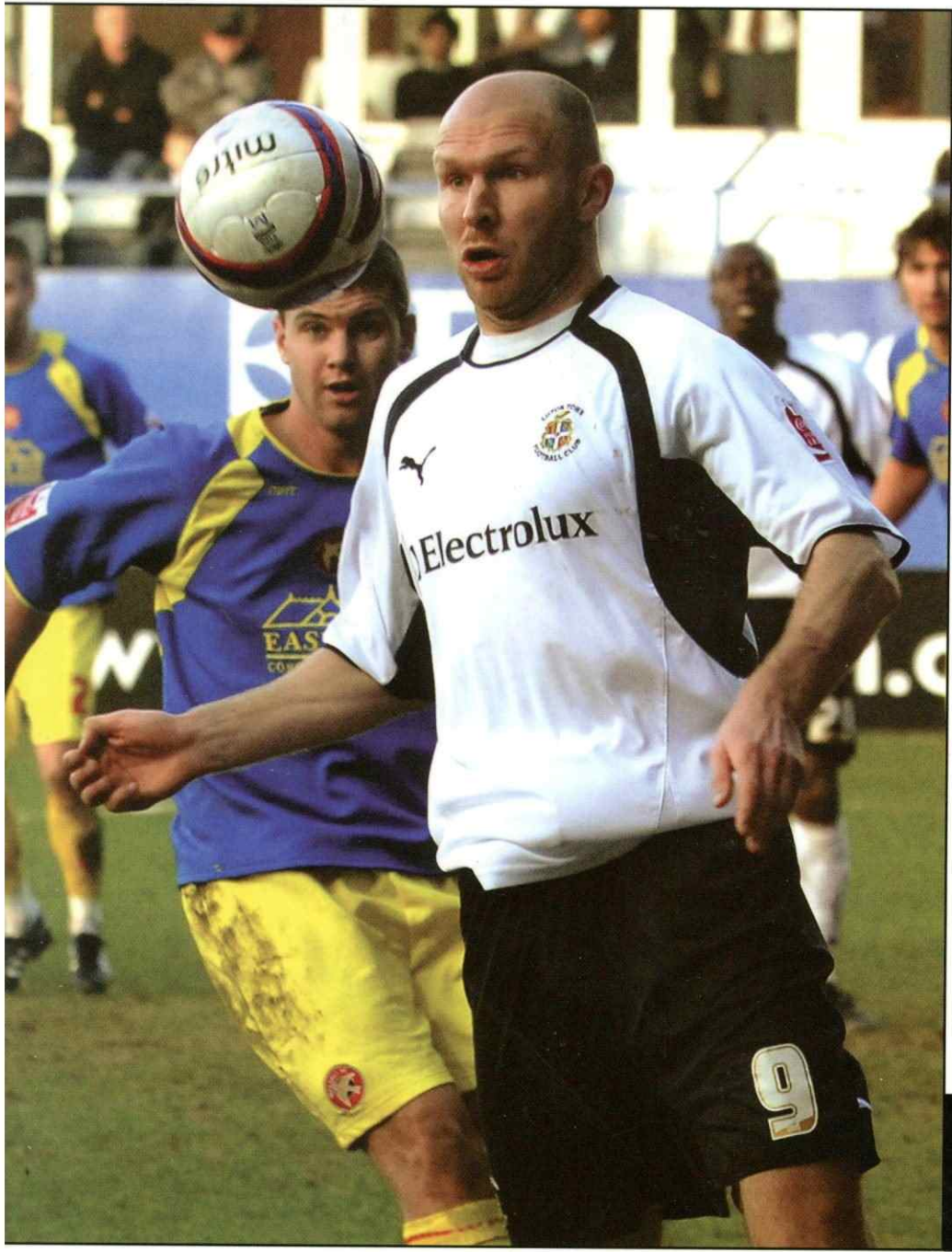

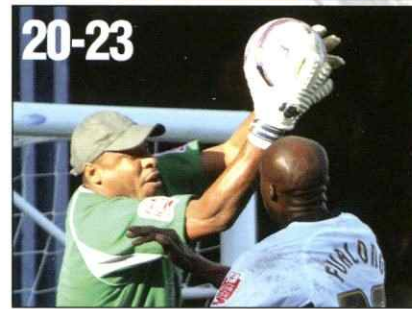

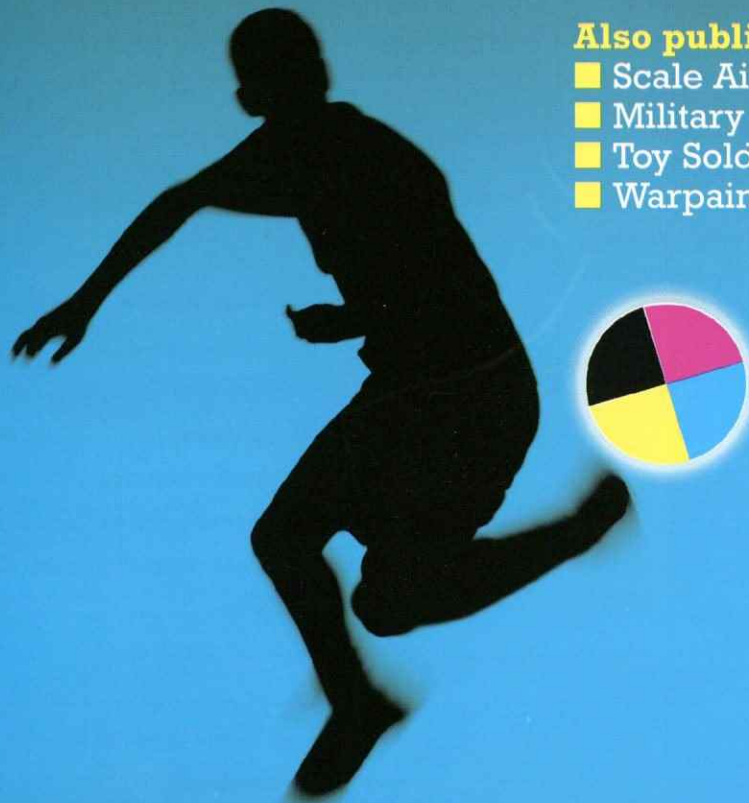

Good afternoon and thanks for coming along to join us at Kenilworth Road for the match against Oldham Athletic. Oh, how we could do with a win to lift morale and, judging by our second half performance at Carlisle on Tuesday night, perhaps today could be the day to get it!

Off the field, we are continuing to do what we can for the future of our beloved football club, but we are still not in control and we have only actually been working within the stadium for just over two weeks, not a long time at all.

There is an enormous amount of work to do because, understandably, no key decisions - apart from the obvious survival issues - have been made since November when we entered administration. That work includes

sorting out a host of details concerning next season - urgently.

A vital part of our attention is focused on the Football League, our creditors and getting out of administration as soon as possible. I have to say it is mighty tough. What's more, we have to give certain parties a set period of time or notice and that means our hands are often tied, when we would really like to move things along more quickly.

