The design was created by Luton fan Lee Wood, who has helped contribute to this season's matchday programme in a huge way and is also responsible for some of the artwork which the Club produces.

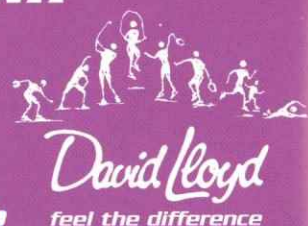

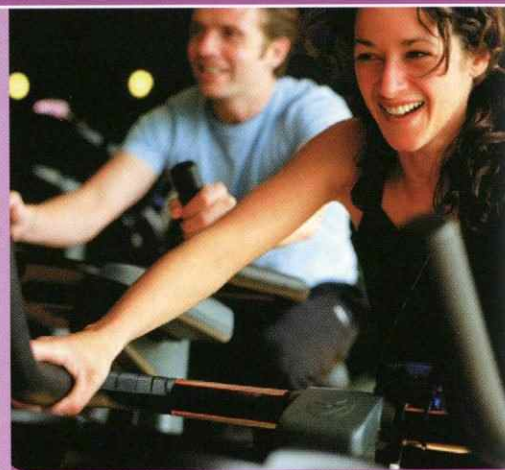

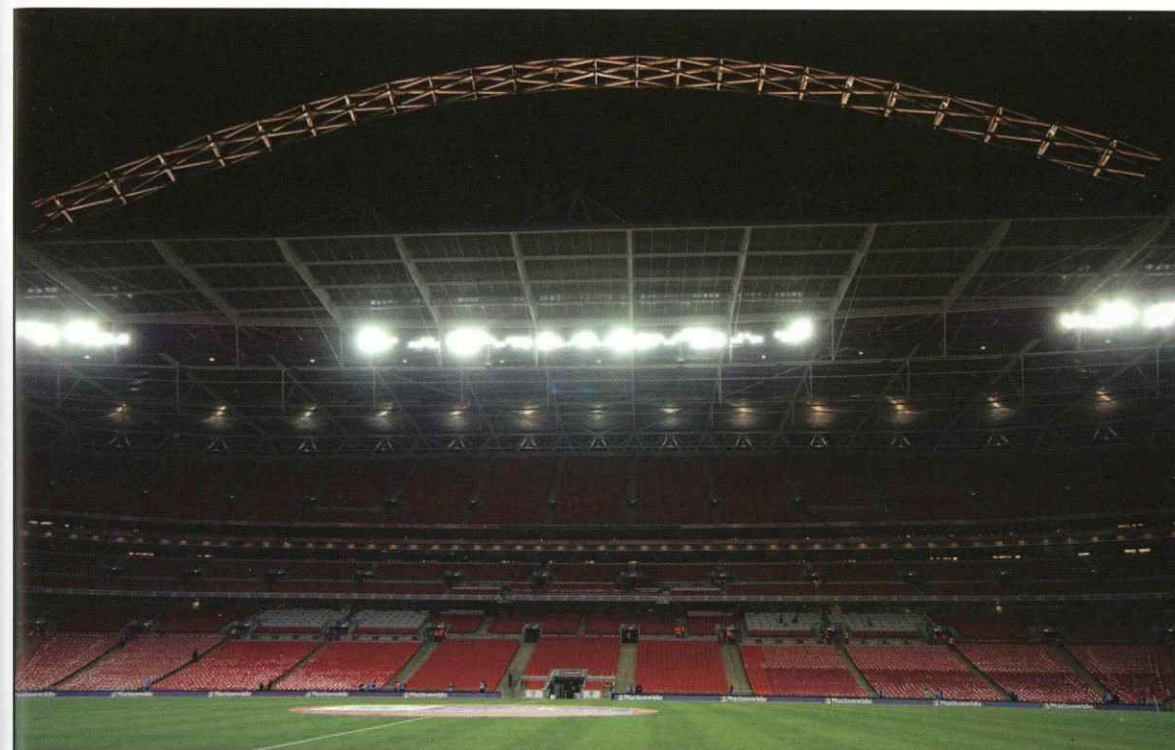

The SWANSEA Story

Beginnings: 1912

Nicknamed "The Swans", the club played from its formation in 1912 (as Swansea Town) until 1925 at the Vetch Field in Swansea city centre. In the summer of 2005, Swansea City moved to a new 20,532 all seater ground, the Liberty Stadium. The early 1980's were Swansea's halcyon years, under the guidance of then player-manager, John Toshack, the Swans gained promotion to the old First Division in 1981, winning three consecutive Welsh Cups and subsequently appearing in the UEFA Cup Winners Cup as well. However, as fast as Swansea rose up the Football League, a decline ensued just as quickly.

Top Player: Curtis



Alan Curtis had three spells with Swansea City in his eighteen year career during which time the club lurched from lows to highs and back again in manic style. In that time Curtis undoubtedly established himself as one of the club's true legends. In total, Curtis made over 360 appearances for Swansea, scoring 96 goals. During his career he also played for Leeds United, Southampton and Cardiff.

Top Manager: Toshack



John Toshack was an immediate success at the Vetch Field, taking them from the Fourth Division all the way to the First Division in three successive seasons. It was around this time that Toshack received an OBE for his services to football. Toshack also had a successful playing career with Swansea and made almost 100 appearances for the Club during a seven-year stay.

Newly promoted to the Premiership, the Blades could be easily forgiven for concentrating on survival, which would ultimately be in vain, as they modified their side for this match. However, the margin of victory was still impressive for the League One visitors, whose goals came from Tom Butler, who netted a brace, and Leon Britton, from the spot. City lost at Ipswich Town in the next round, and missed out on the play-offs.

WELCOME TO SWANSEA

LAST week's visitors to Kenilworth Road may have been five-time European Cup winners, but today's opponents could arguably offer a sterner test than Rafa Benitez's Liverpool.

Another Spanish manager, Roberto Martinez, has been making waves in British football, and his Swansea City side will start today's game as league leaders after an unbeaten run of seven matches.

The Swans have already won six times on their travels this term, scoring a whopping 21 times in the process, and will be in no mood to slip up after being held 1-1 at home by non-league Havant and Waterlooville in the FA Cup last week.

That result was something of a blip in a season that has seen the men from the 20,000-seater Liberty Stadium mount a serious charge for automatic promotion to the Championship.

Martinez - at just 34, making him one of the youngest bosses in Britain - has built on the success of his predecessor, Kenny Jackett, and put together a team that has achieved results by playing attractive and astute football.

Given the Spaniard's complete lack of managerial experience, Swansea's league position is higher than perhaps even their most optimistic supporter might have dreamt of when the ex-Wigan midfielder took charge in February of last year.

Although Swansea fans knew Martinez as a clever and creative player during his time at the club between 2003 and 2006, his performance in the hot seat has been a revelation, and two month gongs and an overall record of winning 60% of games played is highly impressive.

