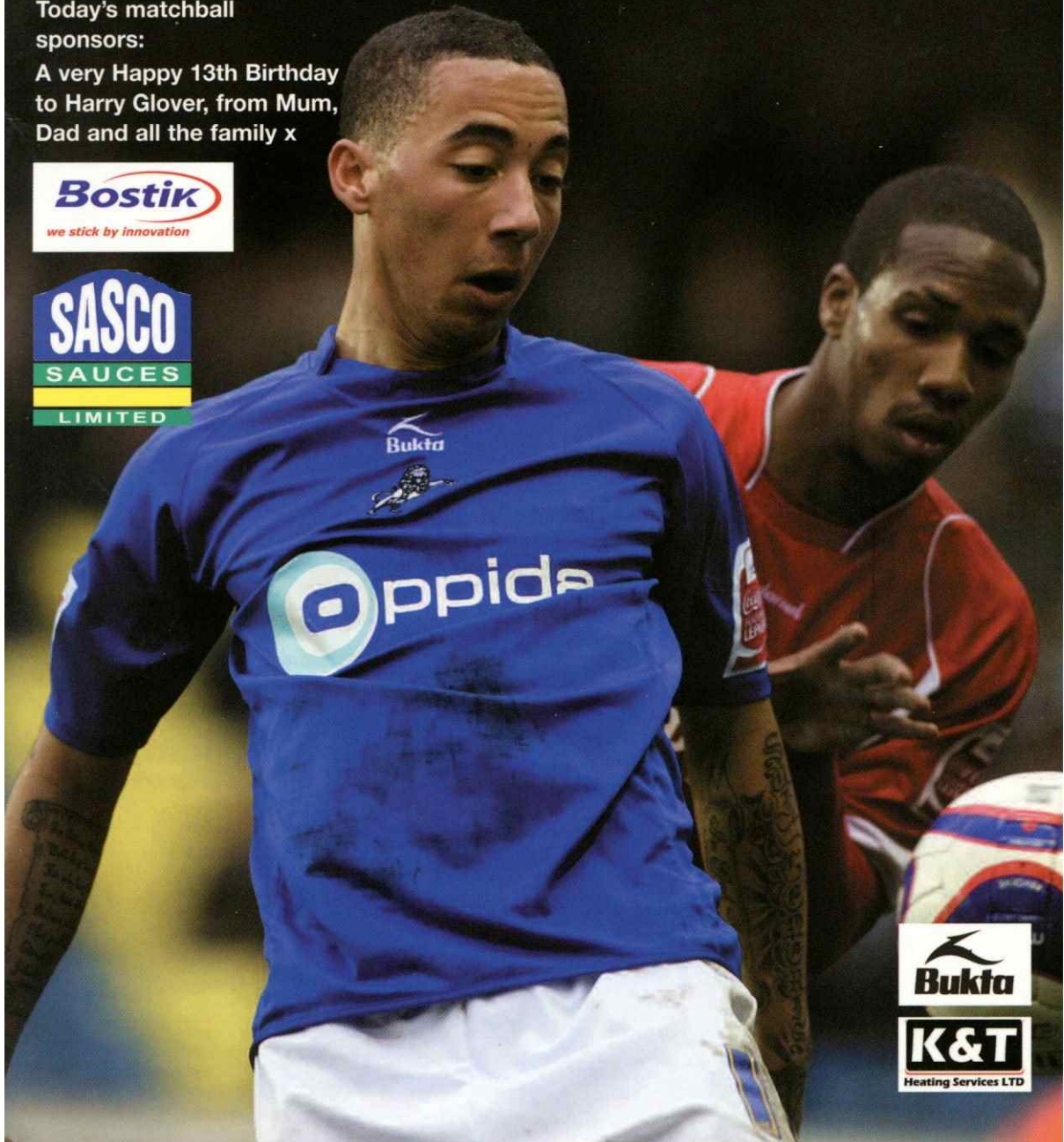

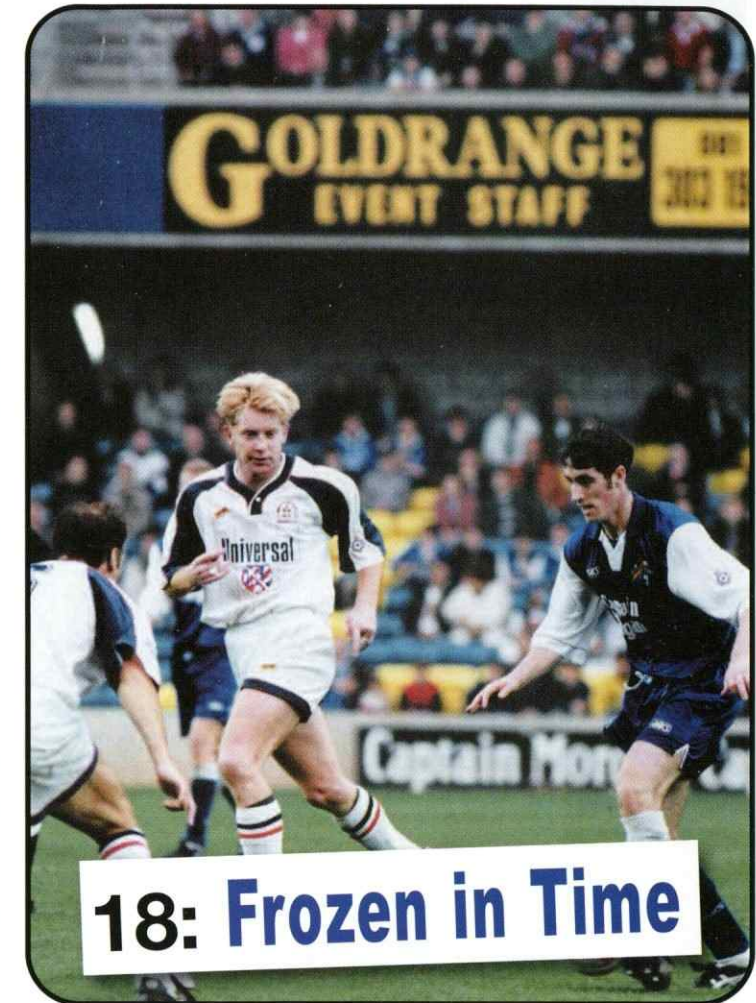

## Kenny Jackett

would like to start by wishing you all a very happy Easter. I am sure that, like me, how much you enjoy this holiday weekend will be influenced by how well Millwall do in the two important games we have over this period. Our last home game against Orient was a frustrating one in which we were unlucky to lose. There is no doubt the officials had a significant effect on the outcome, with a number of key decisions being misjudged. Two very reasonable penalty appeals were turned down and there was a questionable yellow card that could have been a red when Ryan Smith was through and in behind the oppositions centre backs. All of which contributed to a tight game slipping away from us. To lose our two first choice strikers - Lewis Grabban and Gary Alexander - after two impressive wins on the road at Swansea and Yeovil pretty well sums up our season in terms of injuries disrupting team selection. Against Orient our build up play was good and we looked controlled in possession, but all too often our passing game was broken up around the box without us getting an effort in on goal. Marc Laird over-ran the ball and committed a challenge that gave the referee very little choice other than to show him a red card. But even with 10 men we continued

to compete and push forward at every opportunity and were very unlucky to be denied a penalty in the 85th minute for a push on Bas Savage. Goals win matches so we must be quicker and more incisive in order to deliver an end product to our play. A settled side with a consistent pattern of play is something Millwall have lacked all season and is something we want in the future. There are good signs of the team progressing and improving, but the most important thing is scoring goals. Our play needs to be constructive and we must take our chances when we are on top. Today's game against a Luton side which has some very good individual players starts a key run of fixtures against teams that are below us in the table. Results in this division have been unpredictable of late with some big wins for the teams in the