SHEFFIELD UNITED boss Neil Warnock watched his side grab a last-minute equaliser at Kenilworth Road - then admitted he couldn't wait for the season to end.

The Blades have cruised into the Premiership as runners-up to Reading, but Warnock has had his share of run-ins along the way and, despite Saturday's game having its fair share of controversial moments, Warnock wasn't about to start another row.

A last-gasp Michael Tonge freekick cancelled out Ahmet Brkovic's opener for the home side as the game ended all-square - but the earlier award of a penalty to the Hatters would have had Warnock fuming in days gone by.

But not this time. In fact, Warnock even conceded Luton had

deserved the points.

He said: "You can't say much about that game and I'm glad the season's nearly over.

'Luton deserved to win and I'm pleased with a point. It was hard work and everybody's tired now because it's such a long season.

That's the sort of resilience we'll need next season. Phil Jageielka's had a dreadful virus this week and he looked tired today.

"I didn't enjoy it out there. The highlight of my day was putting sun cream on at half-time - it was really hot out there.'

Luton boss Mike Newell agreed his side deserved to win and said the result showed why the Hatters had missed out on the play-offs.

He said: "That pretty much sums up our season. We've had the better of the game again and created the better chances - we had the game won again, so it's frustrating.

"I know they've got nothing to play for with already being promoted, so they may have taken there foot off the pedal, but we still had them beaten with a minute to go.

"I'm pleased with the performance, especially with the team we had out and players playing out of position. I'm pleased with the appetite of the players to still be going after 45 games.

"But it's disappointing to concede in the last minute like we've done so many times this season."

In a scrappy first half, the best chance fell to Sheffield United in the 40th minute. Chris Morgan found Ade Akinbiyi inside the area, but Leon Barnett cleared his low drive off the line.

Vine's blushes were spared in the 72nd minute as the Hatters took the lead. Dean Morgan flicked on David Bell's cross and Ahmet Brkovic was on hand to head the ball beyond Kenny.

Kevin Nicholls then struck the bar for the hosts as they were unable to grab the all-important second and in the 90th minute they were dealt the ultimate suckerpunch.

A quick United break came to a halt as Steve Howard brought down Chris Armstrong and up stepped Michael Tonge to find the bottom corner and snatch a share of the spoils for Warnock's Premiership-bound side.