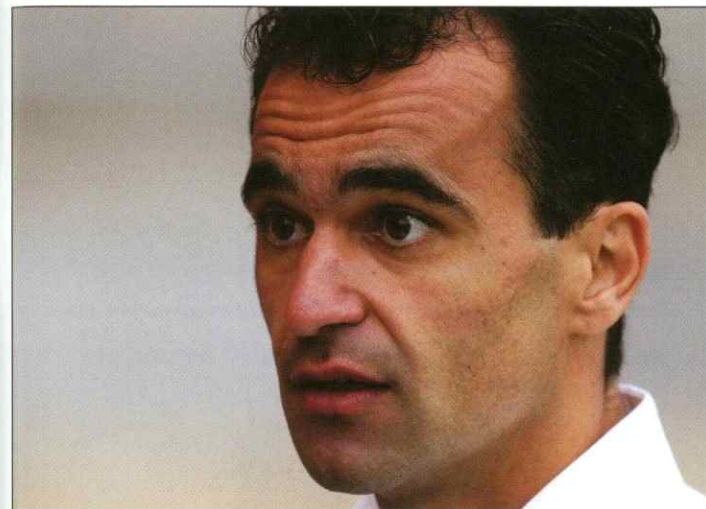

Martinez's philosophy has been geared to attack, and up front Jason Scotland has been a bundle of pace, aggression and, most importantly, goals,

since moving from St. Johnstone last summer.

The Club's top scorer this term with ten in the league and 13 overall, Scotland also won the December player of the month award for League One.

The Trinidad and Tobago international's freescoring form has been complemented by midfielders Andy Robinson and Liverpool-loanee, Paul



Anderson, who have both weighed in with eight apiece in all competitions.

Despite his goals, Scotland has yet to fully convince all Swans' supporters and, after the departure of Lee Trundle to Bristol City at the end of last term, the mantle of fans' favourite has been taken up by Robinson.

A feisty competitor in the centre of the park, the former non-leaguer has a terrific work-rate coupled with the ability to score spectacular free-kicks, such as the one that put Swansea ahead in the FA Cup last week.

Luton and Swansea have produced some classic encounters in past matches, including the Hatters winning a 5-3 encounter in the same season when

Swansea won 4-0 at the Vetch Field.

Luton's most recent memory of an encounter against Swansea came in the Football League Trophy when two late goals, scored by Kevin Nugent and Sam Ricketts, knocked them out of the competition.

All supporters at today's game will be aware that it could be a warm-up for an FA Cup clash, should the two teams win through their respective replays. However, with both sides desperate for points at either end of the league table, Wembley will be a long way from players' and fans' minds this afternoon, in what should be an extremely hard-fought encounter.

How has this season gone?

Excellent. That is the only way to describe it really. We are playing terrific football and we have a fantastic squad of players. The wins over Leeds United and Southend have been particularly impressive. What has been more pleasing for me is that fans are starting to come back and watch Swansea play on a regular basis. There is so much for everyone to get excited about and although there is a long way to go, it's hard not to get carried away that the Championship might be around the corner.

What are Swansea's aims this season?

It has to be promotion now. We have got ourselves into a good position and if we can keep everybody fit then we must be strong favourites to win the title. It would be nice to go up as champions, and I think every Swansea fans wants to see us against some of the best teams in England, which is why promotion is so important.

Who is your key signing?

I have to say I was disappointed when Warren Feeney returned to Cardiff following the end of his loan spell. I thought he had a good spell with the Club and I would have liked to have kept him. Out of our new signings, we have a goalkeeper, Ferrie Bodde, who arrived from Dutch club FC Den Haag and he has had a good season.

Who will be your star players?

It has to be Jason Scotland. He has been terrific for us this season and deservedly won December Player of the Month. He scored five goals in four games during that month and has 13 for the season. He came to us in May this year and has been brilliant this season. I also think Leon Britton has been brilliant and is having one of his best seasons at Swansea for many years.



Who will win League One?

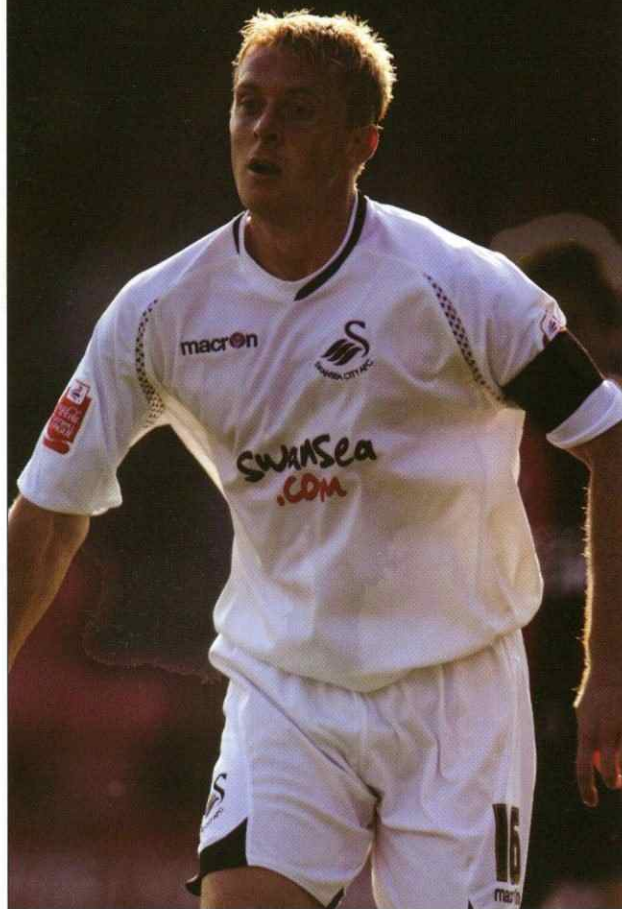
I don't want to jinx it but I have to say ourselves. The only other team that might cause us problems are Carlisle, because they have looked strong. A lot of people have said Leeds and Nottingham Forest, but I haven't been convinced. I have a sneaky feeling that Oldham could be strong and might come up through the play-offs.



The Captain

Garry 16 Monk

Garry joined the Swans at the start of the 2004-05 season after being released by Premiership Southampton, a club he joined from Torquay. He had spent eight years with the Saints, but the central defender found first team appearances hard to come by and spent loan spells at the likes of Stockport, Oxford, Sheffield Wednesday and Barnsley. Monk was ever present in the Swans squad on his arrival and named club captain at the start of last season. But a serious knee injury in the opening game of the campaign kept him out all season before making his comeback with the Reserves in the final weeks of the campaign. Signed a new one-year contract in the summer and is now back to his best in the heart of the defence.



Goalkeepers

Dorus De Vries

The highly-rated 26-year-old started his career at Dutch side Stormvogels Telstar before moving to Den Haag in 2003 and then Scottish side Dunfermline where he earned rave reviews. The former Dutch Under-21 international goalkeeper signed a two-year deal with the club in the summer.

David Knight

Former Youth international, who has represented England at U15, U16, U17 and U18 level, signed a one-year deal with an option to extend. The signing ended manager Roberto Martinez's search for cover and competition for Dutchman Dorus de Vries.

Defenders

Dennis Lawrence

Trinidad and Tobago international defender, who stands at 6ft 7in, and became a national hero in his home country after scoring the winning goal in the World Cup qualifier against Bahrain that took them to the 2006 finals. He joined Swansea in 2006 and has been making his presence felt in the heart of the Swans defence.