bottom half of the league, so we must be at our very best to take the three points today. Last but not least I would like to thank you all for your support of the team, which has been fantastic since I have been at the club. We need to work together to produce a great atmosphere at The Den - because that can drive the players on to the win that is crucial to us this afternoon.

The 36-year-old has previously completed the London Marathon three times, in 2004, 2005 & 2007, raising over £10,000 in sponsorship for Kidney Research UK along the way.  
This year Darren is trying something different - the Paris Marathon on Sunday 6th April. He is trying to raise at least £1,500 for Kidney Research UK, and the reason he has chosen this charity is his

Marc Laird saw red and Millwall were left feeling blue as Orient took the honours courtesy of Wayne Gray's 50th-minute winner. The O's had already edged ahead courtesy of Gray's close-range effort when Lions midfielder Laird was shown a straight red for a challenge on John Melligan.

Even though they were a man, and a goal, down, Kenny Jackett's side were left to rue a succession of baffling decisions by the officials. None more so than five minutes from time when Bas Savage was denied a blatant penalty when he was flattened two yards from goal as he was about to nod home a deserved Millwall equaliser.

But referee Andy D'Urso, who also missed Paul Robinson being wrestled to the ground by Brian Saah a split-second before, incredibly waved play on. Even O's boss Martin Ling sheepishly admitted: "I thought they were both fouls. We were lucky to get away with that."

Millwall enjoyed the majority of possession in the opening half with Simpson, Smith and Danny Senda all whipping great balls into the box, but no one could apply the finishing touch. Orient offered little as an attacking force and seemed content to defend in numbers. But within five minutes of the restart Orient nearly took the lead when Rhys Evans' clearance hit Gray, the ball looped up, dropped on the goal line and then spun away. But Millwall's relief was short-lived and within seconds Gray stole in ahead of Senda to convert from close range.