Despite that, we are ahead of schedule because the Administrator,

Brendan Guilfoyle, has allowed us 'access to all areas' sooner than might have been. Originally, we thought we might have been unable to get into detail until after completing the purchase of the club in late April or early May, but we are already stuck in!

Rest assured that things are on

track and everyone is working very hard. The staff have been enormously supportive and, for that, we are very grateful.

Thanks to them and to you, our fellow fans, who have offered to help in so many different ways. We will be taking you up on it in time, but it isn't easy to delegate at this stage because we are dealing with such specific priorities.

One final point. You'll have gathered a planning application's been lodged for a stadium at Junction 12. This comes from the developers Goodmans and is not a joint application with the club. As you know, we are not with or against any stadium plan until we have completed our independent feasibility study.

A reminder that next Saturday, for our home match with Cheltenham Town, there is another 'Kids for 20/20' special offer, when youngsters can purchase a ticket for 40p provided they are accompanied a full paying adult.

Hope you enjoy today's game - in fact, here's hoping we all do!!

Please continue to get behind us.

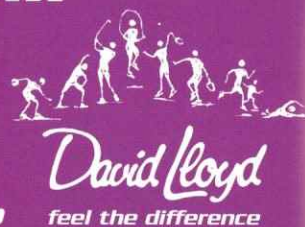

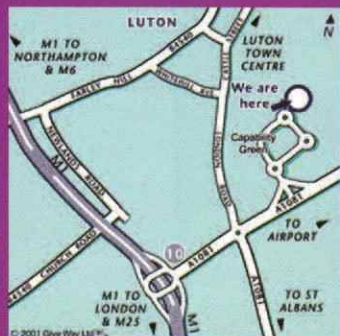

Firstly, welcome to the first of three consecutive home Saturday first team fixtures.

I was speaking with Carlisle at the game last Tuesday and they were unhappy that they do not have a home game for the remaining three Saturdays during March. There must be a way to resolve this. We used to play 'home and away' with no problem and you would think in this technological age that it would be easy to put this back in place.

I am very pleased to advise supporters that the Club has been successful in achieving The Football League's Excellence Award 2008. The award is given following two mystery fan visits to the stadium and in addition, is based on information provided to The League regarding child safeguarding material. The matches the mystery fan's came to were Tranmere on 22nd December and Nottingham Forest on 11th December. They reported on many aspects which included ease of purchasing tickets, pricing, stewarding, shop, food etc.

Last week I was invited to the L & D Hospital Radio Open Day, and what an eye opener it proved to be. I simply had

no idea of the scale of the operation they run 24 hours a day and which is manned totally by volunteers. Alan Pleasants, the Chairman, showed me around their two studios and I met volunteers who had worked here at the club when we broadcast matches to the Luton and Dunstable Hospital. The radio station covers all tastes in music, requests can be made, and they also have guests coming into the studio. Access is free to all patients at the hospital, but if you live in the Luton area you can also listen to the station via 1134AM. 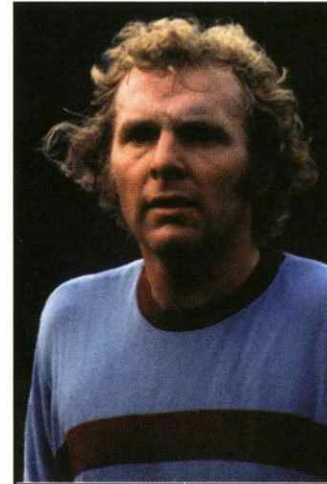

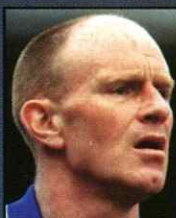


# WELCOME TO OLDHAM

## The OLDHAM Story Beginnings: 1895

The club was formed in 1895 and originally known as Pine Villa FC, changing the club name in 1899. Oldham joined the Football League in 1907-08 and were promoted to the top flight a couple of years later. Unlike many clubs, Oldham adapted to their new league status well, finishing in third position in their first league season, missing out on promotion by only two points and boasting an unbeaten home record.

### Top Player: Ritchie



Andy Ritchie is regarded as one of Oldham Athletic's finest ever footballers, and is also an ex-manager of the club. Ritchie started his career in 1977-78 with Manchester United, and later played for Brighton & Hove Albion, Leeds United, Oldham Athletic

and Scarborough, making 661 appearances (88 as substitute) and scoring 210 goals throughout his career.

### Top Manager: Royle

Joe Royle spent twelve years in charge at Boundary Park, turning an average Second Division club into a Premier League outfit. Royle's teams won many friends with their care-free, cavalier style. During Royle's time at Boundary Park, Oldham were beaten in the 1990 League Cup final by Nottingham Forest, and reached the last four of the FA Cup twice (in 1990 and 1994), losing both times to Manchester United. After relegation to the First Division in 1994, Royle resigned as manager of Oldham.



### Top Game:

Oldham 3 - 3 Manchester United  
FA Cup Semi-Final, May 1990

The small industrial town of Oldham Athletic was gripped by football fever. Managed by Joe Royle, the Latics had just reached the League Cup final and were also challenging for promotion. Oldham started the better and just after five minutes, Earl Barrett put Oldham in front. Near the half hour mark, Bryan Robson equalised before Neil Webb's head Manchester United in front. Oldham instantly replied as Ian Marshall smashed a volley into the back of the net. During extra time, Danny Wallace gave United the lead, but the drama was not over as Oldham substitute, Roger Palmer was on hand to force a replay.

Despite being ravaged by injuries in recent weeks, Boundary Park's finest arrive at Kenilworth Road still within sniffing distance of a top-six spot. John Sheridan's side are missing their key strike duo of Lee Hughes and Craig Davies, as well as Captain Sean Gregan, but, after wins over Tranmere and Bournemouth in their last two matches, hopes are high of a second successive play-off finish.

Sheridan's outfit have actually gone five games without a win on the road,

but are well capable of performing away from home, as both Leeds and Everton can testify this season. The Latics destroyed their north-west rivals in

the league at Elland Road in December shortly before shocking Goodison Park with a 1-0 win in the FA Cup courtesy of a stunning long-range effort from midfielder Gary McDonald.

While Oldham's football has been constantly entertaining, achieving consistent results has been more of a problem, with the two games previous to last week's victories indicative of why they have been infuriating to support at times this season: a dismal 1-0 home reverse to lowly Hartlepool was followed by an

emphatic 3-1 defeat of play-off rivals Tranmere, although the latter result was particularly satisfying for Oldham fans given that ex-Latics boss Ronnie Moore is now at the helm at Prenton Park.

Sheridan took over from Moore at Boundary Park in 2006 and, until Blackpool rather fortuitously won in the play-off semis, looked set to end Oldham's decade-long stay in League One at his first attempt. The ex-Ireland international subsequently

rebuilt the side in the closed season and, given his pedigree as a player, it is no surprise that the Latics have continued to flourish by keeping the ball

on the deck.

