## WHAT THE MANAGERS SAID



**KEVIN BLACKWELL (LUTON)**  
"I'm trying to rebuild a football club that was on its back. Some people are moaning about this, that and the other but I'm trying to deal with things behind the scenes which people don't know about. "I'm trying to deal with everyone here. I've been in football long enough to know that unless you

are winning in style every week some people won't be happy. I've only had about 17 games here and only been here about three months. I'm trying to rebuild the club from top to bottom and the key word is patience."

**SEAN O'DRISCOLL**  
"I thought we were bright and played some good football, especially in the first half. We stood up to the aerial bombardment in the second half. We've got a few walking wounded with some of the tackles flying in, but when you play football, that's the price you have to pay. Sometimes it's a case of having to take your chances, but there were also a couple of penalty decisions I would like

to look back at."  
"We had one or two injuries in the second half which disjointed us a little bit. We knew they were going to come at us."  
"There are one or two with icepacks at the moment, but the extra day gives them a more than even chance of playing. Steve Roberts got a kick on the ankle, lost a yard so we had to bring him off."