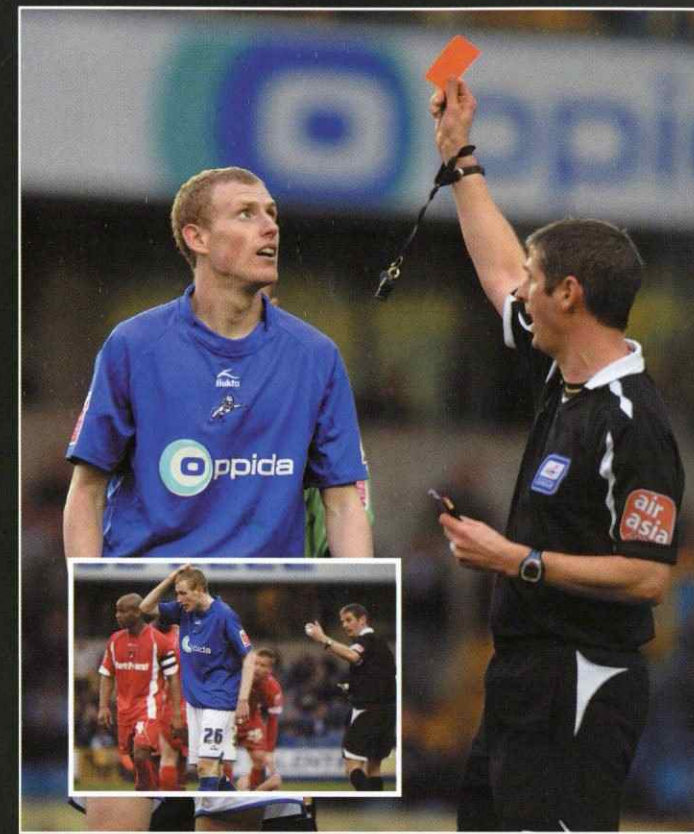

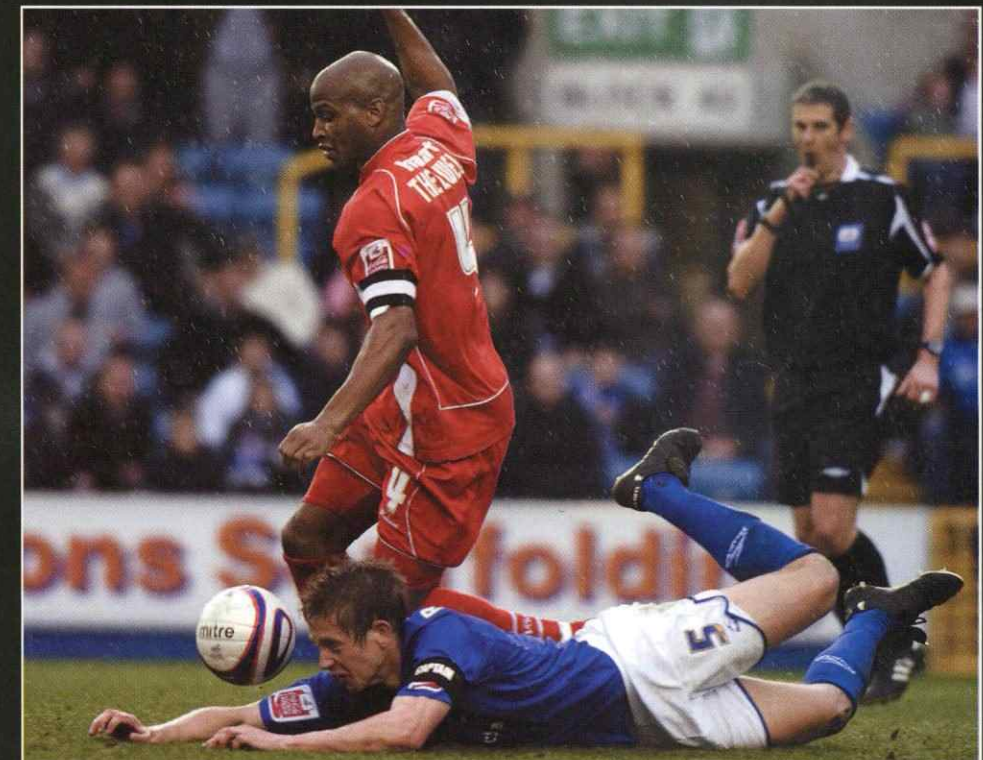

## Captain's Column

with Paul Robinson

This afternoon's game against Luton and then the trip to Bournemouth on Saturday are timely reminders of just how precarious the financial situation is at a number of clubs at this level.

We're fortunate at the moment to have a chairman and a board who are willing and able to keep this club on an even keel, but more and more clubs seem to be under threat of going into administration or worse. Perhaps this has been the case for some time, and I know Millwall went into administration a decade ago and came out the other side stronger for it.

But I think it will only take one or two clubs to go out of business and we could see more following suit.

There is bound to come a time when there will no longer be someone around to come in and put together a consortium to get a struggling club out of trouble.

There is plenty of money in football, but more and more of it is concentrated at the top end of the Premier League.

It is still possible for a club like ours to get into a position to challenge for a Premier League place as we proved four or five years ago, but it is becoming more difficult. In the early part of this decade we had a number of very good young players, Steven Reid, Tim Cahill, Paul Ifill, Marc Bircham, Lucas Neill and others who all came through together from the youth team.

We were able to hang on to most of them long enough to get to the Division One (now the Championship) Play-Offs and reach the FA Cup Final.

In contrast, this season we have seen three of our promising youngsters join Premier League clubs without establishing themselves in our first team.

In spite of these difficulties, the pressure for every club to be successful is greater than ever, which is why the turnover of managers



is so high. And it is that pressure which causes chairmen and directors to gamble money their clubs can't really afford to chase that elusive promotion.

If they succeed they might get away with it, but if they fail, the implications can be massive.

From my point of view, I sincerely hope our current League system survives for many years to come, for the sake of the fans who would be devastated if their clubs went out of business, and the young players who would have less chance to earn a living from the game.

It seems to me that it is possible to run a football club efficiently at the lower end of the financial scale.

Most of the clubs in the Conference who are promoted to the Football League seem to be very well run.

The important thing, though, is that players and fans don't fall out of love with the game.

Irrespective of the money I just love to play, and it is that love of football which was the driving force for all of us in the first place.

