




BENDTNER **HOPING TO EXTEND BLUES STAY**

NICKLAS BENDTNER admitted he would prefer to stay on loan at Birmingham City rather than return to play for Arsenal's reserves.

The Denmark international is on loan at St Andrews until January, having been allowed out by Arsene Wenger to gather first-team experience.

Arsenal have the option of recalling the striker in the New Year, although Birmingham hope to keep Bendtner for the rest of the season after the 18-yearolds blistering start to the season which ahs seen him bag five goals for the Blues.

And Bruce's wish could be fulfilled as the promising hot shot concedes he does not want to go back to Arsenal to



be on the periphery.

"It's Arsenal who decide," said Bendtner. "But I know that they will not call me back unless they have at least got a place for me in the A squad.

"I will not go back to play for the reserves. The least that I should get is a place on the bench."

CHOPRA TAKES SEPTEMBER AWARD

CARDIFF CITY striker Michael Chopra was named September's Powerade Player of the Month in the Championship.

Chopra has been in terrific goalscoring form since his arrival from Newcastle United in August, averaging a goal a game in September, netting back-to-back braces in the Bluebirds' 3-3 draw at Plymouth Argyle and their 4-1 home win over Luton Town.

Also shortlisted for the award were Nicklas Bendtner of Birmingham City. Alan Lee of Ipswich Town and Southampton's Grzegorz Rasiak. Chris Kamara, chairman of the Powerade Player of the Month Awards panel, said: "With so many big-name strikers at Newcastle, Michael Chopra was unfortunately reduced to something of a bit-part role.

"I think moving to a club like Cardiff was the best thing he could have done



and now that he's getting regular firstteam football, he's showing what great potential he has.

"Michael's goals this month have been superb and he is sure to have a big part to play in Cardiff's promotion push this season.



TURNERS DOUBLE DELIGHT

ichael Turner opened his goalscoring account for Hull City in the 1-1 draw with Crystal Palace and felt his late strike got the Tigers the point their performance merited.

Turner headed home a corner from Mark Yeates in the final minute of the game to gain a point that saw City move off the foot of the Championship table and Turner was both happy and relieved after the final whistle.

"Obviously I was very pleased to see the ball hit the back of the net," said Turner. We worked very hard during the game and we felt we could have got more out of it. They didn't have too many attempts on our goal, but we went a goal down. We showed great character to come back and get a point in the end."

City stepped up the pressure in the final ten minutes and missed two or three good

chances before the equaliser arrived.


"I thought for a while it wasn't going to be our day. We've had a couple of other home games that have gone in a similar way to how Saturday was going.

"But I think they only had two or three chances in the whole game and we felt we deserved at least a point."



teve McPhee is desperately eyeing up a return to action after taking the next step on his long road to recovery.

The former Port Vale striker has recently taken part in training with the rest of the City squad, although his work so far has mainly been restricted to running, and McPhee admits a return to full training is still three or four weeks away.

"I've been doing lots of running and squats, working on every muscle in my body. But anything that means I'm back out with the lads is always good," he said. Touch wood, I'll be in full training in three to four weeks. Then I'll just have to take it from there."

McPhee hasn't played for the Tigers since appearing as a late substitute in the 1-0 win at Plymouth in August 2005. Initially, it was a hamstring injury that kept him out of action before his serious knee injury was discovered.

"It's coming up to a year since I had my first operation. It'll be great to get back and hopefully that's not too far away. I've always said that I'm a pretty fit lad and there is only so much you can do running-wise to stay fit. The only way to get properly fit is to play matches. Training with the lads and doing some short, sharp running can also help. The rest will come in time."

Having been out for such a long time, it's perhaps no surprise that McPhee doesn't want to target a specific game to make his comeback, although he admits that when he does finally pull on a Hull City shirt again, there will be a few nerves present.

"There probably will be a few butterflies there," he added. I think that's only natural when you've been out for so long, But I just can't wait for that day to come."



s the move towards qualifications, courses and badges continues to flourish, it seems more and more likely that the days of players simply drifting in to management will become a thing of the past.

That was never going to be the case for Luton Town boss Mike Newell as, probably uniquely, he was set on the path to management before he even started his playing career. That's not strictly true of course but, as a boyhood Liverpool supporter, he was enthralled by the wisdom of legendary duo of Bill Shankly and Bob Paisley.

Speaking shortly after his arrival at Kenilworth Road in 2003, Mike reflected on how those early lessons shaped his own football philosophy: "I got all the videos of the club history and I could listen to Shankly and Paisley for ages because they never complicated the game.

