

RUNSTROM: I'M BJORN TO SCORE

BJORN RUNSTROM apologised to his new Luton team-mates for not shooting them to their first away win of 2007.

The on-loan Fulham striker wasted two glorious chances to fire Luton to a first win away from Kenilworth Road in 11 games, just days after agreeing to join their relegation scrap.

And the kid with boy-band looks is tough enough to take the flak – after leaving home aged 16 to try his luck in Italian football.

“I had three Italian clubs and it was tough over there. It makes you harder, especially when you have to leave home at such an early age,” said Runstrom.

“That is why I can handle not scoring when I have chances. I am sorry because I wanted to make

an impact with my new team-mates.

“I wanted to score the goals and I had two really good chances, but I will score next time.”

It was Leicester's on-loan striker Mark Yeates who opened the scoring, with virtually his first touch in the sixth minute.

That was cancelled out by Dean Morgan in the 33rd minute but Yeates believes the Foxes will have no problems meeting boss Rob Kelly's target of 16 points from their remaining 16 games to stay up. “That is what the gaffer wants from us and I am sure we can get that,” he said.

“It was a great start for me, but not to get the win is disappointing. But we are more than capable of getting what the manager wants.”