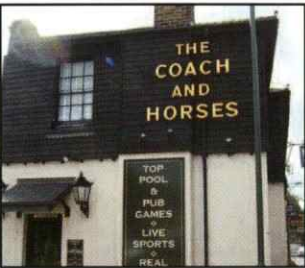

The MSC football team entered a side into the Community Cup which was held as part of the *Our Team - Our Community* day before the Orient match.

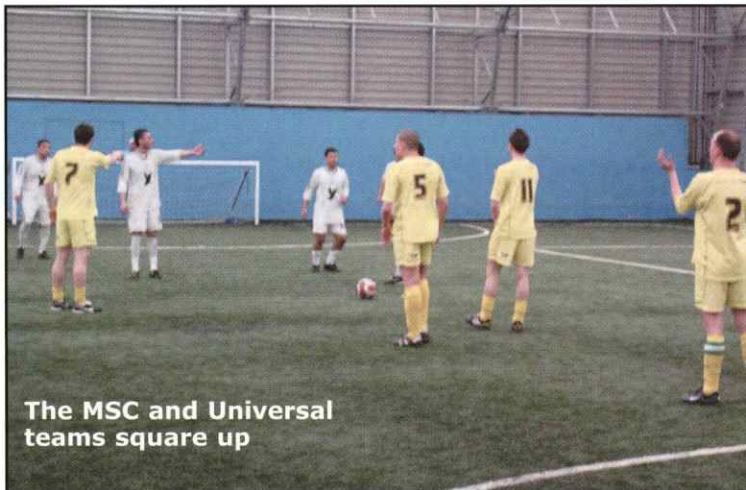
The boys performed really well in the first three games, beating all the other sides to comfortably win the round-robin tournament.

**1 TREVOR PEAKE:**

Ex-England semi-professional international central defender who was ever-present. "Player of the Year" for Luton in 1994/5 and made 179 league appearances while at Kenilworth Road before retiring in May 1998. He has since coached at Coventry City, Luton and Leicester City.

**2 GARY WADDOCK:**

Republic of Ireland international midfielder who starred as Luton qualified for the Second Division play-offs in 1996/7, netting three goals in 153 league games. He was director of QPR's centre of excellence and briefly their manager, before becoming Aldershot Town's boss.

**3 MARK KENNEDY:**

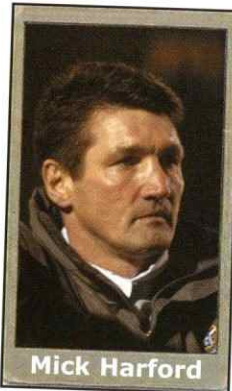
# The opposition

### Mick Harford

Date of birth: 12/2/59

Since hanging up his boots following a glittering career as a striker for the likes of Birmingham City, Wimbledon and Luton, Mick has stacked up a wealth of experience as a manager and coach.

Stints at Luton, Nottingham Forest, Swindon, Rotherham - where he was manager for eight months - were followed by a brief spell coaching the strikers here at Millwall. He then had further spells as assistant boss at Colchester United and QPR - where he also had a month as caretaker manager following John Gregory's dismissal. Mick is now back at Kenilworth Road, having been appointed boss until the end of the season.

### Calvin Andrew

Date of birth: 19/12/86

Former youth team striker Calvin had spells on loan at Grimsby and Bristol City before making his debut during the 2005/6 campaign. A tall, powerful and direct front-man, he possesses a lightning turn of speed and has a real eye for goal.

### Ed Asafu-Adjaye

Date of birth: 22/12/88

First year professional Ed is a full-back who, having spent a short time on-loan at non-league side Walton & Hersham, broke through into the first team under former boss

Midfielder Don is well known to Lions fans having spent three months on loan at The Den in 2005. ### Stephen O'Leary

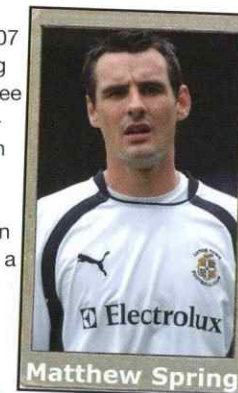
Date of birth: 12/2/85

Luton snapped up hard-working midfielder Robinson for £50,000 from Preston North End in 2002. The Northern Ireland international made his name at Bournemouth after joining the Cherries on a free from Spurs, where he had been a trainee. He hit 60 goals in 286 appearances for Bournemouth before joining Preston for £375,000.

Drew signed for Luton Town in a £250,000 deal in January 2007 from Sheffield Wednesday as former Hatters boss Mike Newell looked to strengthen his options in attack. Luton fought off competition from a number of clubs to complete the free transfer signing of the highly-rated Underwood from Rushden & Diamonds. The Wimbledon-born defender's career with Luton was under threat when he contracted a blood infection after undergoing a routine operation the summer before last and as a result missed all of last season.