Marcos Painter

20-year-old who signed on a three-month loan deal from Birmingham that was made permanent on January 31, 2007. Three months after being called up for the Republic of Ireland Under-21 squad, Painter made his Premiership debut for the Blues when he started against Fulham in a 1-0 win.

Angel Rangel

Right-back who arrived from La Liga side Terrassa in the summer on a performance related contract. Angel had a year left on his contract at the Segunda B club, but jumped at the chance of teaming up with Martinez after turning down offers from a number of Spanish Segunda (championship) clubs.

Kevin Austin

A vastly experienced defender with a huge presence, Swansea is his seventh League club. Austin was previously with Lincoln, Cambridge, Barnsley, Brentford and Leyton Orient, who plucked him from non-league football. The 34-year-old signed a new one-year contract in the summer.

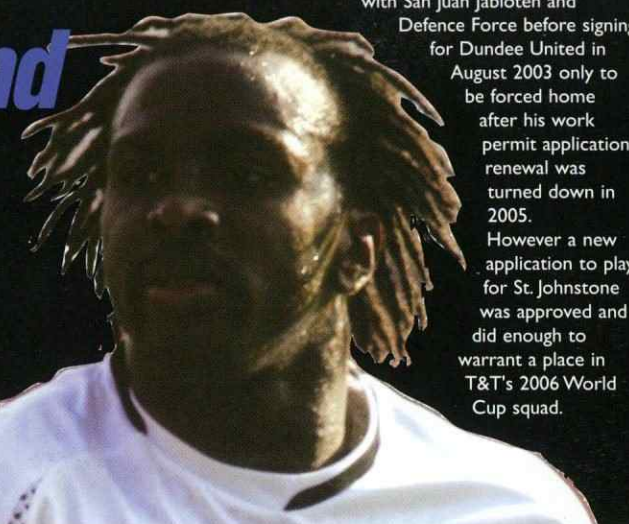
Alan Tate

Having learnt his trade as an Old Trafford trainee, Swansea signed the promising defender in February 2004. He has been a first team regular ever since, playing as a right-back, centre-half, or even as an accomplished midfielder. He also skippered the side for a few games last season.

Top Scorer

Jason 9 Scotland

Swansea signed the 28 year old Trinidad & Tobago international striker on a two-year contract from St Johnstone in the summer after fighting off interest from a number of clubs and gaining a new work permit from the Home Office. Scotland scored 26 times for St Johnstone last season - taking his total to 33 goals in 66 League appearances - and was named in the SPFA's Scottish Division One 'Team of the Year', voted for by the managers. He started his career in T&T



with San Juan Jabloteh and Defence Force before signing for Dundee United in August 2003 only to be forced home after his work permit application renewal was turned down in 2005. However a new application to play for St. Johnstone was approved and did enough to warrant a place in T&T's 2006 World Cup squad.

Midfielders

Ferrie Bodde

Dutch Under-23 international had been with Den Haag for 15 years after graduating through the youth academy to make his first-team debut as an 18-year-old in 2001. Despite attracting interest from the likes of Scottish Premier League side Aberdeen and Swiss champions FC Zurich, Bodde opted for the Swans for an undisclosed fee.



Darren Pratley

The midfielder, who graduated through Fulham's Academy ranks made his first team debut as a 19-year-old in the Carling Cup in September 2003. Spent a season on loan at Brentford before going on to skipper the Swans last season.

Leon Britton

Despite missing half of his first season through injury, he went on to win both the PFA Divisional Player of the Year and the club's Young Player of the Year awards.

Thomas Butler

Joined the Swans in August 2006 from Hartlepool. He has earned two caps for the Republic of Ireland and scored twice in Swansea's FA Cup win over Premiership Sheffield United in January.

Andy Robinson

Former non-league midfielder who has been a consistent performer and ended last season with an impressive 18 goals.

Darren Way

Joined the Swans in January 2006 for £150,000 from Yeovil on a three-and-a-half year deal. The 26-year-old started his career as an apprentice at Norwich and was a consistent performer for Yeovil after joining them in August 2000. Struggled with injury in his first season at the club and underwent an operation on a long-standing shin injury during the summer. Now fit again and currently on loan at Yeovil Town until January 1.

Strikers

Chris Jones

Given his first professional contract in October 2006, just a few weeks after celebrating his 17th birthday, the young Swansea-born striker is highly rated at the club after coming through the junior and youth ranks. Having turned down offers from two Premiership clubs to sign a two-and-a-half year contract he made his senior debut as a substitute in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy tie at Walsall.

Darryl Duffy

Glasgow-born Duffy signed for Swansea after a successful loan spell. He started his career at Scottish giants Rangers as a 14-year-old and came through the ranks to make three substitute appearances - including a Champions League game against Panathinaikos - before joining Falkirk in 2004 where he netted an impressive 27 goals in 55 starts.



Guillem Bauza

Better known as Bussy, the striker became manager Roberto Martinez's first Spanish signing during the summer when the 22-year-old moved from Espanyol on a one-year deal. A regular for Espanyol's B team in La Liga, he is also a former Spanish Under-16, 17 and Under-20 international who started his career with Mallorca. The qualified teacher was an European Championship winner with the Spanish Under-16 team, playing in all six games alongside Liverpool's £27m striker Fernando Torres. He also started all three games for Spain in the Under-20 World Cup in Trinidad and Tobago.

Kerry Morgan

Young Merthyr-born striker who has come through the club's junior ranks to secure his first pro contract at the club. Had a successful pre-season tour of Holland with the first-team where his pace and eye for goal shone through. Currently on loan at Welsh Premier League side Port Talbot where he has already scored two competitive hat-tricks.

Swans sink without a trace

Bob Hatton bursts through on the Swans goal during a match that finally announced the beginning of the 'Pleat era'.

After escaping relegation at the death from the old Division Two in his first full season in charge, Luton manager David Pleat looked forward to being able to choose from a full, fit squad in 1979/80 but early results did not set the pulses racing amongst the Hatters supporters.

An opening day home draw with Cambridge followed by a defeat at Bristol Rovers was certainly not promotion form but a narrow 2-1 win over Orient at Kenilworth Road helped keep away fears of another relegation fight.

Supporters did start to sit up and take notice, however, when the Town went to Leicester, never a happy hunting ground, and came away with a 3-1 win with the fully fit again David Moss scoring a cracker in the final minute to secure the points.

Next up were Swansea, who were visiting Kenilworth road on the back of

two straight promotions and were boasting an unbeaten run of 17 League games without defeat.

Player manager John Toshack was unable to turn out due to injury but his team opened the stronger and in the first minute goalkeeper Jake Findlay needed to come out to make a brave and important save at the feet of the advancing Alan Waddle. Hatters fans feared the worst but were then made to sit back and enjoy a brilliant display of attacking football as Pleat's ideas and tactics came to full fruition.

With ten minutes played Brian Stein was tripped in the box by Swans defender Dave Rushbury with Moss, once more proving he was deadly from the spot, putting the Town one up. Then in the 17th minute a scintillating move involving Alan West and Moss and finished by Bob Hatton was as good a

goal as the wildly applauding, incredulous crowd would wish to see as they basked in the sunshine and reflected glory.