Sheridan started his career at Leeds, where he was a terrace hero and helped the club climb back into the top-flight in the late eighties. He moved on the Sheffield Wednesday and became the mainstay of their successful side of the early 1990s, often playing alongside former Luton favourite Danny Wilson. Notably, he hit a scorcher to beat Manchester United in the 1991 League Cup Final and was the lynchpin of the side that reached Wembley in both cup competitions two years later.



The real headline-grabber has been 13-goal Craig Davies, but with both the Welsh international and Hughes out today Sheridan is likely to continue with Lewis Alessandra and Leeds loanee Leon Constantine up front, particularly after the two combined to good effect in the win over Tranmere. Also worth watching out for is 19-year-old right-back and captain Neil Eardley, whose maturity and poise was on display in the win against Bournemouth when he netted both goals from the spot.

Between the sticks for Oldham will be veteran keeper Mark Crossley, who at 38 remains an exceptional shot-stopper and will be hoping to shut out the Hatters today as the Latics look to secure an eighth away

win of the season and really get back amongst the promotion pack.

Previous encounters in recent seasons have been close affairs with three of the last four encounters ending in draws - the most recent occurring this season when the Hatters gained an impressive 1-1 draw at Boundary Park.

The last meeting at Kenilworth Road between the two sides came in August 2004 where goals from Steve Howard and Paul Underwood sealed a 2-1 win, which was Luton's first win against Oldham in ten previous attempts.

### How has this season gone?

Over the last few weeks it has been really exciting. We have won three of the last four games and we are heading in the right direction in the League One table. I didn't think we would have enough in the squad to get us up into the play-offs, but we have been playing well recently and there is a bit of optimism around the Club. The only concern is that we have a lot of players missing through injury and I hope that don't prove to be costly at this stage of the season.

### What are Oldham's aims this season?

### Who has been your key signing?

I have been impressed with the form of Reuben Hazell this season. I didn't really know much about the player when he joined up, but he has been a key defender for us this season. He is good in the air, reads the game well and his all round play has been decent.

### Who will be your one to watch this afternoon?

There are a few, but Neal Eardley has been awesome this season and goes into this game with three goals in his last two games. Neal has a massive future in the game and is already a Welsh international at the age of 19. Also watch out for JP Kalala, who I have been impressed with in the last handful of games he has been involved in.

### Who will win League One?

Swansea have dipped in the last couple of weeks, but they should still go on and win the league. The race for second looks as though it will go down to the wire, but I think Carlisle might pip Doncaster and Nottingham Forest to that position.

Joined Oldham on a permanent basis in January 2007 following a successful loan spell. After being frozen out at Leeds, the influential defender arrived at Boundary Park on loan in November 2006. He then signed a contract until the end of the 2008/09 campaign after having his Elland Road contract cancelled. Gregan began his career at Darlington, where he made 134 appearances, before moving to Preston and West Brom. Gregan made 31 appearances for the club last season as Oldham reached the play-off semi-finals.



Goalkeepers

Mark Crossley

Experienced stopper who inked a one-year contract in June 2007. The Welsh international joined Oldham after leaving Premiership outfit Fulham as a free agent. Crossley - capped eight times by his country - began his career as a trainee at Nottingham Forest, and went on to make 384 appearances for the City Ground club over a 13-year period. He went on to have spells at Millwall, Middlesbrough, Sheffield Wed and Stoke City. Along with Dave Beasant, he remains the only goalkeeper ever to save a penalty in normal time in an FA Cup Final, and is the only player ever to deny Matthew Le Tissier from the penalty spot.

Josh Bell

Josh Bell joined Latics on a two-year apprenticeship in May 2006. The goalkeeper broke into the youth side at the back end of the 2006/07 campaign, also making appearances for the reserve side.

Defenders

Neal Eardley

Widely regarded as one of Oldham's brightest prospects, Neal Eardley is a product of the club's successful youth system. Eardley joined the senior squad for pre-season training ahead of the 2006/07 season and forced himself into the team under new boss John Sheridan. Eardley won his first senior cap for Wales when he appeared as a half-time substitute during their 1-0 international friendly win over Bulgaria in Burgas on August 22, 2007.

Stefan Stam

Signed for Latics following a successful trial period during the 2003/04 season, Stefan Stam has played for PSV Eindhoven and AZ Alkmaar. He signed a new one-year deal in July 2007.

Kelvin Lomax

John Sheridan rescued Kelvin Lomax from the footballing wilderness by bringing him back to the club in summer 2006, after he was released by former boss Ronnie Moore at the end of the 2005/06 season. Lomax completed a successful two-month loan spell at Rochdale between September and October 2007, making ten appearances for the League Two side.

Reuben Hazell

Latics signed defender Reuben Hazell to a deal until summer 2009 in November 2007 after two successive one-month contracts. The centre-half started his career as a trainee at Aston Villa, before joining Tranmere Rovers in July 1999. Hazell made 54 appearances whilst at Prenton Park, but he was on the move again in February 2002, joining Torquay United on a permanent basis following a successful loan spell. He then moved to Chesterfield, making 80 appearances, before leaving to join the Latics.

John Thompson

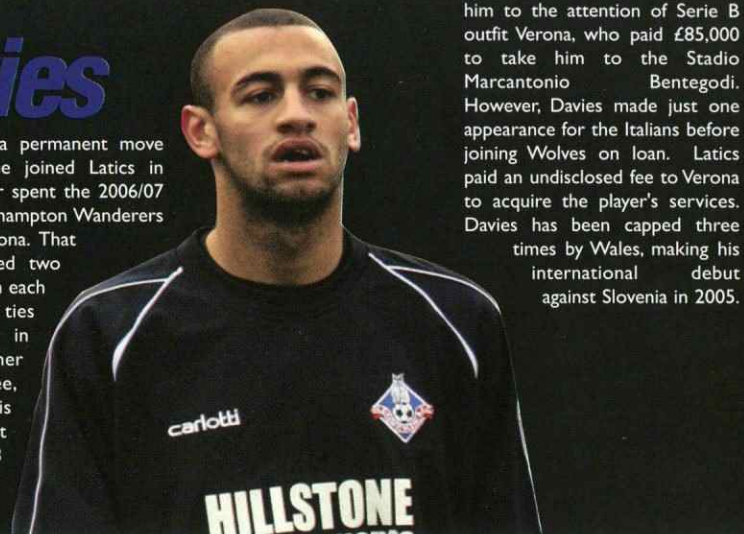
Versatile defender, who joined Latics on a free transfer in June 2007. Started his career at Nottingham Forest and has been capped three times by the Republic of Ireland.

Craig Davies completed a permanent move back from Italy when he joined Latics in summer 2007. The striker spent the 2006/07 season on loan at Wolverhampton Wanderers from Italian side Hellas Verona. That spell at Molineux included two goals against Latics - one in each of the two FA Cup ties between the two sides in January 2007. A former Manchester City trainee, Davies began his professional career at Oxford United, scoring 8 goals in 29 appearances. The player's form brought



him to the attention of Serie B outfit Verona, who paid £85,000 to take him to the Stadio Marcantonio Bentegodi. However, Davies made just one appearance for the Italians before joining Wolves on loan. Latics paid an undisclosed fee to Verona to acquire the player's services. Davies has been capped three times by Wales, making his international debut against Slovenia in 2005.