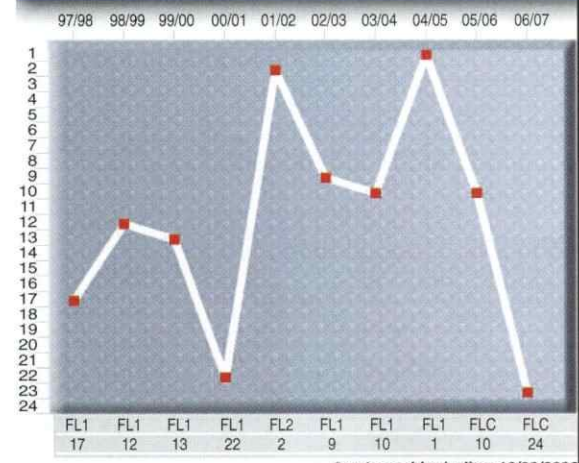

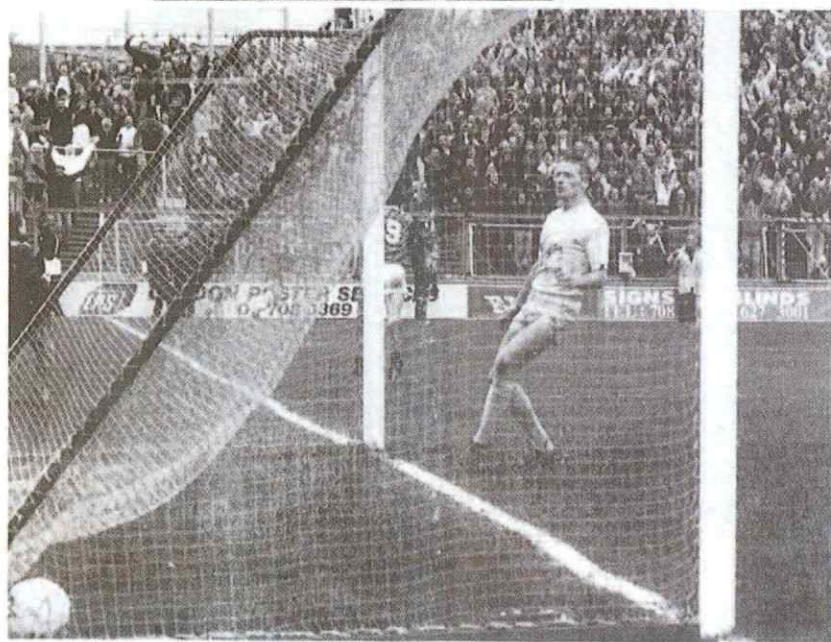

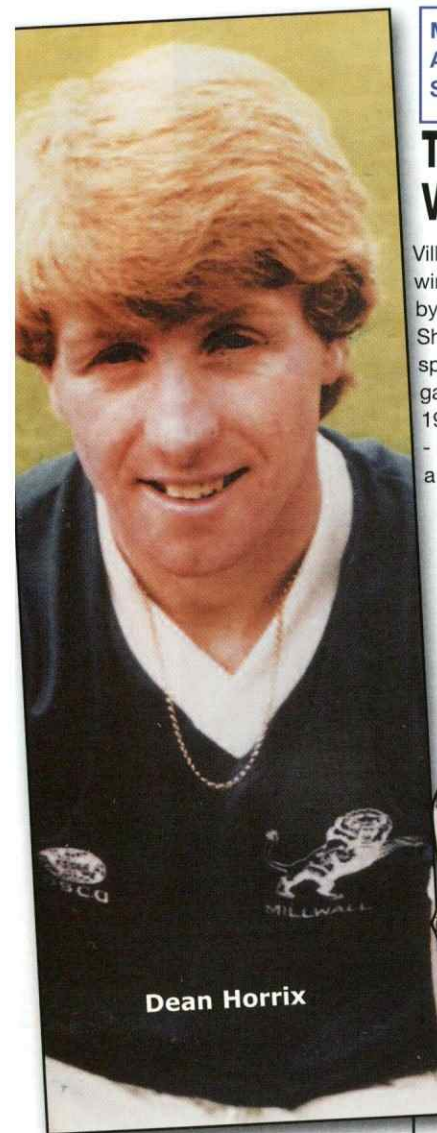

## TED'S STRIKE ENDS VILLA RECORD BID

Villa were chasing a record 14 away wins in Division Two but were foiled by a 49th-minute goal from Teddy Sheringham. Playing before 13,000 spectators, Millwall's best league gate since Spurs' visit in December 1977, Sheringham's brilliant header - his 21st goal of the season - from a Jimmy Carter free-kick was a

worthy decider. The Lions drew first blood after half hour when Danis Salman pinched his first goal of the season after Steve Wood headed over Kevin O'Callaghan's corner. And although Garry Thompson equalised for Villa seconds before half-time, there was no knocking uncompromising Millwall out of their stride.

## MEMORY LANE

**With a trip to AFC Bournemouth looming on Saturday, what better way to gee up the Millwall troops than by recalling the events that took place at Dean Court in that promotion-winning season of 1987/8?**

Peter Crawley couldn't get to the match and watched it on the screen at The Den - and so began a chain of events which led (eventually) to the break up of a marriage. Peter, tell all:

I'm 56 years old and was brought up in Bermondsey before moving to Kent on getting married in my late twenties.

I worked as an engineer for BT then but now bask in the warmth of their offices these days.

Back then going to The Den was a family affair, with me, my brother, my dad (sadly no longer with us), his brothers Jim and Terry plus cousins Stephen and Terry all standing with various friends at the Ilderton Road end. Sadly we've lost that type of gathering at The Den now as our numbers have diminished.

That season had any number of highs but the one that sticks in my memory is the crucial away win at Bournemouth towards the end of the season.

I wasn't able to get a ticket so watched the game beamed back on a somewhat scratchy big screen at The Den with my dad and many others.

The climax was Brian Horne's penalty save late in the second half, greeted with one of the most raucous and emotional celebrations I can remember at the old ground, and there were a few! This save helped to secure a vital win that lead us to the top division.