Swansea made a brief attempt at a fight back early in the second half when they pushed Jeremy Charles up front but they were killed off by two goals in as many minutes with the game an hour old. Firstly, West finished off another end to end passing move and this strike was quickly followed by a crashing drive from Hill.

The scoring was not yet complete, though, as in the final minute Moss was crudely brought down by Nigel Stevenson on the edge of the area when through on goal.

The mercurial winger picked himself up and curled in the free-kick past the flailing arms of Swans goalkeeper Geoff Crudgington.

Pleat stated afterwards that his players had done the talking for him and then went away to study the League table which showed the Town in top spot for the first time since 1970.

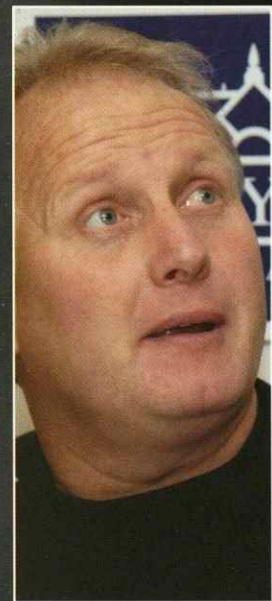

"I do think we could have won. I think we could rue the chances we missed, but what a fantastic performance from the players. Luton produced a splendid performance to take Liverpool back to Anfield for an FA Cup Third Round replay.

After creating numerous chances the Hatters were unlucky to find themselves 1-0 down after 73 minutes.

However, Luton quickly found themselves back level with the Premiership team after a Liverpool's John Arne Riise scored an own goal while trying to prevent Dave Edwards from scoring.

The Hatters were keen to quickly show their opponents that they were as capable of creating chances and when Edwards picked up the ball without a Liverpool defender in sight, most people in the ground were holding their breath.

The Welsh international struck his effort well enough but he was denied by a block from Charles Itandje.

An entertaining first-half came to a close when David Bell wrapped his foot around a free-kick from 25-yards out however his shot failed to trouble Itandje in the Liverpool goal.

After 73 minutes, Chris Perry misjudged a header and substitute Andrei Voronin pounced, however he couldn't find a way past Dean Brill who was quickly off his line to close down the threat. The ball though deflected in to the path of Peter Crouch who slid a slot home from close range to open the scoring.

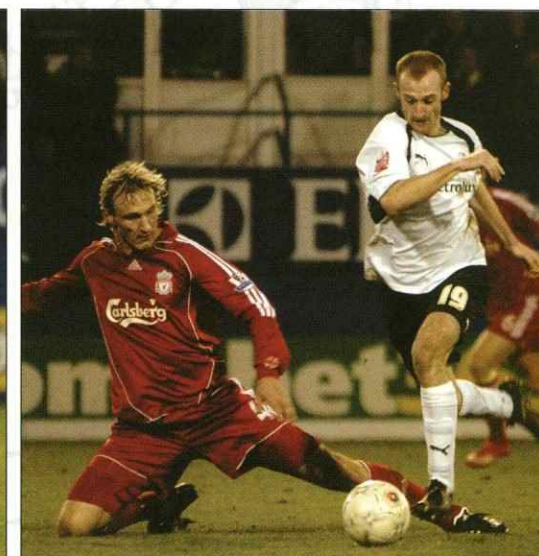
The lead though was short lived as another dangerous cross from Drew Talbot from the left forced Riise to lunge in at the near post but all the defender was able to do was to turn the ball past Itandje's near post for the equalising goal.

Both teams continued to press for a winning goal and at the other end, Andrew won a header on the edge of the Liverpool box to tee-up Edwards to try his luck with a dipping volley which whistled frustratingly over the bar for the Hatters.

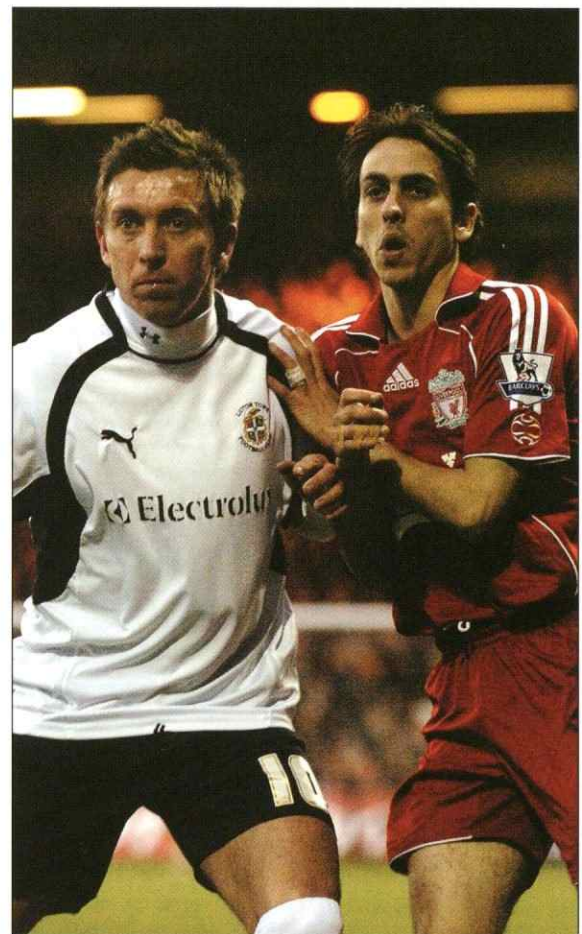

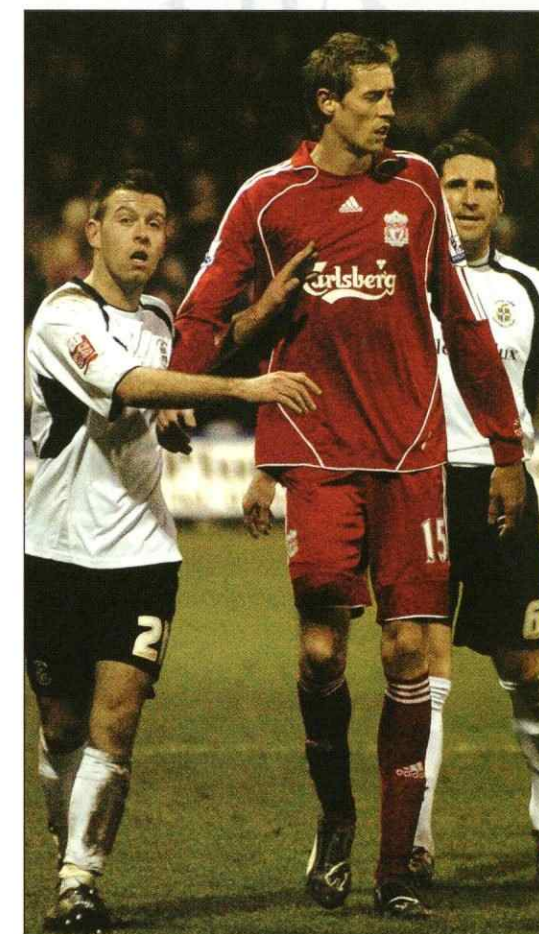

SIMON PITTS finds some fascinating facts about today's teams

SIMON'S STATS



23 The number of times Swansea, as either Town or City, have played a league match at Kenilworth Road. It's 16 wins for the Hatters, four draws, and just three defeats. Luton have scored 71 goals, and conceded 25.