Midfielders

Mark Allott

Mark Allott rejoined Latics in summer 2007 after six-seasons away from Boundary Park. A long-term target for manager John Sheridan, Allott signed a two-year contract after leaving Chesterfield for an undisclosed fee. Originally a product of the Boundary Park youth system, Allott scored within ten minutes of being introduced as a substitute for his debut against Bolton Wanderers on December 12, 1996.



JP Kalala

JP Kalala left 2006/07 play-off finalists Yeovil to sign for Latics on a two-year deal in June 2007. Kalala made 42 appearances for the Glovers in 2006/07, helping them to a 5th-placed finish in League One. The combative midfielder arrived in Britain in July 2005 when he signed for Grimsby Town, and made his name with a stunning winner as the Mariners knocked Premier League side Tottenham Hotspur out of the Carling Cup in 2005/06. Kalala has been capped six times by his native DR Congo.

Gary McDonald

Scottish midfielder Gary McDonald became John Sheridan's first capture as Latics manager in the summer of 2006. McDonald joined Latics on a free transfer from Kilmarnock, where he quickly progressed through the ranks to the first team. He went on to make 116 appearances for Killie, scoring fourteen times before moving south on a two-year deal.

Chris Taylor

Starlet Chris Taylor signed a new deal until summer 2010 in April 2007 after an impressive season last year. The midfielder made his full debut in the 3-0 home win against Nottingham Forest in 2005/06, going on to make 13 further appearances. Taylor made further progress during 2006/07, appearing 51 times and scoring his first goal for the club in the 1-1 draw at Carlisle. The announcement of a new deal at Boundary Park put an end to speculation that Taylor may leave the club in a big-money move.

David Livermore

David Livermore signed for Latics on loan from Hull City on the final day of the January transfer window -- a deal extended until the end of March recently. Livermore is already a veteran of over 350 senior games, the majority of them for Millwall.

Strikers

Lee Hughes

Lee Hughes joined Oldham Athletic on a two-year contract in August 2007. Hughes began his career with Conference side Kidderminster Harriers, firing 35 goals in 1996/97 before joining West Bromwich Albion for £200,000 - the record fee paid for a non-league player. He rocketed to fame with four successful campaigns at the Hawthorns, bagging 86 goals in 174 appearances - a ratio of a goal every two games. He moved to Coventry in the summer of 2001, but he played just 40 times for City (14 goals) before returning to West Bromwich Albion for £2.5m after one season. After a short spell out of the game, he returned to sign a two-year contract at Oldham and scored his first goals for the club in a 3-0 win at Bournemouth in November 2007.



Matthew Wolfenden

Striker Matthew Wolfenden signed a new two-year contract with the club in summer 2007. A product of the Boundary Park youth system, the forward has the distinction of being one of Latics' youngest-ever players. The striker made his senior debut during the 2003/04 season as a substitute against Swindon Town aged just 16 years and 115 days. A regular scorer at reserve and youth level, Wolfenden impressed in Lee Duxbury's second string last season. He also made eight appearances for the first team, scoring his first-ever senior goal in the 3-1 defeat at Blackpool in the second leg of the Coca-Cola League One play-offs.

Jordan Robertson

Jordan Robertson joined the club on a month-long emergency loan from Sheffield United in late February 2008. Robertson spent the first half of the season on loan at Scottish Premier League side Dundee United, scoring four goals during his stay on Tayside. However, he was recalled by the Blades in January. He also clocked up more League experience during a spell with Northampton Town - scoring on his debut for the Cobblers against Athletic in January 2007 - and Torquay United. Robertson scored his first goal for the club in the 3-0 win at Port Vale on March 1.

## Harford returns with a bang

Pictured above, Mick Harford celebrates a goal against Manchester United in April 1992 just seven months after his 'second coming' return to Kenilworth Road.

During the 1991-92 season, new manager David Pleat had suffered difficulties both on and off the field the previous summer. Top scorer Lars Elstrup had disappeared, the chairman had resigned and crowd favourite Kingsley Black had been sold to Nottingham Forest.

Results in the early part of the campaign were poor and it took until the fifth League game before a goal was scored which obviously highlighted the Town's deficiency.

Pleat was desperate for a goalscorer and pushed the boat out to bring in a former Hatters hero in the shape of Mick Harford. The big striker jumped at the chance to return to Kenilworth Road, where he had previously enjoyed

the best and most productive time of his career, and was greeted by a rapturous crowd who turned up to see one of the previous season's promoted sides, Oldham, put to the sword in his first game back.

The Latics had not read the script though and always looked dangerous with their powerful strikeforce of Ian Marshall and Graeme Sharp and it was the former who opened the scoring with a header on 52 minutes.

The Town now needed to chase the game and despite throwing everyone forward in search of an equaliser they did not look like scoring until a double substitution was made with Paul Telfer and Kurt Nogan coming on in place of Brian Stein and Darron McDonough.

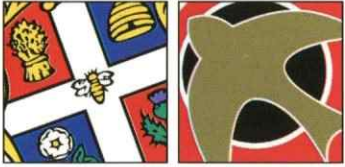
The two fresh and enthusiastic

youngsters turned the game on its head with their enthusiasm and willingness to run at the Oldham defence but, as the minutes ticked away, it looked as though the Latics would escape with all three points.

With five minutes to go the ball was worked down the right by full-back Matthew Jackson and Telfer, for Nogan who put over a low cross for Harford, who had escaped from his marker, to tap in.

The crowd went wild and in true 'Roy of the Rovers' fashion Harford was on hand to take advantage of some hesitancy in the Oldham defence to hit a sweet overhead kick into the roof of the net in injury time to secure an unlikely victory.

Pleat said afterwards, "I have to be mean with Luton's money and I think I paid a little over the top for a man of 32, but I knew what Mick had to offer and what he was really worth to us."

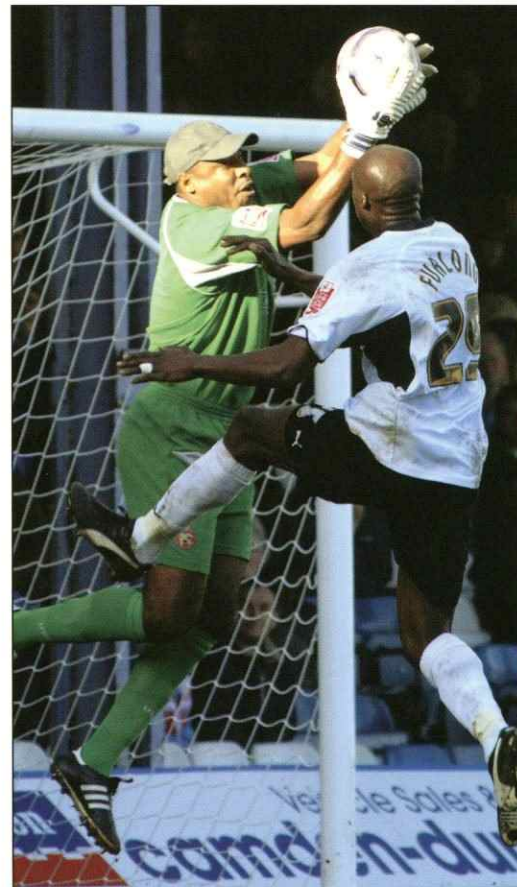

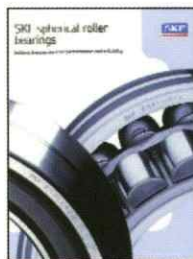

**21** The number of previous league meetings between the sides at Kenilworth Road. Luton have won nine times, there have been eight draws, and the visitors have won on four occasions. The Hatters have scored 35 goals, and have conceded 20 goals to the Latics.