"I watched those videos over and over again. I could listen to Shankly talk about

anything, he was just so enthusiastic. Paisley was more dour but I still listened. He was really cute and clever. He kept everything simple. He would sit in the directors' box. He just let them play and, if he saw something, he would pop down to the dugout, let them know what he'd seen and then go back up. He never flinched or moved a muscle.

"AS A PLAYER, IF YOU'RE GETTING EARACHE FROM THE BENCH EVERY TWO MINUTES YOU SWITCH OFF. PICK THE SIDE AND LET THEM PLAY."

"As a player, if you're getting earache from the bench every two minutes you switch off. Pick the side and let them play. If the players have been listening to me day after day boring them, then when they do have to listen to me on a Saturday they switch off."

Like any good manager, his thirst for knowledge and sound advice remains


unquenchable: "I listen to every word the top managers say and when they contradict themselves I shout at the telly. There are a lot of managers I just can't listen to because I think they're talking rubbish.

"People I like listening to, like Arsène Wenger and Sir Alex Ferguson, don't complicate the game or suggest they've got some rocket science.

> "I don't want to be a coach or master tactician. I have very old-fashioned beliefs about being a manager. The people who are looked up to - like Shankly, Paisley, Brian

Clough, Ferguson, Wenger - are managers. I don't think they see themselves as coaches and tacticians."

It would certainly seem that Mike has not only listened but learned as he is second only to Birmingham City's Steve Bruce as the Championship's current longest-serving manager.

ike Newell was appointed as the Hatters boss in the summer of 2003, returning to the club he had previously served as a player in the mid-eighties.

However, it was in November 2002 when he was given his first job as a manager, at Hartlepool United. He guided them to promotion a few months later, but surprisingly his contract was not renewed. But Luton fans hadn't forgotten him, and gave him a huge welcome back when he took charge for the first time.

Despite the Hatters being in Administration for the majority of the 2003/04 season he led the Town to a respectable top ten finish.

However, his second season at Kenilworth Road was much more memorable as he guided the club to Championship after claiming the League One title.

And despite being tipped by many for an immediate return to League One football, Newell and his side proved everybody wrong by finishing in an impressive tenth place.

uton Town went in to the international break lying in 11th place in the Championship table, having won four and lost three of their ten 2006-07 outings.

Although that doesn't entirely compare to the same time last season when they rose as high as third following their League One title success, **the Hatters** eagerly anticipated Saturday's visit to **Kenilworth Road** from promotion favourites **Birmingham City.**

North End.


Steve's new centre midfield partner is Jamaica international **Richard Langley** who was snapped up in the close season following his release by **Queens Park Rangers**.

A versatile player, his preferred position is central defence, but he can also fill in at a full-back. Injuries in the centre of Luton's defence last season gave Barnett the opportunity to show what he was capable of and he soon made a name for himself in the Championship. The youngster scored the first goal of the 2006/07 season, his first senior goal, when his header after eight minutes against Leicester set-up a 2-0 win.

The midfielder played a key role in helping Trinidad secure their first ever appearance in the Finals of the competition, but it was his performances in the competition itself that made people stand up and take notice of his ability.

Unfortunately, a broken ankle forced him to miss much of last season, although he still managed to score five goals in 17 Championship appearances last term.

However, new Blues boss Jim Magilton made it clear that Parkin would not get regular football at Portman Road and after fees were agreed with both Preston North End and Luton, Parkin signed a three-year deal at Kenilworth Road, costing the club £340,000.

Opposing View

WITH LUTON TOWN STRIKER ROWAN VINE

f it continues unabated, Rowan Vine's electrifying form so far this season may give the Club yet another headache when the January transfer window opens.

However, things haven't always been sweetness and light for the Basingstokeborn striker. Rowan Vine-Vine-Vine may be the familiar sound of the crowd at Kenilworth Road these days. However, Rowan was a little less popular in these parts just three-and-a-half years ago when his spectacular effort for Brentford gave the West London outfit a 1-0 win in Luton, triggering a slide in form that eventually resulted in the Hatters falling out of contention for the League One play-offs.

At the time, Rowan was a 20-year-old rookie forward playing regular league football for the first time in his career.

"I was at Portsmouth when I was younger and I got my first professional contract there," he told Luton's official matchday programme. I made my debut there – a couple of sub appearances, things like that. I went out on loan after that and that eventually brought me here."

Rowan has fond memories of his time at Fratton Park and still vividly recalls the moment when the charismatic player-manager Steve Claridge finally gave him the nod to cross that precious white line in a home Championship match against Sheffield United.

