"We gave away a second sloppy goal and it killed the momentum which was the end of us.


It was a case of square pegs in round holes for manager Mick Har-ford and his injury-ravaged squad as he was forced to pair Jarvis in central midfield with defender Michael

David broke free again on 32 minutes, but he curled his effort just wide, while Paul McVeigh had Luton's best effort of the day a minute later, but the Ulsterman's 30-yard drive was well turned over the bar by Glyn Garner as the Shrews stopper made his only save of the day.

And the Hatters almost levelled two minutes before the break when Martin and Craddock combined to set up Jarvis on the edge of the area following a Keane long throw, but Jarvis' scorching strike seared wide of the target.

The Salops ruled the second half Logan denied Davies just two min-utes in, while he produced another decent stop on 58 minutes to repel Michael Jackson's far post header
