

THE MASTER and the apprentice combined to move Wolves into the play-off pack.

Mark Davies - the youngest player on the pitch at 17 - struck his first-ever League goal to put Wolves one-up, but that was cancelled out by Luton's Steve Howard ten minutes from time.

But the oldest player on show, 38-year-old Paul Ince, wasn't to be outdone when he snatched all the points two minutes from time with an unstoppable 25-yarder. And Wolves boss Glenn Hoddle revealed a half-time word with his skipper had worked a treat.

Hoddle said: "We didn't start well and I told Paul at half-time that I wanted to see more of the Paul Ince from his West Ham and

Manchester United days even if it meant carrying him off on a stretcher at the end of the game.

"I'm delighted with the win because we weren't at our best. That's the kind of thing you need to do when you are looking to get on a run."

The former England star has missed the majority of the season through injury, but his first goal of the season was worth waiting for.

Rob Edwards' long ball forward was chested-down by Leon Clarke and Ince unleashed a shot that flew past Hatters goalkeeper Marlon Beresford.

And the 38-year-old was delighted.

"Any goal at this age is great, but it was nice that it was the winner," said Ince.

"The first half was scrappy and we had a rollicking at halftime, but second half we played some decent stuff and deserved to win. I couldn't have taken another draw.

"It was great to see Mark get a goal as well. He's a brilliant young lad and deserved that goal for his recent performances. He's got a long way to go, but he's got plenty of potential."

Tom Huddlestone and Mark Kennedy had gone close in a lacklustre first period for the

hosts and Enoch Showunmi tested Stefan Postma at the other end.

Howard headed narrowly wide just after the interval before Davies broke the deadlock. Clarke's angled shot was saved by Beresford, but the youngster was quickest to the rebound and made no mistake from close-range.

Kennedy almost doubled the lead immediately. Beresford palmed a shot round the post and then came even closer when another fierce drive flew back off the post.

But Luton upped their tempo and Kevin Nicholls' 30-yarder was deflected inches wide.

Howard was then denied by Joleon Lescott and Carlos Edwards went close before the pressure paid off.