"I was in the squad for a couple of games and I was getting nervous. We were at home at Fratton Park. I'd been warming up all game trying to get on then Steve Claridge has given me the nod with about 20 minutes to go. I just ran on and it was brilliant. There was a full crowd of nearly 20,000."

Claridge is one of football's great wanderers (he even spent four months of his busy 23-year playing career at Kenilworth Road) and now offers equally good value as a media pundit. But what was he like running a football club?

"What you see of him is what you get. He's exactly like he is on the TV now. That was his style as a player and as a manager. When I was there he was player-manager and he's

a 110-percenter in whatever he does. And he's a good laugh as well, a top man!"

Vine's had to wait four months for his next appearance, and by that time Graham Rix had taken over the reigns from Claridge.

Money was being pumped into the club and, with the likes of Croatian World Cup star Robert Prosinecki coming in, Vine's first team chances became increasingly limited. Having failed to score in a further eleven appearances in the 2001/02 season, the new broom Harry Redknapp decided to move Rowan on to Brentford in a bid to find his goalscoring touch.

"I'd been asked if I wanted to go there on the Wednesday. I arrived there on the Thursday but was told that I probably won't be playing because it was only two days before the season started. They threw me in and I scored in the first half hour, so it was just perfect"

Things went pretty well for Rowan at Griffin Park, the goals were coming and he was playing every week. Then a goal drought

kicked in. Rowan scored just one goal in his last 20 games for Brentford – An unwelcome 20-yard cracker against the Hatters!

"It was a 1-0 win. I think I hit it with my left foot and then it hit the post and went in! It was a decent goal as well to be fair, so that sowed the seeds."

It was to be his last goal for the London club. Rowan spent the next season at Colchester United, playing regularly and scoring goals at first, but ended the season with that déjà vu feeling - this time with one goal in his last 15 league matches. Fortunately for Rowan, and for that matter Luton Town, his barren spell had been punctuated by a stunning hat-trick against Coventry City in an FA Cup fourth round replay, which had not gone unnoticed by the Luton scouting staff. Having secured his services on loan, Rowan was swept along on the Hatters tidal wave that engulfed League One that season.

His freestyle, serpentine style of play was the

perfect foil for his strike partner, the legendary battering ram Steve Howard, and their goals helped the Hatters secure the League One title. However, there was a problem. Fortyseven games had taken their toll on Rowan's body, and physically struggling past the finishing post carne at a price.

"I'd always had a nagging back problem, stiffness in the back and stuff like that. All through the season when we got promoted I was struggling with it, from about Christmas time until May. I went back to Portsmouth to try and get it sorted and then the permanent move to Luton came along. I obviously jumped at it, even though I knew I was still struggling. I didn't know the extent of it so I had to see a specialist."

With such slow progress being made, his dream was starting to become a nightmare. The whole town was still on a high and everyone at the Club couldn't wait for the season to start. Self-doubt and anxiety were

feelings exclusive to Rowan at this moment in time, and the Manager was doing some shopping in the transfer market.


"We'd just won the league and we'd kept the same squad and just added a couple of people. You think 'I've signed but


I'm injured but I can't do anything for a good two or three months'. Then you start wondering, especially with the team doing so well at the time, 'Am I going to get back in? If I'm not fit are they going to sign someone else?' But you have to just keep going and when you do get fit just try your best, and that's what I've done since then."

AND WENT IN!

After the trauma and frustrations of this time last season, Rowan has become the rare breed of footballer that actually now looks forward to pre-season training.

"I got a really good pre-season behind me this time to make sure I was fighting fit and my form's carried on. I'm nicking more goals now so I'm more than pleased. Touch wood I hope I don't get injured like that again."












fter a three-year spell with Luton, Brian Horton made his first move in to the world of football management when he arrived at Boothferry Park as player/manager in July 1984.

On the playing front, Horton was a gritty and determined midfielder, who could also operate at the back, he led from the front and inspired greater things from those who played with him. He made 47 appearances for the Tigers in all competitions before hanging up his boots during the 1986/87 campaign, to solely concentrate on management. Horton enjoyed

success in his first year as manager guiding the club to promotion to the old second division which was followed by a sixth place finish in the 1985/86 season, the club's highest league placing for 15 years.

However, the momentum was not maintained and after two disappointing seasons, Horton was relieved of his duties at the club by chairman Don Robinson in April 1988, finishing with a record of 82 wins, 60 draws and 62 defeats from his 204 games as manager of Hull City.



fter coming through the youth ranks at Kenilworth Road, Garry Parker joined the Tigers from Luton in February 1986.

