With their pride dented by last Saturday's result Macclesfield came out with a point to prove and made Luton virtual bystanders by dominating the

They went ahead in style on 12 minutes through Yeo's cheeky piece of opportunism.

From a long ball the veteran forward was allowed to control the pass on the edge of the box and spied Dean Brill off his line. With a deft touch Yeo lofted the ball over the stranded keeper and celebrated in front of for-mer Macclesfield manager Paul Ince who had taken his seat in the directors' box just minutes

Yeo's eye for goal was evident again five minutes later when he tested Brill's instincts with a fierce near post drive.

Luton looked rudderless without their inspirational skipper and only a defensive slip-up gave them a chance at Macclesfield's goal on the halfhour mark.

Defender Matthew Flynn's clearance smacked into Rossi Jarvis and the ball fell straight into the path of Lewis Emanuel who spurned the opportunity by blazing over the bar.

Mick Harford chose to shuffle his pack at half-time and Sol Davis made way for teenage

LUTON TOWN boss Mick Harford refused to blame the display at Macclesfield on missing Kevin Nicholls insisting his side are not a one-man team.

"I'm disappointed with the result and the performance," he said. "We weren't at the races

"Kevin wasn't the reason for our defeat. He pulled up with a hamstring injury yesterday morning but I'd like to think he'll be back next weekend.