5 Is the biggest margin of victory for the Hatters, and it has happened twice. In January 1923, Syd Reid scored a hat-trick, which was half of Luton's tally in a 6-1 win. Harry Higginbotham, Syd Hoar and Billy Clarkson were the other scorers. In September 1979 Luton scored five without reply. The Hatters moved to the top of the table after the win, which was started, and ended by David Moss scoring! His first was a penalty after just ten minutes, before Bob Hatton added a second just seven minutes later. Two goals in as many second half minutes for Alan West and Ricky Hill meant Luton were coasting, before Moss netted his second in the final few minutes to seal a 5-0 win.

17,479 The biggest attendance for this fixture saw Luton win 2-0 back in September 1953. It was Luton's first win of the season, at the sixth attempt, courtesy of goals from Johnny Downie and Bert Mitchell.

9 The highest scoring match between the two sides at Kenilworth Road saw Luton winning 6-3 in February 1939. Hugh Billington scored eight hat-tricks during his Luton career, and in this match he netted four times. The other scorers were Charlie Clark and George Stephenson.

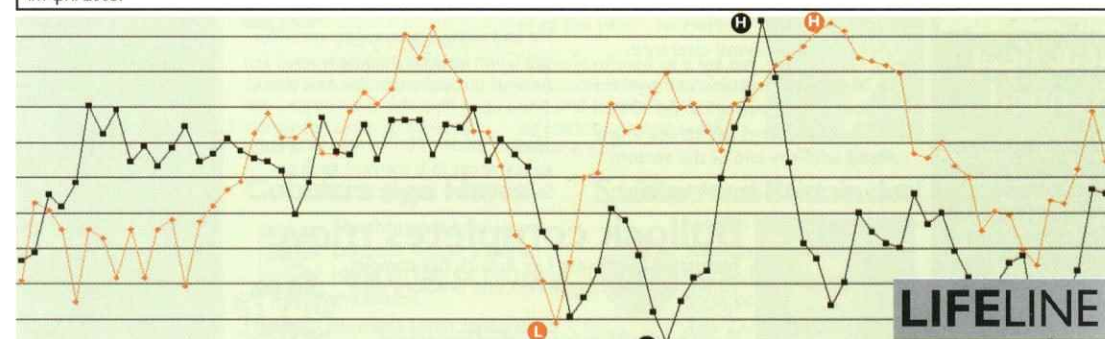
1 The number of goal-less draws in this fixture, and that was in the 1924/25 season. The other three draws have all ended 2-2. On the opening day of the 1951/52 season Jack Taylor and Bert Mitchell scored as the sides shared the points. In March 1961 it was a Gordon Turner penalty and an own goal, whilst in October 1980 Luton had to twice come from behind to earn a point, courtesy of goals from Brian Stein and David Moss.

5 The number of Luton hat tricks in this fixture. Two have already been mentioned, with Syd Reid in 1922/23 and Billington in 1938/39. On Boxing Day 1950 and Willie Havenga scored all three goals, including a penalty, in a 3-1 win. Havenga had actually scored the previous day in the meeting between the sides at Vetch Field, a game the Hatters won 2-0. His run against the Swans continued the following season when he scored again in a 3-0 away win. Havenga scored six goals in eighteen league appearances for the Hatters, and amazingly five of those goals were against today's opponents...oh and the other was scored against Cardiff City! Like Havenga Ron Davies also scored all three in a 3-1 win, this time in 1962/63. The same scoreline was repeated for a third time as Paul Walsh netted the third league hat-trick of his Luton career in April 1983.

Each way movers

2 As Swansea Town two players made the move from the Welsh side to Luton, but you have to go back to the 1920's! Gilbert Brookes made 43 appearances in 1924/25 for the Hatters, whilst James Miller appeared just eleven times the following season, but did score three goals, including on his final appearance for the Town against Charlton in April 1926.

3 The number of players to have transferred to Swansea, and two of these were in the 1970's. Keith Barber kept goal over 150 times for Luton after his move from non-league Dunstable Town. Barber's last match for the Town, against Notts County in November 1976, ended after 70 minutes as he broke ribs and had to be substituted! Phil Boersma averaged a goal every four games, with eleven goals in 40 matches for the Hatters, with all but one appearance coming in the 1977/78 season. Adrian Forbes was one of several players to join Luton in the summer of 2001. Forbes made 79 appearances and scored 2 goals, including one against today's visitors in October 2001. "He joined Swansea on a free transfer in June 2004, and made over 80 appearances in two years, before moving onto Blackpool. Forbes will be remembered by Swansea fans for scoring their last ever league goal at the Vetch Field in the 1-0 win against Shrewsbury in April 2005.



Hatters and Swansea past...

THIS week's **LIFELINE** shows how Luton and Swansea's fortunes have risen and fallen over the years. Swansea's high point came when they finished sixth the old Division One in the 1981-82 season. Their low was in 1974-75 when they finished just two places off the bottom of Division Four, escaping relegation by just seven points. Luton's low point came with a 17th place in Division Four in 1966-67 and their high a top flight 7th place in 1986-87.

Mackie, who has scored in 11 of his last 12 Blue Square Premier games has been attracting the attention of a number of Football League clubs.

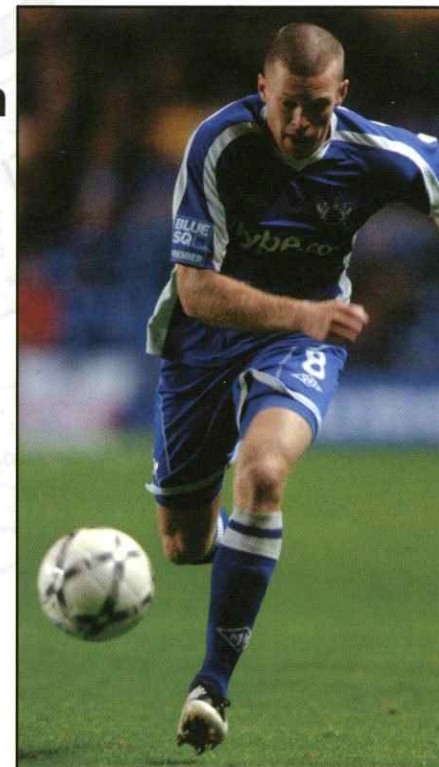
"(They have had) a number of bids from a num-

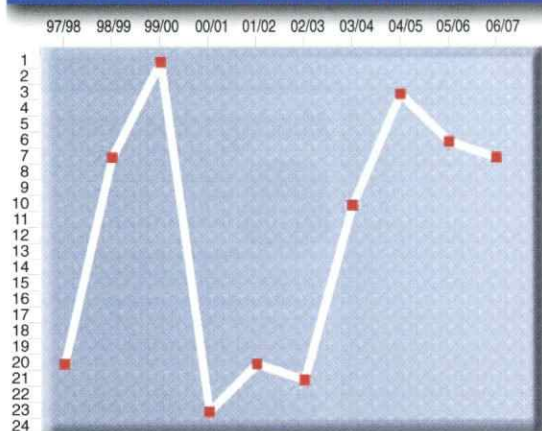

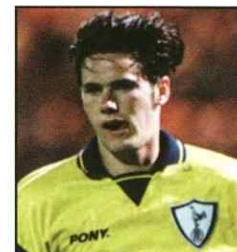

Jaroslav Fojut was given a standing ovation after his last game on loan from Bolton. But who were the top ten "loan stars" to pull on a Luton shirt? DENIS O'DONOGHUE makes some suggestions.

