



It was incredibly frustrating for us all that the referee stopped the game so soon after insisting it should start, but with hindsight I think we can all agree that calling off the game was the best decision in the interests of player safety.

We continue to work hard behind the scenes to bring stability to the club, and as every day passes we solve more problems.

Whilst we thought we had exorcised all the ghosts of the previous regime, there are still some that rear their heads. We will deal with these in the same way as all the previous issues and hurdles we have overcome – with honesty, integrity and fairness.

It is of course regrettable that the effort and workload that these issues demand actually detract the management team from pushing forward with plans that help our club develop.

The board of LTFC2020 would like to thank the supporters' groups for the efforts they have made on behalf of fans in order to get the footballing authorities to explain their infamous decisions of July 2008 regarding sanctions and points deductions.

Reading their minutes of the meetings, it is interesting to note that not one person (at the FA or Football League headquarters) can properly explain why Luton Town was given the sanctions it was, not one person can explain the severity of the sanctions versus the leniency given to the perpetrators, not one person can explain the differences in sanctions between large and small clubs, and not one person accepts any responsibility for the penalties given.

Both the FA and the Football League, who essentially control the game in England, seem happy to point fingers and place responsibility with other people, whilst at the same time they seem to accept that they do not need to understand the reasons

It is hard to fathom how this protects the integrity of the game, or improves the performance and professionalism of these bodies in the eyes of supporters up and down the country.

Well done to TiL, LLSC and LTSC for exposing these facts as it again shows why all fans should join, at least one, if not all, of the supporters' groups.

On to brighter matters, we would like to wish Geoff Lovell a very happy retirement. Geoff has been responsible for health & safety at Kenilworth Road for many years and he has given LTFC2020 great support by working beyond retirement age due to the turmoil at the club since November 2007.

We fully appreciate the help

Your support last Saturday at Shrewsbury was brilliant.


I thought the lads played well and we were all disappointed with the result, but we picked ourselves up and played brilliantly in our midweek fixture against Walsall.

Current members of the Blue Square Premier, Altrincham Football Club has a proud history, which includes knocking more League sides out of the FA Cup than any other current non-league side.


They have also been founder members of the Cheshire County, Northern Premier and the Alliance/Conference leagues as well as Conference (Nationwide) North.

Altrincham currently compete at national level, whilst remaining a part-time club with one of the lowest budgets in the new Blue Square Premier division.

The club prides itself on its financial prudence, with the current board having steered Altrincham FC from near financial ruin five years ago through hard work and keeping to strict budgets.

Historic debts have been paid off and though this has meant that the club operates on a much lower budget than its competitors.

Now that the debts are repaid they enter the 2008-09 season with a stronger squad of players and hopefully the chance to compete in this prestigious league.



The Manager: Graham Heathcote

Graham started out as a 16 year-old with the Altrincham youth team and went on to a career which has seen him fill the role of player, club captain, coach, assistant manager, secretary and now manager.

As a player his total of appearances and goals ranks him high in either category of all time Altrincham players and during his playing career he won just about every trophy available to him.

Altogether he played 14 seasons for Altrincham, except for a short spell at Northwich when Les Rigby was manager.

After a final playing season at Witton Albion (when he was released by John King) he quit playing at the age of 31 and moved seamlessly into management as number 2 to John King, initially at Runcorn and then back to Moss Lane.

Graham then moved with John to Barrow and eventually took on his first manager's job at Barrow when King left to join Bury.

This was followed by a short spell as manager at Winsford before teaming up again with John King back at Moss Lane.


After John King's resignation in March 1998 Graham remained as secretary before being asked to assist with coaching the side that won the UniBond Premier League in 1998/99.

In 2002 he was made a Freeman of the Borough of Altrincham for his services to the town and in late 2002 he was appointed Manager.

He has overseen the stabilising of the club over the last 5 seasons and gained promotion for the club from the Unibond Premier and Nationwide North into the present National Conference (now known as the Blue Square Premier League).

Moss Lane is a multi-use stadium in Altrincham, England.

It is currently used mostly for football matches and is the home ground of Altrincham F.C. and was the home ground of Manchester United F.C. reserves until 2005.

The stadium comprises 2 seated stands on one side and three sides of terrace, giving a total capacity of 6,085 people.

A rugby league team known as 'Trafford Borough' moved to Moss Lane for the 1989-90 seas<u>on</u>.


Trafford Borough survived three seasons before relocating to Blackpool as 'Blackpool Gladiators' for the 1992-93 season.





Mike Broadbent, who is now retired, was a journalist for more than forty years on newspapers in Manchester and Fleet Street, followed by thirty years with BBC TV News.

Long before I embarked on my 42-year (so far) love affair with Luton Town, as a school boy I was turning up at Moss Lane, and many away games, to follow Altrincham in the Cheshire League.

In the late forties, after the austerity of the war, there was an explosion of interest in entertainment – music halls, dance halls and, above all, football.

