




LUTON TOWN

uton are currently enjoying their second season back in the Championship after winning promotion with Hull nearly 18 months ago.


They are unbeaten at Kenilworth Road so far this season with wins over Leicester (2-0) and Crystal Palace (2-1) and draws against Stoke (2-2) and Colchester (1-1). The Hatters won their opening away game 1-0 at Sheffield Wednesday but have lost their last three League games on the road - 3-2 at Norwich, 1-0 at Wolves and then on Saturday 4-1 at Cardiff to leave them 12th in the table. They reached tonight's tie after a nervy first-round win over League Two Bristol Rovers - finally triumphing 5-3 in a penalty shoot-out following a 1-1 draw after extra-time. Luton have a proud history in this competition, capped when they won it by beating Arsenal 3-2 in a memorable final in 1988 when it was known as the Littlewoods Cup.

Luton made several changes for their first round tie against Bristol Rovers and

Regular goalkeeper Marlon Beresford (1) (ex-Sheffield Wednesday, Burnley (three spells), Middlesbrough, York, Bradford and Barnsley), in his second spell with Luton, played in that game and also against Cardiff three days ago with former trainee Dean Brill (33) on the bench. Youngster Zac Barrett (34) is injured. Republic of Ireland under-21 international and another former trainee Kevin Foley (2) was right-back on Saturday with Sol Davis (3) (ex-Swindon) at left-back and Finland international Markus Heikinnen (26) (ex-MyPa (Fin), HJK Helsinki (Fin), and Aberdeen), who collected all last season's player of the year awards,



and homegrown Leon Barnett (25), who made his first-team debut aged just 16, in the middle. Skipper and former Bee Chris Coyne (12) (ex-Perth (Australia), West Ham and Dundee), who played eight games on loan for us at the start of 1998/99, returned from injury as a first half substitute for Davis following the sending-off of midfield summer signing Lewis Emanuel (16) (ex-Bradford), who will be suspended tonight. Russ Perrett (5) (ex-Lymington, Portsmouth and Cardiff) and Paul Underwood (6) (ex-Enfield and Rushden) are both out injured but another former trainee Keith Keane (23) made his only appearance so far this season in this competition so may get a chance tonight. Youngster Chris Pendleton (35) is awaiting his chance. Apart from Emanuel, Saturday's midfield consisted of Trinidad and Tobago international Carlos Edwards (7) (ex-Defence Force (Tri) and Wrexham), who played in every minute of his country's three matches in this summer's World Cup finals, Northern Ireland international Steve Robinson (11) (ex-Bournemouth and Preston), and Jamaica international Richard Langley (17) (ex-QPR (two spells) and Cardiff). Ahmet Brkovic (18)



(ex-HNK Dubrovnik and Leyton Orient) was on the bench but Ealing-born Michael Leary (14) is injured. Peter Holmes (27) (ex-Sheffield Wednesday), who has played in one other League game this term, and Republic of Ireland under-21 international David Bell (28) (ex-Rushden) both played in the first round tie and have not featured since. but could be chosen tonight. while diminutive winger Danny Stevens (22) is waiting for his first game of 2006/07. Ex-Bee Rowan Vine (9), who spent the entire 2002/03 season on loan to us, hitting 13 goals in 50 games, partnered summer signing Sam Parkin (19) (ex-Chelsea, Swindon and Ipswich) up front on Saturday with Dean Morgan (11) (ex-Colchester and Reading) and Northern Ireland international Warren Feeney (10) (ex-Bournemouth and Stockport) among the substitutes. Former trainee Calvin Andrew (29) is sidelined by injury while close-season signing Adam Boyd (20) (ex-Hartlepool), who worked with manager Newell at Victoria Park, is another player to appear in the first-round Carling tie and little else so far this season.



As a player he also represented Crewe (two spells), Wigan, Leicester, Everton, Blackburn, Birmingham, West Ham, Bradford, Aberdeen and Blackpool and scored The Latics' first goal against us in the 1985 Freight Rover Trophy final. 

efences held sway at Griffin Park on Saturday as AFC Bournemouth came to frustrate and left with a point in a goalless draw.

Brentford had the better of the game, passing the ball well and created the better chances but were unable to breach a well-drilled Bournemouth backline. The best chance of the match came eight minutes before half time when Gavin Tomlin cut inside from the left wing

and lofted a ball to the far post where Paul Brooker arrived, timing his run to perfection.

Brooker lofted the ball over the advancing Bournemouth goalkeeper Gareth Stewart but Neil Young managed to get back and clear the ball off the line.

Brentford might also feel aggrieved not to have been awarded a penalty just past the half hour when Jo Kuffour appeared to be scythed down inside the penalty area by Karl Broadhurst but referee Trevor Kettle deemed Kuffour to have dived and cautioned the Bees' top scorer despite the striker receiving lengthy treatment. The lack of a crucial goal left Brentford manager Leroy Rosenior slightly saddened.

"I was disappointed we didn't win the game because there was only one team who would win it," he said. "But I'm pleased with the performance in terms of coming back after Tuesday. "We passed it well but lacked that cutting edge up front. We didn't have anybody attacking it in the box. But when you've lost for the first time it's important you approach it in a positive way and I think we did. "We were by far the better team in terms of possession and we passed it very well. In terms of a 90 minutes performance I thought it was very good. "We had some chances and it didn't quite happen for us. But it's at times like that when the opposition

go and sneak one down the other end, but they didn't."

