WHOLEHEARTED Michael Spillane admitted he was a relieved man after netting Luton a late leveller at Valley Parade, writes

Spillane got to the loose ball first, but could only slice the ball into the air and substitute Barry Conlon was on hand to slide the ball home.

Conlon then almost sealed victory when he thumped another effort straight at Logan with nine minutes

But out of the blue, Luton levelled with four minutes left. Ed Asafu-Adjaye put in a pinpoint cross from the right and Spillane was on hand to power home his free header from six

yards out.

And Town almost grabbed victory in the last minute when substitute Ryan Charles' low free-kick was fumbled by Evans, but Spillane was unable to force the ball home.
