton's play-off hopes could be dashed if their form on the road does not improve. They have now only collected one point from their last eight away matches.


Newell said: "We aren't playing differently to what we are at home and I don't know what to put it down to.