In fact Bournemouth had very few chances, or even half chances, as the Brentford defence, marshalled superbly by Matt Heywood, restricted the visitors to mainly speculative long-range effort. Their clearest sight of goal came when Stuart Nelson failed to gather a deep cross from Warren Cummings under pressure from Leon Best and Steve Fletcher. The

ball dropped to Stephen Purches who lashed over the bar with the Brentford goalkeeper scrambling back into position.

Best had a header from a Steven Foley cross saved well to his left by Nelson and a low shot which flew inches wide of the far post when he latched on to a long Stewart kick but it was Brentford who came closest.

Tomlin had a rasping drive tipped over by Stewart just past the hour mark and Sam Tillen also had a decent chance when a cut back from Alex Rhodes fell to him on the edge of the box but he dragged his shot wide.

"They were delighted to go home with a point and you saw them celebrating at the end," added Rosenior. "I thought we reacted very well after losing our first game, the lads weren't down heartened; they've looked forward to the game and performed well. We needed a decent performance.

"We got in some good positions but it fizzled out. down to inexperience more than anything. I always say when you've lost one it's important to go and get something from the next game and we did that. "It was difficult to break them down and they showed us a compliment by putting so many players behind the ball. "We approached it in the right way and didn't panic and on another day we would have won it."



he dozen Premiership clubs not involved in European competition enter at this stage, and given the number of surprise results in the First Round, may be viewing their Carling Cup ties with a little trepidation.

That certainly applies to WIGAN ATHLETIC, last year's comprehensively beaten finalists, who make the short trip to League One CREWE ALEXANDRA, as the local derby makes an intriguing return, but the Latics should be able to get at least one step closer to a return final trip. Another eye-catching tie brings in-form EVERTON to PETERBOROUGH UNITED, with the Toffees a clear dark horse to win the competition, but first they will need to see off the challenge of Keith Alexander's hard-working League Two hopefuls. who showed great spirit to beat IPSWICH TOWN in the last round. Another high-flying Premiership outfit, PORTSMOUTH, visit MANSFIELD TOWN, with manager Harry Redknapp hoping lightning doesn't strike twice, as his then-Southampton side were beaten at Field Mill last

season in the competition. The tricky visits to League Two sides continue as WALSALL hope that their excellent league results so far can inspire them to a shock win over a BOLTON WANDERERS side who have had a varied start to the season.

CHESTERFIELD are at home to MANCHESTER CITY, as the Spireites look to emulate Doncaster's epic elimination of City last year, and with the visitors' form on the road being something of an Achilles heel of late, the League One side could get their wish. SCUNTHORPE UNITED will have similar high hopes as they face ASTON VILLA: Martin O'Neill making an intriguing return to the competition his Leicester City side dominated at the end of the 1990s. The remaining quintet of top flight sides at least have the comfort of being at home, as WATFORD look for a break from their league struggles in a home contest with ACCRINGTON STANLEY, whose disappointing form themselves would seem to make an upset at the expense of the Hornets unlikely. SHEFFIELD UNITED manager Neil

Warnock faces one of his

former clubs, BURY, and though the Shakers have been galvanised by that win over Sunderland in the last round, the right approach should mean the Blades avoid a surprise defeat. READING have been assigned a home tie against DARLINGTON, one of the strongest sides at League Two level, and boasting Premiership stalwart striker Julian

CARLISLE UNITED, whose prospects of pulling off a surprise win have been lessened by the departure of prolific striker Michael Bridges. The Addicks will look to correct their underachievement in this competition. Completing the Premiership involvement are FULHAM. who host a buoyant WYCOMBE WANDERERS side; although home



Joachim in their ranks, but the Royals' can point to a long unbeaten stretch at home. No such record for MIDDLESBROUGH, although the 2004 Carling Cup winners should earn victory over a developing NOTTS COUNTY side, in a competition they are a decent bet to win again. CHARLTON ATHLETIC is the destination for

defeats are a rarity, the Cottagers will remember their FA Cup loss to Levton Orient, whilst Wanderers will be anxious to avoid a repeat of last year's 8-3 reverse to Aston Villa in this round.


The tasks get no easier for the remaining dozen Championship clubs, as struggling QUEENS

MILLWALL will hope for a similar outcome, as they are at home to George Burley's SOUTHAMPTON, but with the Saints beating Yeovil Town 5-2 in the last round, they look to be taking this competition very seriously. ROTHERHAM

chance to make an early impact against a misfiring DERBY COUNTY, which his new team may well take. HEREFORD UNITED and cup ties will be forever a mix which brings fear to the opposition, and having beaten COVENTRY CITY already, they will be confident of eliminating LEICESTER CITY, a similarly strong Championship outfit.

ALBION will struggle to topple the Shrimpers. LEEDS UNITED will be equally confident as they host BARNET, a side United manager Kevin Blackwell played for when they were in the Conference. There'll be nostalgia, but it's difficult to see a shock here. Meanwhile, HARTLEPOOL UNITED, at Brentford could inspire another here.

Finally tonight's match here brings together two of the League's brightest managers in Leroy Rosenior and Mike Newell. and, despite the gap in divisions, the good start each side has made means this game could well take extra time to be settled.