**8** The most number of goals scored in this fixture, and it was the first time the sides met, back on the opening day of the 1953/54 season. Johnny Downie scored a hat trick, on his Luton debut, with Jim Pemberton netting the other. The crowd of 22822, was not only the highest of the season for Luton, but also for this fixture.

**6** The most number of goals scored by Luton in this fixture. Another opening day fixture, this time in the 1978/79 season. Seven players made their Luton debut in this fixture and it was not going well as the visitors were leading 1-0 at half time. In amazing second half Luton hit six goals without reply! Bob Hatton scored just 15 seconds into the half, before David Moss netted twice either side of a Brian Stein goal. Lil Fuccillo scored from the penalty spot to make it 5-1 before Hatton rounded off the scoring with his second late in the game.

**11** The number of league matches played between the sides at Kenilworth Road since Oldham Athletic were victorious. The Hatters have won five of these, with an amazing six draws! Luton have netted 14 times in these matches, whilst just seven goals have been conceded.

**3** The number of penalties scored by Luton in this fixture. Mike Harrison scored the first on the opening day of the 1968/69 season, as the Hatters won 4-0. Fuccillo's penalty in the 6-1 victory, again on the opening day of a season, in August 1978, was the second successful spot kick by the Hatters. The last time that a penalty was converted was when David Moss netted in the Championship winning 1981/82 season. Moss scored again after the break to confirm the victory. Incidentally Darron McDonough was sent off for Oldham in this fixture, he was of course to join Luton a few years later!

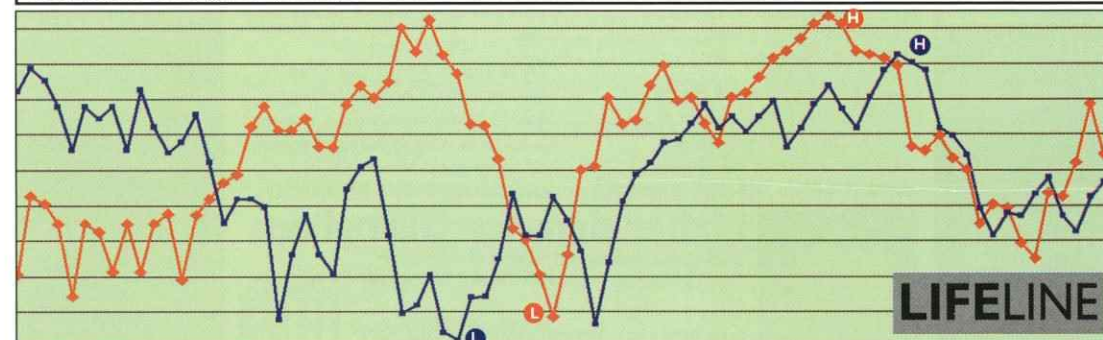
**7** The number of players scoring against Oldham on their Luton league debuts! Johnny Downie's hat trick in 53/54 has been previously mentioned, as has Mike Harrison's penalty in 68/69. Brian Lewis also scored in the latter of these games, and like Harrison was also making his Luton debut. Bob Hatton and David Moss both scored a brace on their Luton debuts in 78/79. A 17 year old Stuart Douglas scored in the 1-1 draw in 1995/96, whilst substitute Andre Scarlett netted in injury time to secure a 2-0 win in October 1998.

**3** Current Luton manager Mick Harford has scored three times against Oldham Athletic whilst playing for Luton. He made a sensational return to the Club in 1991/92 when he netted two late goals on his "second" debut to turn a 1-0 deficit into a 2-1 victory. He also netted in the 5-1 defeat at Boundary Park later in the season.

## Each way movers

**4** The number of players who have moved from Oldham to Luton. Ron Swan was the first of these, but he only featured in the 1966/67 season, making just 14 appearances in goal for the Hatters. Laurie Sheffield was the next player to make the move, and he made his debut against his former side on the opening day of the 1968/69 season. Sheffield scored 12 goals in 29 league appearances that season, but only made six league appearances the following season before he moved to Doncaster Rovers. Steve Taylor only made 20 appearances in 1978/79 after his transfer, his only goal came in a 4-1 win against Burnley. Darron McDonough stayed at Kenilworth Road for six seasons, making 127 appearances and scoring 7 goals, before moving to Newcastle United.

**2** The number of players who have moved to Oldham from Luton. Paul Shepherd had made just seven appearances in the 2000/01 season for the Hatters before his transfer to Oldham. Dean Crowe made 79 appearances and scored 17 goals in three seasons at Kenilworth Road. He scored on his debut at Plymouth, whilst on loan from Stoke, a move that was made permanent a month later. Crowe netted 15 goals in 34 league appearances during the promotion season of 2001/02, but managed just two goals from 27 appearances the following season. Ironically his last appearance, as a substitute, also came against Plymouth, a 1-1 draw in March 2004 before his free transfer to Oldham.



### Hatters and Oldham past...

THIS week's **LIFELINE** shows how Luton and Oldham's fortunes have risen and fallen over the years. Oldham's high point came when, under Joe Royle they finished 17 in the old First Division in 1992-93, 31 points behind League winners Leeds United. Their low was when they finished 23rd in the English Division Four League, just one point above Hartlepool United who finished bottom of the league with just 27 points.

"There's been some reflection on Dean's part. We're just trying to achieve success together and we all have to be conscious of that."