There were massive crowds; I remember cycling to Maine Road and paying sixpence to park my bike in someone's back yard before joining other small boys being handed over the heads of the 80,000 crowd to the front of the terrace to watch Manchester City beat Yeovil 8-0.

But my first love were the Robins. My favourite players were Cyril Barclay, who I once saw score with a volley direct from a corner, goalie with a little Hitler moustache who delighted on waiting until the referee's back was turned before drop kicking what should have been a goal kick, but over all lightning right winger Micky Warburton, with his shiny black hair plastered with brilliantine.

On one occasion we got very excited when we heard that Alty had signed Ronnie Matthews, brother of the great Stanley.

He was an inside forward and played just three games; kept going by occasional sips from a hip flask on the touch-line before moving on for another pay packet



elsewhere.

Two-coach steam trains took us to outposts at Winsford, Northwich, and some League grounds because many of the reserve teams Third Division (North) clubs played in the Cheshire League.

That all ended when I left school at sixteen to take a job which involved working most Saturday afternoons and a later move to London.

But I happened to be working in Birmingham when, in 1966 Altrincham were drawn away at Wolves in the third round of the FA Cup, the start of a twenty-year competition with Yeovil to be the most successful non-League club in the country.

They lost 5-0, but at least, after the game, I got to meet my hero Micky Warburton; no longer the muddy footballer, but a businessman in his camel-hair coat — still with his brilliantined hair.

Despite all their success, though, election to the League eluded them – in one year, losing by one vote to Barrow.


I remember the then Luton Town chairman Denis Mortimer telling me that he blamed himself; he'd intended to vote for Altrincham, but on the day of the League annual meeting he was late back from lunch and missed the vote. The Robins never came so close again.


After that my visits to see Altrincham were occasional – draws against Everton and Spurs, two FA Trophy victories at Wembley and the Robins' greatest FA Cup achievement on a bitterly cold night at Birmingham when they became only the second non-league club to beat a First Division club on their own ground – we watched, holding our breaths, as the winning goal, from a misplaced back-pass, trickled past the oncoming City goalkeeper, one David Seaman.


Since then, there have been rougher times, but the Altrincham result is still the first I look for, sharing their ups and downs.

I'm looking forward to today's game, although I regret they won't be wearing the red and white quarters of my youth.

I wish them another great Cup run – next season.






"I know that if I am keeping Sol and Lewis out once they are fit then the gaffer must have a lot of respect for me if I am getting the nod in front of them because they have a lot of experience.

"It would give me a massive boost in

confidence but right now all I can do is keep on doing the right things."

Howells' has started six games so far for the Hatters and it has been something of a baptism of fire, with Luton still sitting adrift at the bottom of the table but for the youngster he knows it could be the ideal opportunity:

"We have had quite a few injuries, some players have gone out on loan and we have sold a few players so it's a good opportunity for the young players like me and Jordan Patrick, who have come in, to get into the team and to get a run going.

"I got a brief chance last year and it showed me how to play at League level, so I took that experience and just carried on doing what I was doing and hopefully I have progressed from there.



"I just want to show how good I can be and how good I am at the moment."










In front of the Sky TV cameras the Town seemed to have eased themselves into a comfortable 3-1 lead but a late goal from Wood's Mark Xavier made it an uncomfortable last few

minutes as the Hatters clung on by their fingernails.

The following season high flying Conference side Kingstonian came to Kenilworth Road and, aided game safe.

The Sky cameras were again looking for an upset when Conference leaders Rushden came to Kenilworth Road in the first round of 2000/01.

The Town were fighting a losing battle against relegation and were put under the cosh from first minute to last by their far superior visitors.

Guiseley goalkeeper Chris Hill made a string of impressive saves but could not prevent Tony Thorpe and Ahmet Brkovic, with two, making it a comfortable 4-o victory.

Our last clash with a non-League side came in 2003/04. Mike Newell's first season in charge of the Hatters, when we were drawn to play Ryman League Premier Division side Thurrock away in a first round tie.

Sky would not give up and were desperate for a televised giant killing involving the Town.

The game was switched to a Friday evening and extra floodlighting was arranged by the television company as Thurrock's were not regarded as powerful enough for a

colour broadcast.

It was a good job they did as their normal floodlights failed for a period in the second half!

A fair number of Luton supporters travelled to Ship Lane, which nestled under the lights of the QE2 Bridge and the Lakeside Shopping Centre, only to be treated to one of the worst ever Luton Town FA Cup performances in a contest which must have proved a huge turn-off to the watching Sky viewers.

All seemed set fair when Emmerson Boyce bundled home a Spring cross after six minutes but after that the Town did not seem able to string two passes together and Thurrock, sensing that they had a chance, launched wave after wave of attacks on the Luton goal.

Only a series of brave saves from Hatters goalkeeper Marlon Beresford kept Thurrock out but it came as no surprise when Terry Bowes netted with ten minutes to go to level the scores.

Even then, former Hatter Tresor Kandol missed a gilt edged opportunity in the closing minutes which would have given the home side a deserved win.