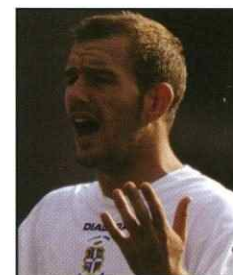


RORY ALLEN rode into town from Spurs in 1998 like the "Loan Ranger", as Luton stared into the relegation abyss. Eight games later, he rode out again with Luton safe and his name enshrined as the Hatters' best ever loan signing.

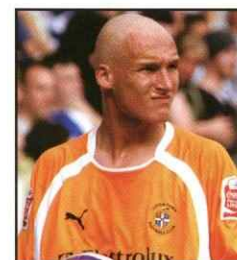
Luton were 23rd in Division Two with eight games to go, so when ex-Town boss David Pleat, then Spurs' Director of Football, suggested Allen, who was recovering from long-term injury, Lennie Lawrence, desperate for goals, took a gamble.

Allen, 20, made one and scored another on his debut at Walsall. He followed that up with five more goals in the final seven games as Luton avoided the drop.

Second spot goes to **ROWAN VINE**, who spent the 2004-05 championship-winning season at Kenilworth Road on loan. Mike Newell liked his unselfish running and workrate, and although Vine scored only nine goals, the "assists" he provided were phenomenal.



RICHARD MONEY also signed for the club permanently, but initially arrived on loan from Liverpool to boost David Pleat's 1981-82 push for the Second Division title. "Truck" slotted in at left-back as Town finished off the last 13 matches with eight wins and five draws.



JAROSLAW FOJUT comes in at number four. The Polish youth international's performances have warmed the heart this season. He contributed immensely to the meanness of Luton's defence and chipped in with some

vital goals.

KERRY DIXON arrived back at his home-town club in 1993 at 32, 15 years after being rejected by the Hatters, on a long-term loan from Southampton. He made 17 appearances and chipped in with only three goals, but his partnership with Phil Gray ensured Luton finished out of trouble.

How Luton would have loved to have signed "The Little Sheff"! **GARY MCSHEFFREY** arrived from Coventry during the administration period of 2003-04 and banged in nine goals in 19 appearances, before returning to Coventry because of the transfer embargo.



Love him or hate him, **TONY THORPE** was an influential player at Kenilworth Road during his spells. His first loan period from Bristol City, again at a time of off-field turmoil, was in the 1998-99 season. Thorpe's four goals in seven games averted any relegation threat, while **SEAN DYCHE**, who also arrived from Bristol City, tightened the defence in his 14 games.

The last two players in the list are goalkeepers who suffered contrasting fortunes at Kenilworth Road. **TONY GODDEN** arrived from West Bromwich Albion to replace the injured Jake Findlay in 1983. He played in the last 12 games, memorably keeping a clean sheet at Maine Road as Luton stayed up.

STEVE SUTTON also figured in a relegation fight but one that was lost, in 1991-92. David Pleat wanted to sign him permanently but the board at the time wouldn't sanction the deal. So, after 14 games, Sutton returned to Notts Forest..

Injury hit Town suffer Wycombe loss

Luton boss Chris Cummins said: "We were missing a few key players, but I thought Scott Sinclair was the best player on the pitch and on another day he could have had a hat-trick.

"It's a great learning curve for these lads. The difference was that Wycombe were more clinical in both boxes, they had three chances and scored three goals.

"I'm looking forward to seeing how the boys react now, especially some of the Under-16 boys because it's a higher level of football for them."

McVeigh grabs a brace as Parkin returns to action

Luton stroled to comfortable reserve team win this week as Paul McVeigh bagged a brace against Stevenage Borough at Kenilworth Road.

But more importantly for the Hatters was the news that Sam Parkin completed his first taste of competitive action since August, coming through 45 minutes of the game.

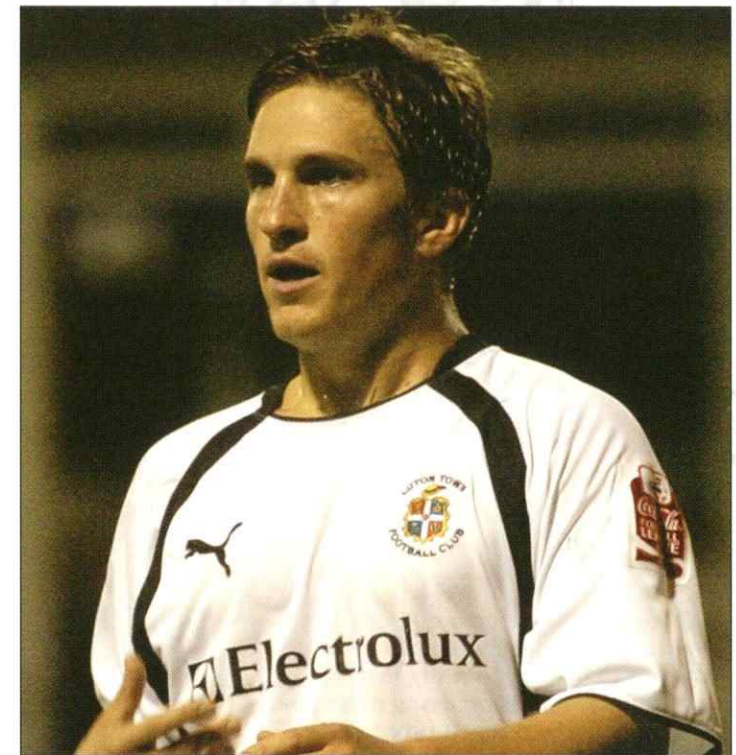
The Luton striker has been out on the sidelines since the win over Dagenham & Redbridge in the Carling Cup, but has battled back from his latest setback.

The Hatters named a very strong side for the visit of their Hertfordshire opponents with Don Hutchison, Steve Robinson, Marlon Beresford, Lewis Emanuel and Paul McVeigh all included in the starting line-up.

The Hatters also named Dean Morgan in the side after returning to Kenilworth Road from his loan spell at Southend United.

Luton dominated most of the early proceedings and nearly took the lead in bizarre circumstances on six minutes when Dean Morgan's free-kick was almost turned into his own net by Damian Bratt.

Although Stevenage were being pinned back in their own half, they did on occasions put pressure on the Hatters defence and when a mistake by Ed Asafu-Adjaye on 16 minutes allowed Tyron Sealey in the clear, the midfielder should have done better as he fired high and wide of Beresford's goal.

