

Lee turns the screw as Luton board come clean

ALAN LEE rubbed salt into Luton's wounds after a nightmare week for the club. Lee scored the first and created the second for Matt Richards as Ipswich condemned the home side to their sixth successive defeat.

Luton, who sacked manager Mike Newell on Thursday for criticising the board, have now lost to relegation rivals Leeds, Hull and Ipswich in the space of eight days.

Newell, who had seen £9 million of stars sold in the past year, hit out after Tuesday's defeat to Hull, saying: 'Where's the £9m

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gone? Someone needs to investigate what's going on.'

The board yesterday said they will detail all transfers on Luton's website tomorrow.

There was a flashpoint after the final whistle when Luton midfielder Steve Robinson had a finger-jabbing confrontation with a fan.

Robinson said: 'I'm passionate and want to win and so is he. But we're both in this together.'