After the season had finished and the celebrations had finally died

down, my brother Richard, who was at the Bournemouth game, managed to get a treasured video copy of the match (although the picture quality was slightly worse than the big screen at The Den that evening!) We had some happy times reliving the memories of that momentous game.

Fast forward to July 1988 and the final round of The Open golf was carried over to the Monday after severe flooding on the Sunday. Seve Ballesteros was challenging but I couldn't watch it so I phoned my wife at around 3pm on the Monday to ask her to tape the last couple of hours play. "Which tape should I use?" she asked.

"Any will do," I replied, meaning any blank tape. Returning home that evening I found she'd used my treasured tape of the Bournemouth game to record the golf!

After some tears and a frank exchange of views I decided I might as well watch the golf, having managed to avoid hearing the final outcome.

It was still anyone's game when the leaders reached the 17th hole and suddenly the tape began to rewind. Not only had she taped over the football but I'd also missed the end of the golf. Needless to say we are now divorced.

I'm now married again to June and she, along with most of her family, are West Ham supporters.

I must be a glutton for punishment!

## A brighter future for the Pepys

*Positive Futures* is a national sports and activity-based social inclusion programme, funded by the Home Office Crime and Drug Strategy Directorate.

Its principal aims are to help young people living in some of the most deprived communities keep out of trouble by engaging them in positive activities and creating routes back into education, volunteering and employment.

*Positive Futures* in Lewisham is managed by Millwall Community Scheme and provides a range of activities for young people in the Bellingham, New Cross, Whitefoot and Evelyn wards of the borough.

In the Evelyn ward we have been working on the Pepys Estate in partnership with the Riverside Youth Club to provide regular football activities on a Thursday evening. This has led to us becoming involved with other local agencies such as Lewisham Homes, Lewisham Anti-Social Behaviour Action Team, Youth Services and the local Safer Neighbourhood Team to develop a project where young people from the Pepys work

with Lewisham Homes Caretakers to help create a better environment on the estate.

The initial *Brighter Futures* project involves nine young people and three caretakers who are working together voluntarily with an aerosol artist over a six-week period to decorate a basketball court for use by *Positive Futures*.

The caretakers on the estate have all taken part in drug awareness training, and are committed to making the project a success.

At the end of this pilot project it is hoped that the young people will continue to work alongside the caretakers to improve other areas of the estate.

And we will be looking to roll out similar projects on other estates managed by Lewisham Homes.

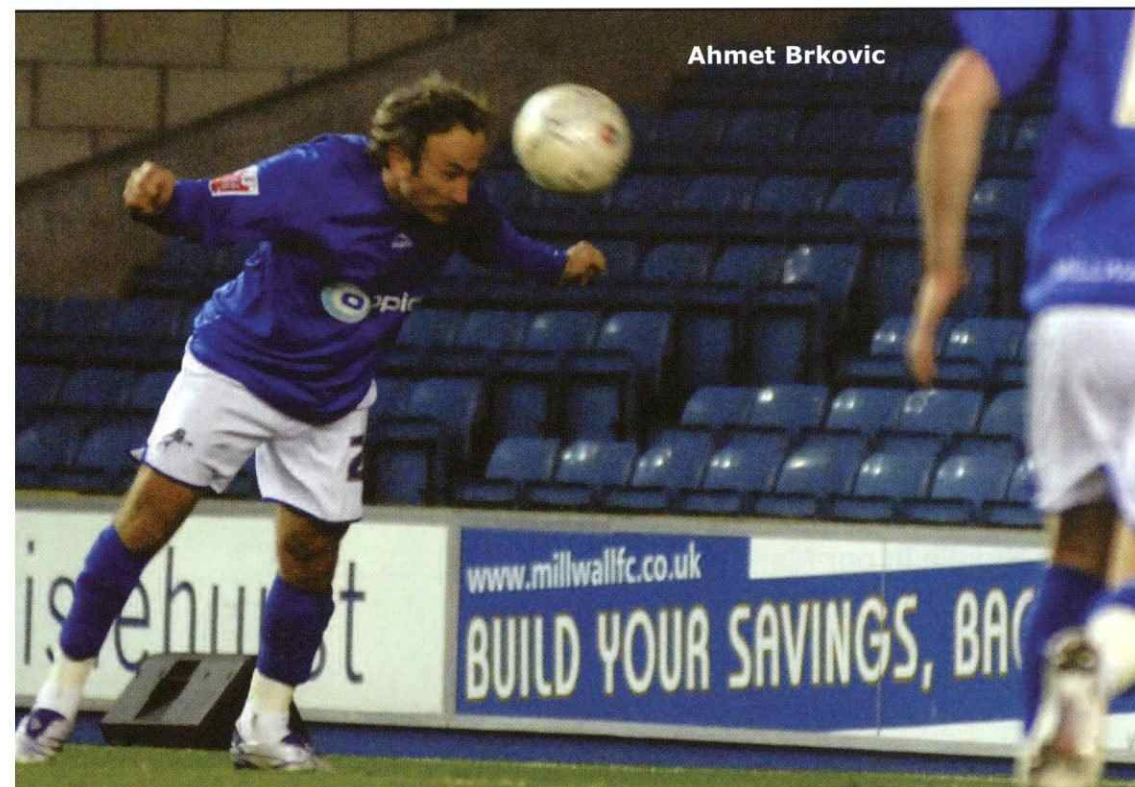
# Justin time to seal win

# Round the Horne

Who says that all goalkeepers are, how shall we put it, a bit bonkers?  
None other than our very own former shot-stopper Brian Horne...