An industrious and creative midfielder. Parker was a glorious example of midfield play at its best. His distribution talents covered the full spectrum from 'one-twos' to cross field passes of, at times, sublime quality. He made six appearances for the England Under-21 side during his career with the Tigers which undoubtedly quickened his exit from the club. Parker left join Nottingham Forest in March 1988 after scoring 9 goals in his 95 appearances in a black and amber shirt but like all good players, when he departed, he left the fans wanting more.

rankie Bunn was another product of the youth system at Luton Town to join the Tigers, seven months prior to the arrival of Garry Parker.

Bunn was brought to Boothferry Park by former Luton team-mate Brian Horton before the start of the 1985.85 campaign where he partnered Billy Whitehurst in the Tigers' attack. However, with Whitehurst moving on to Newcastle a couple of months in the season, Bunn was forced to forge new partnership with the likes of Andy Flounders and Andy Saville. He finished as the top scorer in his first season with the club, scoring 14 goals. However, his next two seasons with the Tigers were not as productive and in December 1987 he left the club to join Oldham Athletic for a fee of £90,000. In total, Bunn made 111 appearances for the club and found the back of the net on 30 occasions.

efore the 1950/51
season got underway,
player-manager Raich
Carter's immediate priority in
the transfer market appeared
to be the acquisition of a
proven goalscorer; he'd
allowed his previous mainstay
on this front, Norman Moore, to
move on to Blackburn Rovers,
in the closing weeks of the
previous campaign.

Whilst not exactly conducting a world-wide search, Carter's scouring did have an international flavour; in the end he went to Scotland and signed a South African from Clyde - Alf Ackerman. A few weeks later Carter carried out another striker raid north of the border and returned with Syd Gerrie from Dundee. By this time Ackerman had firmly established himself in the side and shown his goalscoring skill, having scored a brace on his debut and maintained a steady strike rate

that produced nine goals in the opening twelve games.

Those twelve games also produced 25 goals for the Tigers, yet despite such impressive scoring City's points return was disappointingly low at just 13, a result of having conceded 21 goals. Given that early season analysis, it was surprising that Raich Carter saw the need to acquire another striker in Syd Gerrie – a stopper rather than a scorer would have seemed the more pressing requirement.

Like Ackerman, Gerrie took little time to get amongst the goals, but City's defence still kept shipping them at an alarming rate. By the time the season's mid point was reached the Tigers had won eight, drawn seven and lost six. Another eight wins would be garnered during the second-half of the campaign as well but the gap between draws and defeats

widened with the latter

outstripping the former. If that brief statistical analysis of the second-half of the season suggested there was little of note to report on, then nothing could be further from the truth. Whilst performances on the field dwindled off to leave the Tigers marooned in mid-table, events off it, plus an appealing **FA Cup run**, maintained the supporters' interest.

City began their Cup campaign at home to First Division Everton. If that wasn't an attractive prospect for City fans, the game also had another attraction: the opening of the new train facility (Boothferry Halt) that allowed supporters to travel from the city centre to Boothferry Park in less than five minutes. It was a step up in the facilities provided for fans and perhaps in recognition of the occasion, the Tigers stepped up their performance and pulled off a surprise 2-0 victory, with City's goals coming from Carter and

Gerrie. The same scoreline took the Tigers past Rotherham United at Boothferry Park in the next round with Carter again on the scoresheet but this time joined by Ken Harrison. Their Cup progress was halted though when they surprisingly lost away to Division Three outfit Bristol Rovers.

Interspersed within that FA

Cup run was another helping of transfer activity, one that proved to be both costly and controversial. Having finally recognised the Tigers' defensive frailties, Raich Carter went out and bought a centre-half, not any centre-half mind, but ex-England international Neil Franklin. At £22,500 the cost may seem somewhat insignificant compared with the present day market - in fact it probably wouldn't have covered the fees associated with some of today's transfers. However it did set a new club record, eclipsing the £20,000 paid for Don Revie

back in 1949. The controversy arose from the fact that Franklin had been suspended by the Football Association for breaking the terms of his contract with Stoke City and playing football abroad.

Despite Franklin's presence, the Tigers still failed to shore up their defence; and consecutive defeats in their last six away games removed any benefit gained from the five wins and one draw they'd produced in the same sequence at home. It left the Tigers in tenth place but with a rather unusual and perhaps unwanted memento of the season. The **77 League** and **Cup goals** they'd scored – plus an own goal from a **Luton** defender in the last game of the season – had been shared amongst just six City players. It was the lowest distribution amongst any of the Football League sides that season, and still remains the lowest in the club's history.



