Doncaster set up a date with destiny

MATT MILLS and Mark McCammon came up with the goals that left Doncaster just one win

away from automatic promotion.

Victory at Cheltenham next Saturday will mean the South Yorkshire side reach the League's second-highest division for the first time in 50 years. But they needed to crack the stubborn resistance of Luton goalkeeper Dean

Brill to earn victory yesterday.

Doncaster manager Sean O'Driscoll said:
'Keepers seem to have fantastic games against us this season. But the important thing is to

keep creating chances.

'We're not worried about any team. If we play like we can then we will move forward.

Luton, already relegated, went into the game on the back of four straight defeats, but Brill began with two fine saves in a minute from successive Brian Stock corners, saving a close-range shot and header from Mills.

Brill's heroics continued with a stunning one-handed save from Gareth Taylor's volley. But the one-man blockade was breached after

34 minutes when Mills scored his first goal for

seven months.

A Stock corner skimmed off McCammon's head, Brill did well to beat it away but Mills sidefooted the ball home from four yards.

McCammon made sure of the points with a header from Gareth Roberts's late free-kick.

Luton boss Mick Harford said: 'Brill was fantastic. He has the size and presence and is destined to be a top goalkeeper.

'In the first half Doncaster were very good and, if they play like that, I'm sure they will get into the Championship.'