As an ex-goalkeeper myself and a current goalkeeping coach at Chelmsford City, I've learned you've got to be a bit mad to be a keeper. All of us have got some kind of screw loose, and you'll find all goalkeepers get the most stick or give out the most stick in the changing room, the training ground, on the coach travelling to games or wherever.

The difference now compared to when I played is that goalkeepers have to be a lot fitter because they're involved in the game a lot more.

I used to get a back-pass, pick the ball up and smack it up to Teddy Sheringham and Tony Cascarino, but now you can't pick it up so your touch has to be right.

That means you've got to be thinking ahead like outfield players do to make sure you distribute the ball to the best positioned player that you can reach. So it's a lot different now.

I don't think I would have too much of a problem with the backpass rule, if it had existed during my time as a player. I was pretty good with my feet - that was one of my strengths.

Another thing that's changed is keepers punch the ball more these days.

I think that's a bit of a foreign influence coming into the game. But to give modern keepers their due, balls do swerve massively nowadays so consequently they are harder to catch. Talking of modern keepers, I still keep an eye on who's doing well in the Premiership especially when it comes to English keepers.

David James is still in great form, but my sympathy goes out to Scott Carson, who made a bad mistake or two against Portsmouth the other day. He's got a good presence though and if England give him more chances I'm sure he'll come good.

Nonetheless I have to say Steve McClaren's decision to play Carson against Croatia cost him his job. James should have played without a doubt and I believe he would have saved Croatia's first and third goals and England would have made it to the Euro 2008 finals. England needed experience for that game so I would have even understood McClaren playing Paul Robinson instead. I was proud to represent England myself at U21 level, but my proudest moment in football was putting on a Millwall shirt for the first time as a professional.

I'd been wearing one around the house since the age of three anyway because my dad told me I'd better pack my bags and go find a new place to live if I didn't like it. Needless to say, I liked it! So whatever game I was involved in for Millwall, it was an honour to play for the club.

Drawing 1-1 at Anfield in November 1988 is a game that sticks out for me. We went there in good form - we'd only lost one game in the league up until then and that was away at Middlesbrough. I had a half-decent game that day which is another reason it stays in my memory, along with Paul Stephenson getting our goal. Playing in the top flight for Millwall was a real treat for me, so it must have been great for the fans as well. Let's hope we can repeat it in the not too distant future.

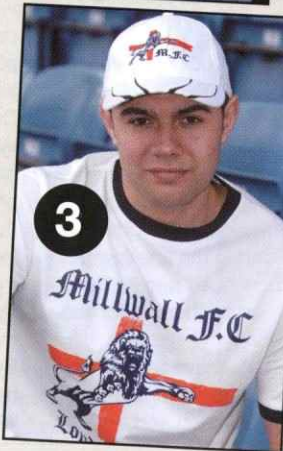
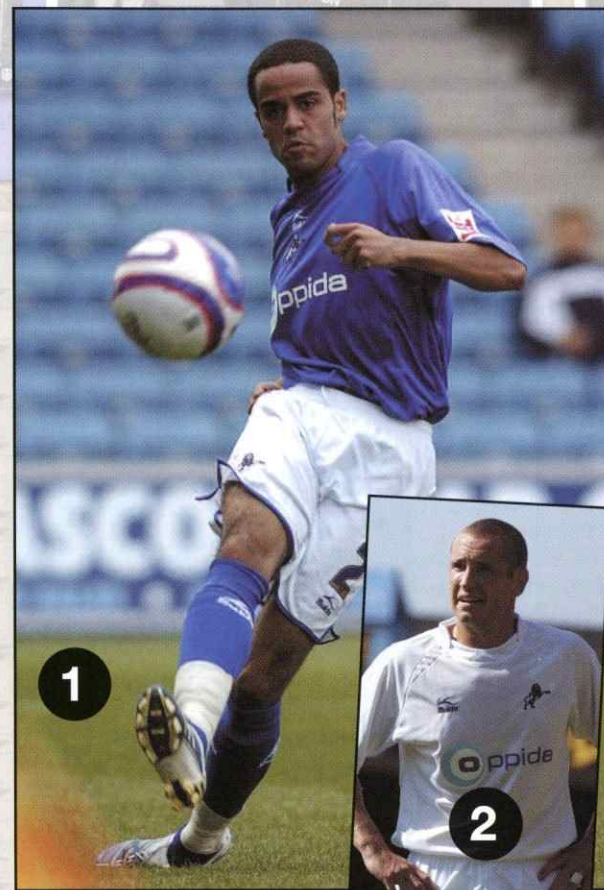

# The A to Z of Millwall with Dave Sullivan

Continuing our look at the players who shaped Millwall's post-war history...

**WALKER Phil:**  
Midfield 1975-1979  
146 games 17 goals

Phil was the first player of Afro-Caribbean origin to make a really significant contribution in a Millwall shirt.

With his box-to-box play, Phil was the excellent link between defence and attack who possessed a powerful shot, which was all too rarely seen.

Phil, along with Trevor Lee became the first acquisitions when they arrived from Epsom & Ewell FC for a combined fee of £4,000 following a successful trial period in the autumn of 1975.

Phil scored the only goal of the game on his debut against Mansfield

Town that October. A consistent and hard-working player, Phil remained free from serious injury during his four seasons at The Den before he was sold to Charlton Athletic in July 1979 in exchange for a fee of £120,000.