A Consistent Figure

hen a side is near the foot of the league table, the goalkeeper is often the first to come in for criticism but Boaz Myhill continues to produce the goods on a regular basis. Despite that form, Myhill was largely a spectator the last time City took to the field at the KC Stadium in the 1-1 draw against Crystal Palace.

The Eagles had just three shots on goal in the entire game and the City goalkeeper felt the main thing for his side was to a<u>void defeat</u>.

"That was definitely the main thing," admitted Myhill. "Scoring so late was a great way for us to end the game and I thought we played very well for the entire second half.

"I felt it was a point gained rather than two points lost to be honest."

The arrival of Danny Mills on loan has helped to tighten up the back line in front of Myhill and the goalkeeper feels his experience has been a valuable addition to the squad.

"I would say Danny is very professional

and very solid defensively. He has an affect on the players around him which is great. That is probably his biggest strength and hopefully he can continue to do well for us."

Michael Turner's headed equaliser set up a grandstand finale with both teams having the chance to win the game during the four minutes of added time.

Myhill, though, was just happy to see City benefit from a last minute goal and felt it was an important point gained.

"It's brilliant to score that late because the opposition will always find it hard to come back from it. I almost wasn't sure what to do after that, whether to try and push for a winner in injury time or try and take the

The draw saw the Tigers move off the foot of the Championship table and Myhill says that gave the side a boost in the changing room after the game.

"It's always a boost to get off the bottom. Nobody wants to be bottom of the league and we don't intend to stay around there for much longer. Now what we need to do is start a long, positive run of results to start climbing away from there."

The major downside to the game against Palace for Myhill came in the 57th minute when former City player Leon Cort put the visitors ahead. It was a goal Myhill felt was predictable before kick off.

Following the draw against the Eagles, the Championship 'enjoyed' a bit of a break due to the international fixtures.

But while some clubs might have had a bit of time to put their feet up, the Tigers have been hard at work

on the training field.
"Training has been the same as normal really.
The sessions have been really good and we just need to take that out onto the pitch with us. We have also been gokarting as a team and that was good fun."

Although the trip to the track didn't unveil the next Michael Schumacher or Fernando Alonso, Myhill says it was a great exercise for team bonding. We have done a lot of team bonding things and the karting was just one of them. The training sessions have been very enjoyable and the spirit in

the squad is very good. Hopefully that can show in our football in the near future."

Having had a couple of weeks without a fixture, City were back in action at Burnley on Saturday, triggering a hectic schedule which will see the Tigers play seven games in 21 days.

Myhill admits it will be a tough schedule, but one that the side will have to accept.

"Obviously during periods like this there

are certain things you can't do. You can't go out socialising and you just have to make sure you eat the right foods and do what we're told to do. You have to keep yourself rested, which means there's not time for walking or shopping!

"We've got a League Cup game coming up shortly as

well, and while I have been at this club we have never got this far in the competition. Hopefully we will continue to be in it and have to endure more fixture pile ups. Despite the number of fixtures coming up, Myhill says he would much rather be playing games than sat at home with his


feet up on a Saturday afternoon.

"I woke up on the Saturday morning during the weekend we had no game and I had all this energy that I didn't know what to do with. I'm sure I was a bit of a pain around the house and it is definitely better to be playing, although it would be better to play every Saturday with only the odd Tuesday night game.

"It would be nice if the fixtures were more evenly spaced as well, especially with the Christmas period just around the corner. At that time you just seem to be exhausted from mid-December onwards."

A Tuesday night fixture is exactly what the Tigers face tonight and with home games seemingly in short supply during the next few weeks, Myhill is looking forward to crossing swords with Luton once again.

"Obviously we'll be looking to try and pick some points up from the game tonight. There are still a few feelings towards Luton from when they pipped us to the League One title a couple of seasons ago. We'll be using that as ammunition to try and take some points off them."

was actually born in Hedon, on the fringes of the city, where he grew up with a passion for the Tigers, and for music.

"I found even at the age of seven that loved music so much," he said. "Whilst my friends bought kid's omics, I insisted on my Mum buying

me music magazines. I loved the Beatles, the Kinks, the Stones..." His passion for music led Henry to head west, as he explains.

"I went to Art College in Liverpool. That's what brought me over here, and since marrying a local girl I've made it my home. All I wanted to do was join a band, so Art College seemed the ideal place and

so Art College seemed the ideal place and Liverpool seemed the right town, with its musical heritage. Living across here, people ask whether I've changed my allegiances to the Reds. As it; though I always want them to do well. It does my head in when people suddenly start supporting a new-found glamour team, and forget where they came from...and the dodgy toilets, the suspect meat-pies and the hearty cups of Bovril at half-time."