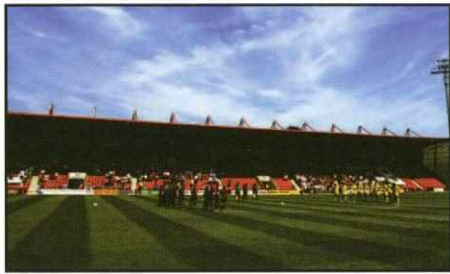
### Cherries squad to defer salaries

Tilson was forced to play midfielder Hal-Robson Kanu alongside his only

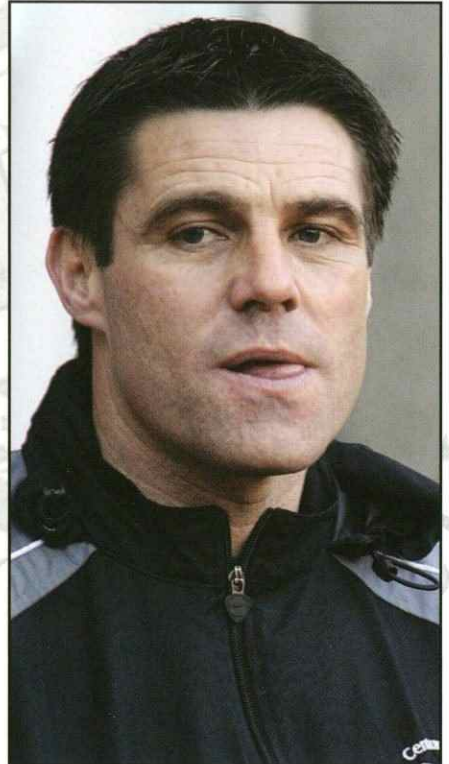
fit striker James Walker in the 2-0 victory over Luton Town at the weekend.

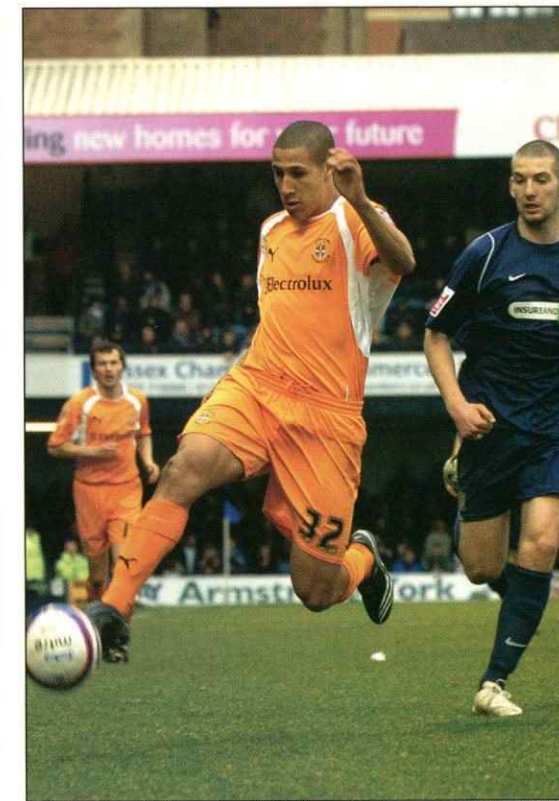

# RICHARD LANGLEY

For the first time this season, there seems to be some light at the end of the tunnel for Hatters midfielder Richard Langley.

The former QPR and Cardiff man has endured an horrendous season since breaking his leg during a pre-season friendly game against Rushden & Diamonds last July.

Langley hasn't kicked a ball since a heavy tackle from Diamonds' Michael Rankin forced him off on a stretcher, with serious concerns about his future in the game.

However, the determination of Langley has finally seen him reap some reward after returning to training with the first team squad last week.

Although there is still a long battle for the 28-year-old to undertake, it does bode well for the midfielder that his future in the game is back on track.

And for Langley, his return to training means he is one step closer to bringing down the curtains on a eight month nightmare.

Talking to today's matchday programme, Langley said: "I had been training with the youth team for about two weeks prior to me coming back with the first team.

"It has been a long time coming and a very frustrating time for me. I have been itching to come back, looking over at the first-team's training sessions and wanting to get out there, but I have had to take things slowly.

"It has been a nice feeling to finally get back out on the training ground with the rest of the lads, but I know I still have some way to go to get back to match fitness.

"What was pleasing for me was that I have come through the first training session with the first-team feeling OK. I felt a bit tired and a bit below the pace, but that is to be expected as I have been out for so long.

"I probably need a few more sessions where I am put through my paces and hopefully I can start

pushing on from there."

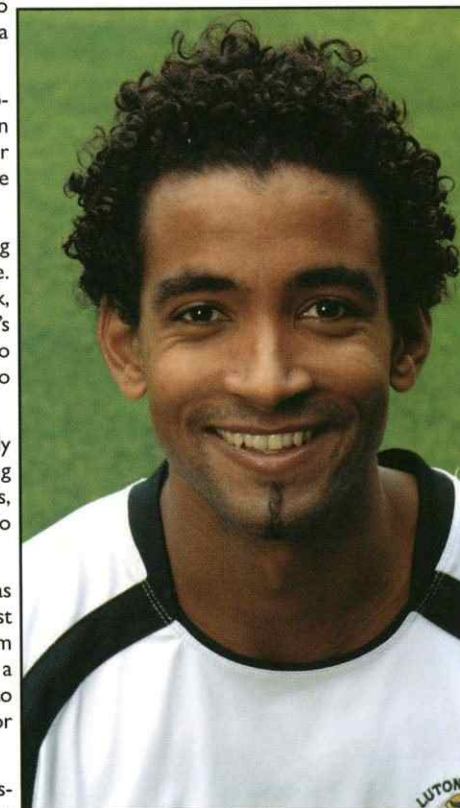
However, Langley, who is a Jamaican international, is fully aware that he still has plenty of work ahead of him before he is back playing competitively in a Hatters shirt.

The midfielder admits that it has been

particularly frustrating for him this season as he has been unable to help his team-mates get themselves out of the Club's current predicament.

"I have been going to all the home matches and it is hard sitting on the sides, not being able to do anything to help our current situation," continued

Langley.

"It has been difficult for me this season, but it has been even harder for the rest of the lads because they have had to play through the administration.

"However, I think performances are getting better and if we can continue to play the way that we know we can then it would be good to finish off the season on some sort of high, regardless of what happens.

"Everyone at the moment can do with some kind of lift and I know the players are working hard to string a few wins together and give us something to cheer about."

Despite his enthusiasm to return to action for the Hatters, Langley knows that he has had to patiently work through his rehabilitation programme.

The midfielder has been put through his paces behind the scenes, putting in the hours in the gymnasium in a bid to regain his fitness.

And Langley isn't taking any chances in his pursuit to making a Luton comeback.

"There have been times when I have thought to myself, 'I want to get back out there no matter what'.

"However I have got to be professional about the situation and I have got to think long term.

"I have been out of action for a long time and I need to make sure that the rehabilitation is done correctly. I don't want to cut any corners.

"It is difficult to know when I will be back. I come to training some days and I feel great, other days I come in and I think to myself that I am another two or three days away from actually training.

It will all depend on how I progress with the rehabilitation really. It is going well at the moment."



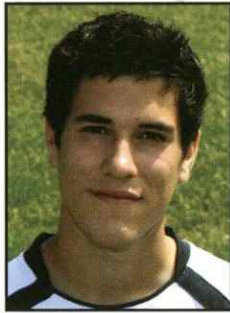

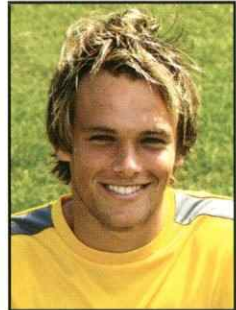

However, they successfully came through 90 minutes at Roots Hall as they stepped up their comebacks to Mick Harford's squad.