The Hatters were grateful for a replay but still made hard work in eventually overcoming their supposedly lowly opponents.

Adrian Forbes opened the scoring seven minutes before the break after a mix up in the Thurrock defence left him with a chance which he almost missed.

Another ex-Town trainee, Cliff Akurang, levelled for the visitors just after the interval following Leon Barnett's miskick and with the time ticking away, and extra-time looming, Forbes headed his second from a Steve Robinson cross.

There was still time for Forbes to notch his hat-trick when he converted a late penalty after Brkovic had been tripped in the area - a satisfactory end to a pair of unsatisfactory performances!



What's the Ground Like?

The ground has benefited greatly with the construction of three new stands over the last ten years and is quite picturesque, with a number of trees being visible behind the stands. The latest addition is the smart looking Westrose Leisure Stand at one side of the pitch, which was opened during the 2000/01 season. On the other side is another single tier, the all seated Horners Main Stand. This has a number of supporting pillars and some executive boxes at the back. At one end the W.M.G (Pearl Street) Stand is the third of the new stands. This is also all seated and serves as a Family Stand. It has a couple of supporting pillars that are right at the front of the stand. The Thwaites Beer (Sandy Lane) end is the only terraced area

remaining. This small terrace has in recent seasons had a roof erected.

What Is It Like For Visiting Supporters?

Away supporters are housed in the Willbutts Lane Stand, where the view of the action and the facilities are pretty good. Up to 3,650 supporters can be accommodated in it and normally away fans are confined to the centre of the stand. The acoustics are excellent, so away fans can really make some noise from within it.

Where To Eat & Drink?

At the ground there are two bars to choose from, Studds & the Ratcliffe Arms. Studds is located underneath the Pearl Street Stand and the Ratcliffe Arms is located at the car park entrance to the ground, on Sandy Lane. This pub has SKY TV. Otherwise alcohol is available inside the ground. although it is cans poured into plastic glasses.

How To Get There By Car?

loin the M1 motorway (signposted The North). Continue forward and then branch left and join the M6 motorway (signposted M6, The North West, Coventry (North), Birmingham.) Continue forward onto the M42. At Junction 9 continue forward onto the M6 TOLL (signposted The North West, Cannock, Lichfield). Continue forward onto the M6. Branch left, then join the M62 motorway (signposted Leeds, Bolton, Manchester North). Leave the M62 at junction 12, then join the M6o motorway (signposted Ring Road North, Leeds, Bolton). Continue forward onto the M62 (signposted Leeds, Huddersfield, Rochdale). Leave the M62 at junction 20, then at the roundabout take the 1st exit onto the A627(M) (signposted Rochdale). At the traffic signals continue forward onto Sandy Lane.

Car Parking

Car Parking at the ground is now for permit holders only, so it is a case of either street parking or using the matchday parking facility at Oulder Hill School. The school is located on the way up to the ground, on the left hand side, along Sandy Lane.







Dagenham and Redbridge

Kenilworth Road



Dagenham and Redbridge are the next opponents here at Kenilworth Road and arrive with three away league wins already under their belts.

John Still's side have had an impressive start to the campaign, only their second in the Football League.

After only narrowly avoiding relegation last season, their first at this level following promotion from the Conference in June 2007, the Daggers have already almost amassed half of the number of points they got last season and there is still 31 games to go.

They currently sit 8th in the table, just four points behind table toppers Darlington and are one of the division's top scorers with 28 goals to their name.

Ben Strevens and Paul Benson have both scored seven in the league, while midfielder Sam Saunders has six, all three costing the club nothing.

Benson came through the ranks while Strevens and Saunders were both signed on free transfers from non league.

Dagenham have enjoyed a meteoric rise to fame after only being formed 16 years ago following Leytonstone, llford and Walthamstow Avenue all merging to form Redbridge Forest, who in turn merged with Dagenham FC in 1992 to become the club that is known today.

John Still was the first manager of the club, but their impressive start to life saw Peterborough making an approach for the former Leyton Orient player. His departure affected the Daggers badly and they finished bottom of the Vauxhall conference and were relegated to the Isthmian league.

He returned as Manager in April 2004, following spells at Barnet, Lincoln and Bristol Rovers, and after just three years in charge, which involved a lot of rebuilding at the club he oversaw the Dagger's promotion to the Football League.

So far this season they have managed seven wins and three draws, the most

impressive victory their 6-o drubbing of Chester City on the opening day of the season.

Since then they have beaten Lincoln, Morecambe, Chesterfield, Rochdale, Barnet and Grimsby, while the draws have come against Port Vale, Rotherham and Accrington Stanley.

The game will be the first league meeting between the two sides but the third overall. Last season the two clubs met in the First Round of the Carling Cup, with the Hatters running out 2-1 winners thanks to goals from Spring and Talbot.

The only other meeting came in the Football League Trophy back in 2001, when the Daggers secured a shock win, beating Luton 3-2 in the competition's second round.