It was in Liverpool that he met up with The Christian brothers and went on to form the chart topping band that took its name from their surname. From a chance meeting in 1986 'The Christians' went on to sell records by the millions and still tour to enthusiastic audiences around the world. There have been many highlights for Henry during his life in the band and a few stand out more than others.

"During The Christians own 'golden era' (1987-1994), going straight in at number 1 in the charts with our second album 'Colour'. Achieving triple platinum status for our first album "The Christians" (that's 900,000 records sold), and playing to 100,000 people in Paris supporting Bruce Springsteen.

"However, I have to say I enjoy being in the band a whole lot more these days - not so pressurized, more fun, and we're in charge of our own destiny. Our current album "Prodigal Sons" is out on our own label, and we decide when to record and when to tour, rather than being puppets of the record company."

Liverpool is clearly a hot bed for both music and football but not all Liverpool folk are football barmy as Henry discovered when he tried to introduce his wife to the beautiful game!

"I did manage to get Jackie to one

Hull City match back in the 80's at Boothferry Park. City were 4-0 up with only 20 minutes gone, and she came up with the classic remark "well, we know they're going to win, so why don't they just stop now!!!! She's not a big football fan, as you can probably gather!

Someone who is a big football fan though is Henry's mate Mark Herman, of 'Brassed Off' fame. During the dark days of 1982 with the club in receivership, the pair wrote the Tigers anthem 'The Tigers are Back, which quickly had its perks, as Henry explains.

"Mark and I were privileged to be with the team as they flew out, just days after the song was recorded, to Tampa to take part in the 'Arrow Air Cup'

"Mark was making one of his early films ('A Kick in the Grass') and I was doing the music and managed to blag a freebie. It was a hilarious time, hanging out in the Florida sunshine for 19 days with the likes of Garreth Roberts, Steve McClaren, Stan McEwan, Tony Norman, the late Dale Roberts, John Davies, etc etc

"I also have interesting home video footage of Steve McClaren in bed. Now that he's the England manager I might go public with that....I must have a word with Max Clifford!!"

Henry gets relatively few opportunities to see City in action these days but is no less enthusiastic about following their fortunes. "Unfortunately, despite being a big fan of the KC, I've been that busy in recent years that I just haven't had the time to see City as much as I would have liked. I've lived in Liverpool now for over 20 years, but my mum still lives in Leconfield, so I manage

to get over every now and then, and try and coincide a family visit with a game a couple of times a season.

"I managed to make it to the Sheffield Wednesday game last month.....what a game! It was a match we needed to win, and it looked like the lads' heads were going down when they scored, as the players obviously knew it shouldn't have been a penalty. However, justice was restored soon after, and I'd say that Jon Parkin's second goal was one of the best I've seen at the KC (and I was able to watch it again and again

on video!). Thank you Jon, and to Bo Myhill for some great saves in the second half.

"When I can't make it to the KC, most Saturday afternoons are spent flicking over to Jeff Stelling on Sky Sports and praying when City are 1-0 up that they won't let in a last minute goal as seemed to happen quite a lot last season....actually it was the other way round in the last home game, in

the crunch match with Palace.

"There I was fretting with 90 minutes gone and it looked like Peter Taylor and his crew were going to spoil the party but Michael Turner enabled us to salvage a draw." Finally, returning to music, Henry was able to mention some of the projects he has been involved in recently and some of the artists he has worked with.

"When I'm not working with the Christians, I'm busy working on TV soundtracks," he added.

"I've done music for 4 or 5 Wildlife on One and Natural World films for BBC TV and for various ads. But most of my time is spent as a writer/producer. I gained my first top 3 hit in the chart 2 years ago with Mark Owen's 'Four Minute Warning' single.

"More recently I seem to have worked exclusively with female singers. I wrote and produced the b side of one of Mel C's recent singles and I've just produced 3 albums in the last couple of years for 3 different female artists. Marli Buck (who was on the first BBC 1 'Fame Academy' series but she's much better than that would suggest!): she's currently on tour with Journey South, and going down better than

them!! Her album's due out early 2006.