Luton deservedly opened the scoring with the next attack of the game when, on 19 minutes, Hutchison fired home a volley from six yards after Stevenage goalkeeper James Russell failed to collect a McVeigh corner.

Stevenage striker Zak Burke was put in the clear on 23 minutes, but wasted a golden opportunity when he hit a 20-yard effort straight at Beresford, and that miss was to prove costly as Luton scored twice before the interval.

The Hatters had created plenty more chances before McVeigh grabbed his first of the game on 40 minutes, as the former Norwich striker headed into an empty net after Rob Sinclair had put the ball back into a dangerous area when Morgan's cross reached him at the back post.

Stevenage's defence crumbled before the half-time whistle as Luton added a third on 43 minutes when, after Parkin slipped out a pass to Sinclair on the wing, the midfielder whipped over a beautifully weighted cross that was dispatched by the

oncoming run of McVeigh.

The second-half saw Luton start in a positive frame of mind and they made the perfect start when some good work down the left by McVeigh saw the ball reach Morgan in the centre and he displayed some fine work to bring down the cross on his chest and fire and half volley past the despairing dive of Russell.

Peter Vincenti rattled a post for Stevenage as the visitors refused to give up on the game. They also came close on 65 minutes when Burke dragged his 20-yard shot wide of the goal after fine by Matthew Wells.

Stevenage's pressure finally found some reward as they grabbed a late consolation through a Batt penalty after defender Liam McDevitt was sent tumbling in the penalty area under a challenge from Asafu-Adjaye.

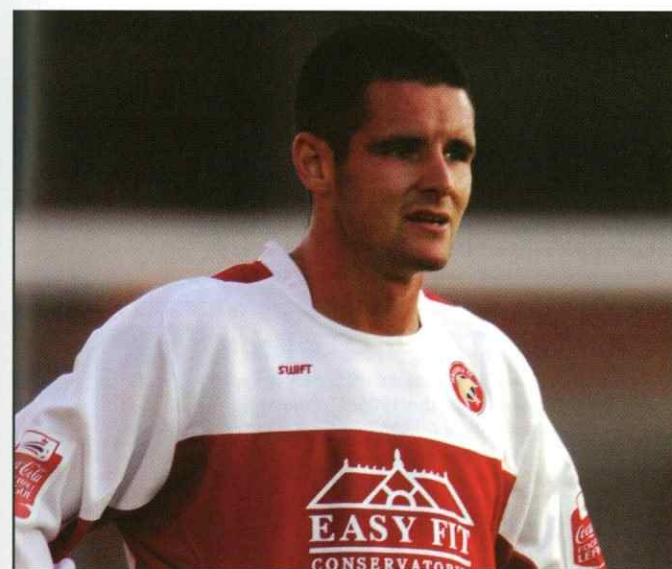

A
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William (Billy) Reid STARK

Scottish centre-forward Billy was one of that rare breed who played for both Rangers and Celtic although his appearances for each were limited to the reserve team. He did, though, boast an excellent strike rate at all his six League clubs, starting with Crewe in 1960, showing pace as well as good heading ability for someone who was not particularly tall.

Billy moved to Luton from Colchester in September 1965 in exchange for Ted Phillips but after nine League appearances and three goals he was surprisingly loaned out to Corby. He was back in the Football League the following season with Chesterfield before finishing up at Newport a year later.

Billy now lives in Chesterfield and is a retired project manager for an opencast mining company.

Alan William STARLING

Although he was born in Barking, goalkeeper Alan was raised in Luton and joined the Hatters from school before signing professional forms in April 1969.

As a 17 year old, Alan was given his League debut on Good Friday 1970 in a home clash with Rotherham, replacing the out of form Sandy Davie, and after a nervous start won the Kenilworth crowd over and kept his place for six games before being injured.

Alan was handed the shirt on the opening day of the following season but was partly at fault for the 0-4 defeat at Bolton and did not appear for the Town again.

This snub did not affect Alan overmuch as he went on to make 350 League appearances for Northampton and Huddersfield and even managed a goal from the penalty spot for the former.

Alan now lives in Mount near Huddersfield.

Alan William STEEN

Alan made a scoring debut for Wolves as a 16 year old in 1939 and was looked on as one for the future but the outbreak of war obviously halted his progress.

Reported as missing during the war after a bombing raid over Germany in 1943, it subsequently transpired that he had been captured and spent the rest of the hostilities as a POW.

A speedy winger, Alan signed for Luton in exchange for a 'four figure fee' in 1946 and played ten of the first eleven games of 1946/47 on the wing for the Hatters before losing his place to new signing Dally Duncan. Alan later went on to give good service to Aldershot, Rochdale and Carlisle and now lives on the Wirral in retirement.

Brian STEIN

One of Luton Town's favourite sons, Brian is second only to Gordon Turner in the post-war scoring charts and formed magical partnerships with the likes of Bob Hatton and Mick Harford during his long stay at Kenilworth Road.

Born in South Africa in 1957, Brian was brought to England as a seven year old as his family fled the apartheid regime and was playing for Edgware when he was recommended to the Hatters in 1977.

Possibly the best finisher the club has ever seen, Brian helped the Town to the top flight in 1982, picked up an England cap and scored twice in the magical Littlewoods Cup final win over Arsenal in 1988.

Surprisingly allowed to move to France that summer, Brian did return to Luton in 1991 before finishing his first class playing career at Barnet.

Brian left Kenilworth Road last summer for the third time after a spell as Mike Newell's assistant.

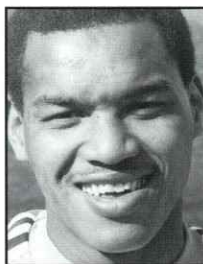
Earl Mark (Mark) Sean STEIN

Brian's younger brother Mark joined Luton as a junior before signing professional forms in January 1984.

After making his Hatters debut in 1984, Mark had to wait until the 1986/87 campaign before earning a regular place in the side when he showed speed off the mark, excellent ball control and an eye for goal.

A bid of £300,000 from QPR in 1988 was too good to turn down and the tiny striker than began a tour around the country taking in spells at Oxford, Stoke, Chelsea, Ipswich and Bournemouth scoring regularly wherever he went before returning to Kenilworth Road in 2000.

The Town turned out to be his last League club and after studying for the necessary qualifications, Mark is now physio at Barnet.



Kirk William STEPHENS

After spending four years on the books of his local side Coventry as a schoolboy, Kirk was told he was not good enough and joined non-League side Nuneaton then managed by David Pleat.

When Pleat took over the hot seat at Luton one of his first signings was all-action overlapping full-back Kirk, who was soon nicknamed 'Basher' by the Kenilworth Road faithful.

After making his League debut on the opening day of the 1978/79 campaign, Kirk was virtually ever present over the next six seasons before returning to his first love Coventry and then having to quit the game through injury two years later.

Kirk still lives in Nuneaton working in the family business and also works on Coventry City match day radio.

Danny Robert STEVENS

Enfield born Danny joined Tottenham as a trainee from school but failed to make the grade at White Hart Lane and was glad to accept an offer from Luton to move to Kenilworth Road in March 2005.