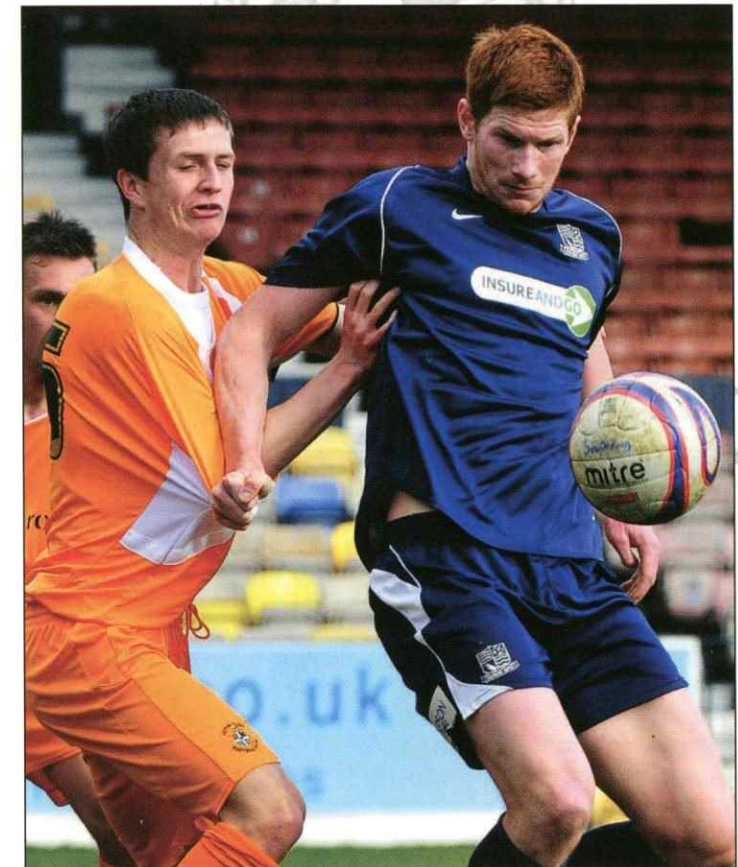

Charles almost reduced Southend's lead two minutes later when he was put clean through by Currie's pass, but the striker was denied by a breathtaking save from Collis.

But any chance of a fight back evaporated when Moussa grabbed his second of the game on 67 minutes, firing a right footed shot from the edge of the area past Faulds.

The Hatters finished the game the

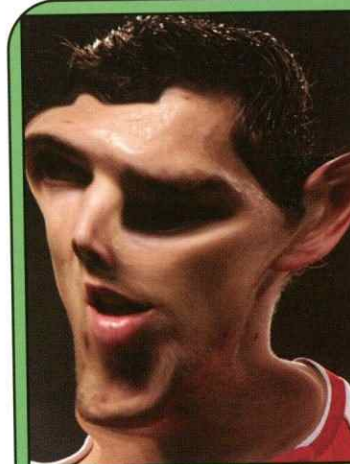

Anthony Gerrard went from hero to villain as Brighton condemned Walsall to back-to-back defeats at the Banks's Stadium.

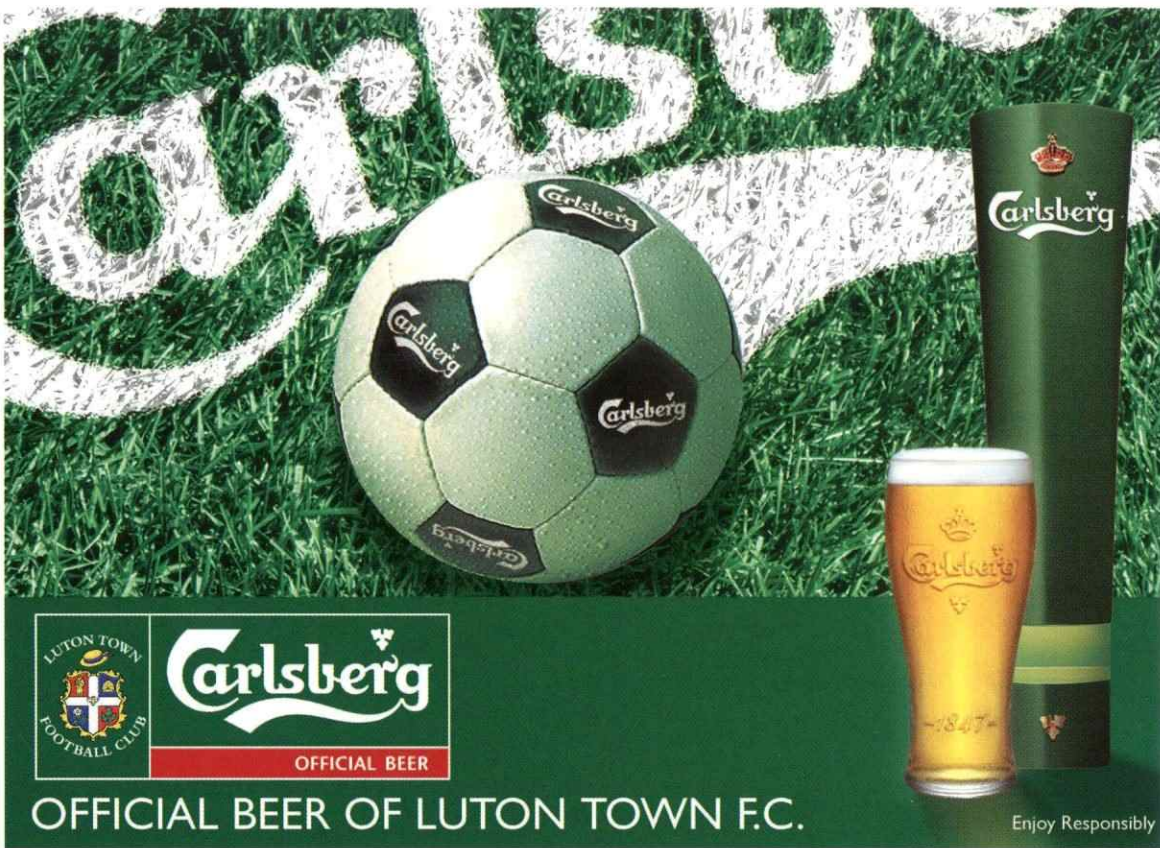

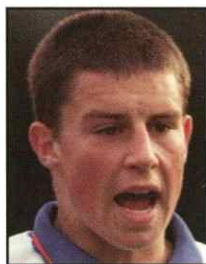
## Christopher (Chris) Alan WILLMOTT

Bedford born Chris joined Luton from school and after working his way up through the ranks at Kenilworth Road suddenly found himself thrust into the first team following the Hatter's double sale of Graham Alexander and Steve Davis in 1999.