"Also, singersongwriter Amy Wadge, whose album 'No Sudden Moves' has just been released (and who's getting guite a bit of airplay on Bob Harris's Radio 2 showl. and finally I've just finished

writing/producing an album for Liverpool solo artist Jade Gallagher on Universal Records (www.jadegallagher.com) which is due out in February. She's just started playing live, and has asked me to play keys for her. The first gig was last month in front of 4,000 people supporting Sugababes. I think I was more nervous then she was! As a writer I'm fortunate enough to own my own small recording studio and have been lucky enough in the last 10 years to entice up north more established artists like Cerys Matthews, Mark Owen, Melanie C, Johnny Marr, Ian McCulloch, Suggs, the late Kirsty McColl and others to write

Back On Track

FOR SEVERAL WEEKS, MARK YEATES WAS ONE OF THE MOST FRUSTRATED PLAYERS IN THE CITY SQUAD.

aving signed on a season-long loan from Tottenham two games into the campaign, Yeates was looking forward to having an impact on the Championship.

But a couple of minor injury setbacks meant his league debut was delayed for six weeks, leaving Yeates to watch from the sidelines as the Tigers struggled for form. Now, the Irish midfielder is back and raring to go, a fact that was evident the last time City took to the field at the KC Stadium against Crystal Palace just over a forthight ago.

"It was unfortunate that when I came up here initially I had a couple of injuries anyway," said Yeates. So it was always going to be a couple of weeks before I would play. Then I travelled down to Ipswich with the squad and managed to tear my thigh muscle, which put me out for another three weeks.

"So to finally get into the team and get involved in games is brilliant and it is what I came up to Hull to do. I got my first game against Hartlepool in the League Cup and that got me back into the swing of things."

Yeates made his first league appearance for the club four days after that cup game as a second half substitute in the 2-0 defeat at Queens Park Rangers, a day and a performance that were both instantly forgettable for the Tigers.

"We knew the standards weren't up to scratch that day," admitted Yeates. The gaffer spent the whole of the following week drilling that into us. It's not just about us. The fans don't want to be travelling all that way to see the type of performance they saw that day. We want to repay the fans. Things are turning, though, and the lads who have been out injured are coming back and we have got a strong squad. I'm not sure there are a lot of squads as strong as ours.

"So there's no problem on that side of things. It's just about getting that win under our belts and getting on a bit of a roll. I'm sure that will come."

City put that poor display behind them

with an improved performance against Palace at the KC, a game that saw Yeates making his full league debut for the club.

He was employed on the left wing and caused plenty of problems for the Eagles' defence and overall, he was pleased with the way things went. I thought the game went quite well. I could have got on the ball a bit more but I think I showed a few people what I am capable of doing.

"With myself and Craig Fagan playing out wide, you've got two lads who want to get on the ball and get at people. We have a lot of assets in the team and we just need to get things going."

It looked set to be another disappointing day for City supporters as former Tiger Leon Cort looked to have scored the match winner. But in the dying moments, Yeates sent over a corner to the far post for Michael Turner to head home and earn the Tigers a 1-1 draw.

The Irishman was delighted to set up the equalising goal and admits that taking set pieces is something he had been



pestering Phil Parkinson about.

"It was nice to set the goal up in the last minute. To be fair, on the Friday morning I had been asking the gaffer why I wasn't taking the corners and free kicks. To pop a good one into the box was nice, but it didn't really matter who set it up or who scored it. The main thing at that stage was to get a point on the board. That came and everybody was delighted."

That last minute goal also stalled the Eagles'

hopes of climbing into second place in the league and Yeates felt the Tigers' performance that afternoon TO THE TRAINING showed they are more than capable of matching the best sides in the division. "The main reason I came THE MORALE"

here was to play games, but

I have seen the quality in this squad and I don't think our position in the table truly reflects that quality. Obviously Palace have a strong squad and they're tipped to do well, but on the day we would have counted ourselves very unlucky to come out of the game with nothing. Maybe we could even have taken all three points, but at the end of the day it was a good point and it gave everybody a lift."

Following the Palace game, the international

fixtures meant a two-week break for City and the rest of the Championship clubs. Despite not having a game, Yeates is quick to point out that the Tigers haven't had their feet up and there has been plenty of work put in on the training ground.

"A lot of clubs will probably have had a lot more days off than we had. We had the middle weekend off, but we've had plenty of double sessions during the fortnight and we've all been working hard. There are a lot of games


coming up in the next few weeks and we need everybody in the WHO COMES DOWN squad to be fit and ready to be called upon.

"I think anybody who comes down to the training ground will see the spirit and the morale around the place is brilliant." The Tigers take on Luton Town

this evening as their quest to climb the table continues and Yeates is looking forward to another home appearance, if selected.

"I'm looking forward to it and it's nice to play in front of your own fans. As I said, I thought I did a few decent things the last time we played here and I'd like to do that again. Obviously I hope to be in the team and if I am, I'll go out to try and do what I'm best at. If the fans appreciate that then it will be great."