Only 5'4", Danny makes up for his lack of height with excellent ball control, speed and no little bravery and after some excellent displays in midfield for the Luton reserve team he was handed his League debut, coming on as substitute at Burnley in the final game of the 2005/06 season.

Sadly, Danny was not given any further chances for the Hatters and joined Torquay in the summer of 2007 where he is hoping to help his new side to promotion back to the Football League at the first time of asking.

Morris John STEVENSON

When Luton Town entertained Morton in a friendly in October 1968 it transpired that all the Scottish team members were in the shop window. The Hatters were impressed with inside-forward Morris leading to him signing for £5,000 a month later.

Morris made his League debut in a 0-1 defeat at Hartlepool in December 1968 but the following week manager Allan Brown was dismissed with the new man at the helm, Alec Stock, wanting his own men at the club.

Morris remained at Kenilworth Road as a squad player until 1970 when he joined Dundee United. He enjoyed three years at Tannadice before ligament damage left him on crutches for nine months and with it the end of his career.

After working as a driver for a Tranent, East Lothian candle firm for 30 years, Morris took early retirement in 2006 due to ill health.

Jude Barrington STIRLING

After joining Luton from school, Jude signed professional forms for the Hatters in July 1999.

A tall central defender or defensive midfielder, with a huge long throw, Jude was unfortunate to be dismissed on his League debut at Swansea in September 2000 but went on to make a further eight appearances that season as the Hatters were relegated to the football basement.

When it became obvious that new manager Joe Kinnear wanted a complete shake up of playing personnel at Kenilworth Road, Jude joined Stevenage in February 2002 and then went on to play for several non-League clubs before re-entering the Football League with Oxford and subsequently Lincoln and Peterborough.

Jude is now a mainstay in the MK Dons defence.

George Campbell STOBART

Strong, stocky striker George joined Middlesbrough from Netherton in 1939

and banded in a remarkable 125 goals in 168 games for Boro during the war years.

In peacetime, George moved to Newcastle for £4,650 in 1946 and assisted the Magpies to promotion to the top flight two years later before Luton broke their transfer record to take him to Kenilworth Road for £11,500 in October 1949.

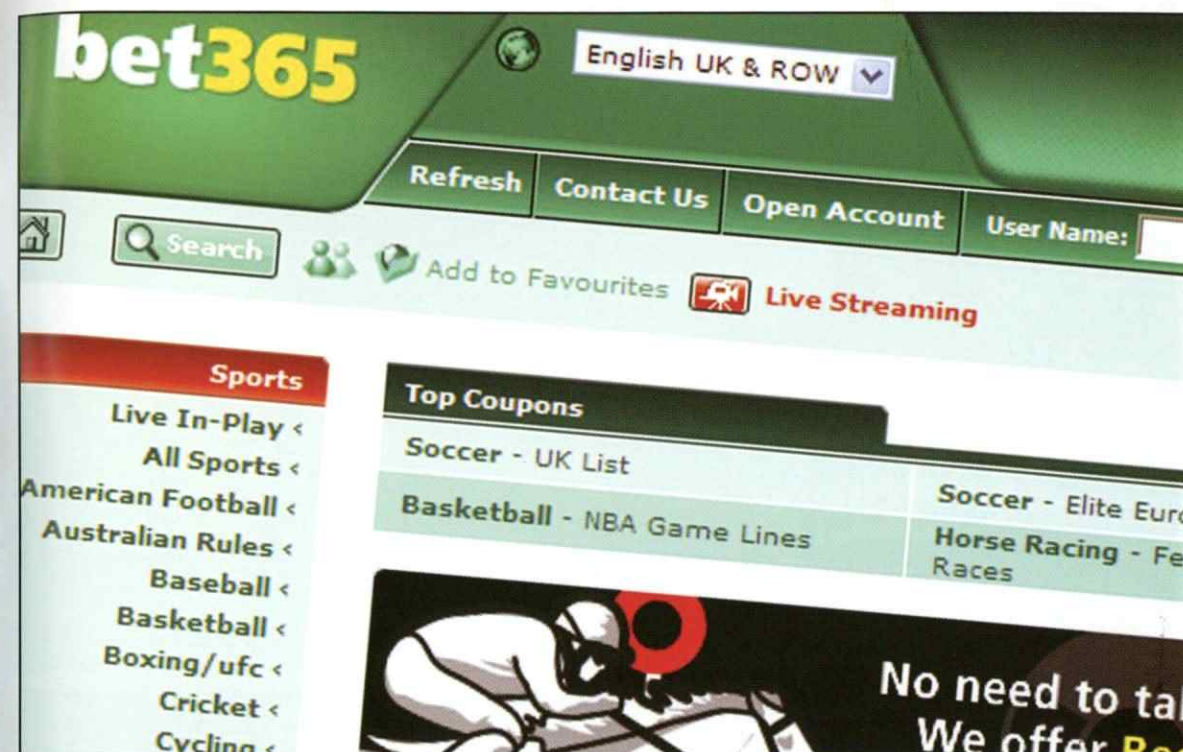
A month after joining the Hatters he scored four goals in eight minutes during a 5-2 home win over Blackburn. His experience then helped the Town get through a couple of sticky seasons as they built for the future.

Job done, George transferred to Millwall in 1952 before moving across London to Brentford two years later. He finished his playing career at Bedford before going back to Newcastle where he lived until passing away in 1995.

Bet365 gets a brand new look

Visitors to www.HattersBet.co.uk will have noticed that the website has had a new look. Hatters Bet is powered by bet365, Luton Town's official online bookmaker, who also looks after all of the betting websites for clubs in the Football League interactive network.

Following a review of their operations the decision was made to remove club specific branding for each site, in order to provide a more efficient service across the bet365 network.

Already in recent weeks we have seen the benefit of this with LutonTown.co.uk able to carry the latest betting odds for a variety of matches, not just the Hatters.

In addition to this bet365 have been able to stream matches live to support their betting in-play market, the most recent being Israel's victory over Russia in the World Cup qualifiers that only proved to prolong England's agony for a matter of days.

The only downside to this change is that you have to do a bit more surfing to find the odds for Luton's next match (it used to be accessible from a short cut on the homepage).

To now get to them you have to click on 'Soccer' from the left hand menu, then click on 'Show Page Dropdowns'.

Next scroll down to 'Match Betting' and then choose the relevant game from the dropdown list. You will then be able to see all the markets available for our next match (usually 24) from predicting the full-time result all the way through to guessing how many corners there will be.

Now, unless you are a betting man, or lady for that reason, a lot of what bet365 has to offer won't mean very much. It has never been the Club's intention to convert you all into gamblers, but to be able to provide a betting service for those who are interested in the odd flutter, that will benefit Luton Town.

At a time when you may be looking to do what you can to help the club, if you are currently betting with other online bookmakers then this is one way in which your support will benefit the Town, and if you know what you are doing, it will of course continue to benefit you too.

You can ring up bet365 on 0800 0323 365 and use their telephone service. When placing a bet in this manner you will be asked for your Name, Date of Birth and Credit Card details. Please have this information to hand when you phone.