Fulham-born Phil began his career as a junior with Crystal Palace before finding his feet in local non-league football with Cobham, Wingate and then Epsom.

And it was with the Surrey club that Phil became noticed after he and Trevor Lee had featured in the first FA Vase final against Hoddesdon Town.

He returned to Gillingham on loan in November 1982 before jetting off to Hong Kong to play for Eastern before making something of a name for himself in Portuguese football, and subsequently appeared for Boavista in the UEFA Cup.

**WARD Darren:**  
Centre-half 2001-2005  
142 games 4 goals

Darren arrived from Watford for £500,000 in October 2001. But after making his debut in the 2-0 victory at West Bromwich Albion eight days later he remained in the shadows of the highly-experienced duo of Sean Dyche and Stuart Nethercott for the rest of the season. Following Dyche's move to Watford in the summer of 2002 Darren stepped into the breach and,

with the help of some commanding performances, held down a regular place in the team for the rest of his time at The Den.

Darren began his career with Watford in February 1997 and played in over 65 games for them after making his first start against their bitter rivals Luton Town. He moved on loan to QPR nearly three years later where he impressed so much that Rangers wanted to make the move permanent. But they couldn't afford Darren so he returned to Vicarage Road. When Gianluca Vialli became



Watford manager he began to rebuild the squad and Darren was one of the casualties, which was to Millwall's good fortune. At The Den he was nicknamed the "Peckham Beckham" due to his mimicking of a certain superstar with a bizarre range of haircuts. The 2004 FA Cup final was the pinnacle of Darren's time at Millwall and the following summer he beat the well-trodden path to Selhurst Park to sign for the Eagles in a £1.1m deal. But after a promising start Darren found himself out of favour and last year he moved to Wolves to link up with former Millwall manager Mick McCarthy. Darren has a younger brother, Elliott, who is currently with Coventry City.

**WARD Richard:**  
Inside-forward 1962-1964  
13 games 3 goals

Richie was still a pupil at Scunthorpe Grammar School when he won the first of his three England amateur caps, against France in April 1959. He later attended Leicester University and also appeared for the FA Colts, as well as making one start for his local club Scunthorpe United. After becoming a teacher, Richard's job - like his football - took him to various parts of the country. And a year after his debut for the Iron Richard moved to Northampton, playing part-time for Town. It was while he was with the Cobblers that Richard made two further England appearances, against Wales and Germany (Terry Venables gained his first cap in the Germany game), to add to the seven league appearances he made while at the County Ground.

Of all the representative honours to come Richard's way, the most prestigious would have to be his appearance for Great Britain in an Olympic qualifying match against Ireland at Dalymount Park, Dublin in March 1960. Unfortunately for Richie he never made the squad that went to Rome later that year. A skilful and adept inside-forward with fine close control, his mop of prematurely greying hair (like all truly handsome men have) made Richie look older than his years.

In 1961 London came calling and Richard joined Tooting & Mitcham United, then a very high-profile club in the amateur game. He signed for Millwall as a professional in July 1962 and his two seasons at The Den were quite eventful. The first contained the "big freeze" of 1963 and the second ended in relegation. After leaving the club in the summer of 1964 Richard turned out for a variety of semi-pro clubs - a situation which helped accommodate his teaching commitments. We know what Richie achieved but whatever became of that chap Venables? Oh yes - he invented the thingummywig (a hat with an attached wig)!

## Blink and you'll miss 'em

(an occasional series celebrating the players who didn't hang around)

**WALLACE Danny:**  
Striker 1992-1993  
3 games

Danny - real name David - is one of three Wallace brothers (Rod and Ray are the others) to escape the scouting nets of the London clubs when they all joined Southampton. They went on to make history when all three appeared in the Saints' first team against Sheffield Wednesday.

A former pupil of West Greenwich School, Danny made one early appearance at Cold Blow Lane when he took centre stage in a schools penalty shoot-out at The Den at Easter 1976.

He spent nine years at The Dell before moving to Manchester United for £1.3m in September 1989. On his day Danny was an exciting winger whose whippet-like pace and fine dribbling skills brought him some spectacular goals.

However, his time at Old Trafford was interrupted by a spate of worrying injuries, and the emergence of some young talent put him in the shade.

Danny won 14 England caps at U21 level to go with the lone full cap he gained versus Egypt, and an FA Cup winner's medal in the 1990 final replay against Crystal Palace.

Danny joined The Lions on loan on 25th March 1993 to regain some fitness and match-practice, but his form was concerning the United management and they decided to off-load him to Birmingham City for £400,000 the following October. Danny's stay at St Andrews was short and, despite a bright start, he was off to Wycombe Wanderers.

In 1996 Danny discovered he was suffering from multiple sclerosis. A decade later he completed the London Marathon in five-and-a-half days to raise money for the Danny Wallace Foundation, which provides aid to fellow MS sufferers.

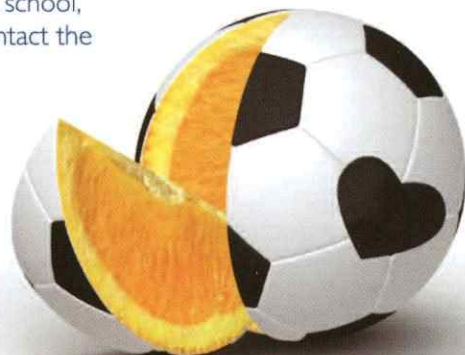