A tall and powerful defender, Chris filled in reliably at either full-back or centre-half for the remainder of the 1998/99 campaign before an amazing £350,000 bid came in from Premiership Wimbledon that summer which was too good to turn down.

Chris could never carve out a regular place in the Dons team and came back to Luton for two loan spells in 2003 before making a permanent move to Northampton where he enjoyed greater success.

Chris is now at Conference side Oxford United.



## Daniel (Danny) Joseph WILSON

Wigan born Danny started his football career with Bury before moving to Chesterfield where his strong, forceful midfield performances caught the eye of Nottingham Forest manager Brian Clough, leading to a transfer in January 1983.

Surprisingly, Danny did not settle at the City Ground and switched to Brighton but returned to the top flight when he became Luton manager Ray Harford's first major signing in the summer of 1987.

Slotting straight into the side, Northern Ireland international Danny was virtually ever present over the next three seasons with his all action displays as the Hatters made four trips to Wembley, appeared in an F.A.Cup semi-final and dived with the threat of relegation.

After spells with Sheffield Wednesday and Barnsley, Danny settled into management and is currently in the hot seat at Hartlepool.



## James (Jim) Allan WILSON

Hailing from Musselburgh, Jim turned out as an amateur for Peterborough whilst serving in the RAF during the war. After demobilisation he signed professional forms with Posh, then in the Midland League, and was then spotted by Luton scouts leading to him moving to Kenilworth Road for a sizeable fee and the promise of a friendly match.

Although making his League debut for the Hatters in 1947/48, the quick and tenacious full-back, who could play on either flank, enjoyed a long run in the side in the following campaign before losing out to the consistent pairing of Billy Cooke and Bud Aherne.

Jim moved on to Northampton in 1951 and then had a short spell at Chesterfield before settling back in Scotland where he died in 1997.

## Marc David WILSON

Belfast born Marc joined Portsmouth from school and soon earned a reputation as a talented midfielder, comfortable on the ball with an eye for goal.

After a spell on loan at Yeovil in March 2006 which lasted only two games, Marc enjoyed a much longer run at Bournemouth starting in January 2007 which ran to the end of the season by which time he had notched up 19 appearances and scored three goals.

Although Bournemouth would have loved to have kept him, Pompey would not sell but after a further spell in the reserves at Fratton Park he was sent out on loan once more, this time to Luton.

After making his debut for the Hatters in a 0-0 draw at Walsall in November 2007, Marc went on to make four starts, and was only on the losing side once, before returning to the south coast.



## Robert James WILSON

After joining his local club Fulham from school in 1977 and then signing professional forms two years later, Robert was converted into an attacking midfielder from full-back and enjoyed five successful seasons at Craven Cottage during which time he helped his side from Division Three to the brink of Division One. Surprisingly transferred to Millwall in 1985, Robert only lasted a year at the Den before he rejoined his old manager Ray Harford at Luton for £40,000. Despite scoring on his home debut Robert soon lost his place to Mark Stein and for the rest of his stay at Kenilworth Road was used as a utility man in a variety of positions none of which he made his own.

Robert moved back to Fulham in 1987 and then enjoyed stays at Huddersfield, Rotherham and several non-League clubs before taking up a position at Huddersfield in their youth development office.

## Robert (Robbie) WINTERS

Robbie had been plying his trade in Scotland for ten years before accepting the chance to try his luck south of the border at Luton, but he then saw only 45 minutes of action at Kenilworth Road!

Starting with Dundee United in 1992, Robbie soon earned a reputation as a brave and forceful striker which won him a big money move to Aberdeen where he became a prolific scorer, although his most memorable performance came in the Scottish FA Cup final of 2000 when he replaced injured goalkeeper Jim Leighton after two minutes and conceded four goals as Rangers romped home 4-0.

By now a Scottish international, Robbie came to Joe Kinnear's Luton in August 2002 but played only the first half of the opening day defeat at the hands of Peterborough without making an impact. He then decided on a complete change of scene and joined Brann in Norway who he still turns out for.



## Maurice (Matt) WOODS

Matt started off at Everton in 1947 but after nine years at Goodison and only eight League appearances he moved to Blackburn for £6,000. Immediately becoming a mainstay in the heart of the Rovers defence, Matt helped his new side to promotion to the top flight in his first full season and was generally reckoned to be the best un-capped centre-half of his era showing superb timing and power in the air allied to fine organisational and leadership skills.

Matt eventually left Ewood Park in 1963 for a spell in Australia, where he finally won international honours, before coming back to England two years later and joining Luton. By now 33, Matt was a tremendous influence in a Hatters side that narrowly failed to win promotion from Division Four in 1965/66 but stayed only the one season before leaving, following a row over bonuses, and then helping Stockport to promotion.

Matt later managed Stockport before becoming an HGV driver. He now lives in Cheadle in retirement.



## Jamie Marcus WOODSFORD

Ipswich born Jamie joined Luton from school and made his way up through the youth ranks at Kenilworth Road before signing professional forms in March 1995. A quick and clever striker, Jamie made his League debut coming on as substitute in a 1-0 win at Port Vale in September 1994 and with an England Youth international call-up following swiftly afterwards his career seemed set. Sadly, Jamie could not then manage to push his way into the League eleven on a regular basis and despite being loaned out to Portadown for first team experience he was eventually forced to accept the inevitable.

Jamie now works for Royal Mail.

Cheltenham are like so many other teams who have come up from non-league football, making an instant impression in the Football League.

Since Cheltenham were promoted to the Football League in 1999, the Club have showed no signs of heading back through the non-league trap door and have gained plenty of success along the way

During the 2001-02 season, they enjoyed promotion success in the League Two play-offs, beating old rivals Rushden & Diamonds in a thrilling final at the Millennium Stadium.

Although they were relegated a year later, the Robins were determined to preserve their Football League status and their hard work paid off, when in the 2005-06 season, they returned to League One with another play-off success, this time beating Grimsby 1-0 in the final.

Although this season is turning out to be a repeat of the previous season, where the Club are fighting for their League One survival, you can only be impressed by the work being done at Whaddon Road.

Cheltenham's season has been eventful to say the least. In October, the Club's fears that manager John Ward would leave came to reality when he moved north to join Carlisle United.

At the time, supporters feared the worst as Ward had brought much success to an inexperienced squad, that were struggling to cope with the demands of League One football.

Some saw it as a gamble when Cheltenham appointed Keith Downing as their new boss, who had worked alongside Ward as his assistant.

But Downing is impressing on a shoestring budget at Whaddon Road and has built a squad in his short reign in charge that are capable of staying in League One next season.

Most recently, the Club have brought in well travelled midfielder Chris Armstrong as well as securing loan deals of Bristol City pair Steve Brooker and Alex Russell.

The bright spot for Cheltenham has been the form of youngster Stephen Gillespie, a former Liverpool trainee who recently had a loan spell with Bristol City.

The striker is already attracting plenty of interest from clubs around the country and has impressed with his 10 goals this season.

At the back is the experienced Alan Wright, who enjoyed a successful eight year stay at Aston Villa earlier in his career.