DANNY MILLS TALKS TO THE TIGERS' OFFICIAL MATCHDAY PROGRAMME



Experience

CONSISTENCY IS SOMETHING MILLS HAS PRODUCED IN HIS APPEARANCES 50 FAR, DESPITE THE FACT HE HAS PLAYED IN DIFFERENT POSITIONS.

n the world of football, the experts say that you can't beat experience and Danny Mills certainly has plenty of that.

Having played in the Premiership, UEFA
Cup, Champions League and the ultimate
stage for every footballer, the World Cup,
Mills has brought a calming influence to the
Tigers' back line since arriving on loan from
Manchester City last month. At the age of
29, Mills is quite happy to be the 'old head' in
the City defence and admits his experience
was probably the reason Phil Parkinson
brought him to the club in the first place.

"My experience is, I think, one of the main things the manager brought me in for," said Mills. "I've been around a bit, I've played an awful lot of football and I can be vocal. "Hopefully I can lend that experience to the side and encourage some of the younger lads. There are a lot of younger players here who maybe haven't faced the kind of situation we find ourselves in.

"It would be nice to go out and play good

football every week if we were near the top of the table with no pressure on us. But in this position it's difficult. It will be backs against the wall sometimes and we have to roll up our sleeves, dig in and grind out some results.

"Unfortunately, that's not great for the fans to watch but we are in a results business. Until you start to win games, the pressure won't come off."

Winning is something Mills felt the Tigers should have done against Crystal Palace at the KC Stadium two-and-a-half weeks ago. A last minute goal from Michael Turner saw City claim a point from a 1-1 draw, but Mills felt that was the least the side deserved.

"I thought we did enough to win the game, so in that respect a draw was disappointing. They only had three efforts on goal in the whole game and when you're bottom of the league, a bit of an iffy refereeing decision and a deflection can


lead to a goal against you.

"But the lads showed fantastic character and kept working hard. It wasn't the prettiest game in the world but we showed an awful lot of character and spirit and got a draw in the end."

Although the late equaliser lifted the Tigers off the bottom of the league, Mills doesn't believe it was a sign of the luck turning in City's favour – he doesn't believe in luck.

"It's not about luck. At the end of the day, you finish where you deserve to finish in the league. Over the course of a season, it's all about working hard and trying to do the right things. We worked hard over the international break and now everybody just wants to play. "We all just want to look forward to the next game and try and get some momentum going.

"We have to try and build some momentum. Since I have been at the club we have had two wins, a draw and a loss. We're starting to turn the corner and we



want to build on what we have. The important thing in this league is to try and be consistent. If you do the right things and work hard, you will get your rewards."

Consistency is something Mills has produced in his appearances so far,

despite the fact he has played in different positions. Mills has so far been utilised at right CENT, BUT THINGS back and centre back, although he feels he can probably benefit the

team more from the middle of defence.

"I'm happy to play in either position and it's a case of fitting in really. The way the manager sees things, I think he prefers me to play at centre half. I feel I can probably be slightly more effective from there. But with injuries, you sometimes have to be flexible.

"I will keep working hard, give what I can to the team and hopefully that will help us to move in the right direction."

A week before the game against Palace, Mills was deployed at right back for the trip to Queens Park Rangers, a game he

admits was a bit of a let down. We were very disappointing down there. I felt for the fans that day because they had made a long journey and having done that, the least they should expect is for the lads to turn up and give 100 per cent effort.

"It wasn't that we didn't give 100 per cent, but things just didn't happen on the day."

One thing Mills did show that day was that he is capable of getting forward to

support the midfield and forwards.

Despite that willingness to get forward, Mills hasn't found the back of the net for over a year now and he admits he wouldn't advise any City fans to put money on him scoring before his loan period ends.

"I wouldn't hold your breath and I certainly wouldn't put too much money on me scoring!" laughed Mills.

"It's an old cliché, but it's all about the team rather than individuals. I'm sure there is the odd centre forward who is quite happy to lose 4-3 if they have scored

a hat trick, but in general every player just wants to win the game.


"It spoils your weekend if you lose. Obviously the goal and the point against Palace was a big one for us ahead of the international break.

"I'm here to do what I can for myself and for the team."

The Tigers take on Luton Town this evening in what should be Mills' third appearance at the KC Stadium and he admits he has enjoyed the 'home' experience so far.

"It has been great playing at the KC so far and the fans have been tremendous. For a Championship side, there is great support and the club has had that for the last four or five years. This is a club with an awful lot of potential and a fantastic fan base. I think the fans have appreciated what we have tried to do so far.






