"I knew which corner I would put it in because I've been practicing." And the 18-year-old is delighted to

be back in contention for a first team

He said: "Obviously it's good to be back with the lads.

"I played against Stevenage (in a friendly last week) and got 45 minutes under my belt and 45 today and I'm getting fitter and stronger and hopefully I can progress from here.

"At 1-0 down I just tried to come on and make a bit of an impact, but it wasn't the best of performances today.

"Hopefully I can make a difference next week.

"I used to play on the wing when I was in the youth team here a couple of seasons ago so I was trying to get used to playing out there and the gaffer wanted me to make an impact on either side.
